

The 2017 Reinstatement period is now open.



Forgot to renew your license? Good news! If you are a MLO, MLOC, or MLOC Branch and failed to renew your license by December 31, 2016, you still have time! You may request for renewal during the reinstatement period which runs from January 1 through February 28, 2017. There is no reinstatement period for a Mortgage Servicer with a terminated license. The Mortgage Servicer will need to submit a new application and receive approval to conduct mortgage loan servicing activities related to Hawaii residential mortgage loans.



In addition to the renewal fees, there is a reinstatement fee of \$100 plus a late fee of \$25 per calendar day from January 1 to the date of the renewal filing. For example: If you submitted your renewal request during the reinstatement period on January 15, 2017, you will be required to pay the renewal fee and the \$100 reinstatement fee through NMLS. The late fee would be \$375 (which is \$25 x 15 days). DFI will create an invoice in NMLS for the late fee. Payment may be made through NMLS. If preferred, payment may be done by sending a check or money order to DFI.



Don't let this happen! If you don't renew your license by February 28, 2017, your license status will change to "Terminated-Expired". You will need to submit a new application if you wish to conduct mortgage loan origination activities related to Hawaii residential loans.
