Nā Leo `O Hawai`i Community Access Television serves Big Island communities and has been reaching homes with unique programming for nearly 20 years now.



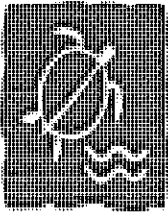

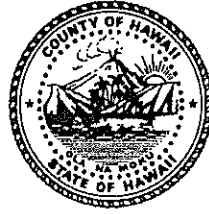

‘Ōlelo Community Television dba ‘Ōlelo Community Media (‘Ōlelo) is in full support of Nā Leo ‘O Hawai‘i’s (Nā Leo) application to continue as the PEG provider for Hawai‘i Island. ‘Ōlelo is a 501(c)(3) organization that has served as O‘ahu’s PEG television operator since 1989.

I am personally acquainted with Nā Leo’s current executive director, Mr. Baron Sekiya and its Kona Facilities Manager, Ms. Donna Dunham. The leaders of the four PEG access provider serving the State of Hawai‘i meet either in person or via telephone conference calls on a monthly basis to discuss issues that we have in common. It is during those meetings, as well as at the national conferences, that I have come to understand the strengths that Mr. Sekiya and Ms. Dunham bring to their respective positions. They are very committed to Nā Leo’s vision, and have developed strategies to overcome the significant challenge of running a community access station on the Big Island.
