	<u>NP's Providing Medical Abortions</u> The Board reviewed an email asking if Women's Health and Family Nurse Practitioners are allowed to provide medical abortions to patients without a physician being involved to review imaging or sign off on the chart.
	After careful consideration, it was the Board's informal interpretation that the current nurse practice act does not specifically prohibit an APRN from providing medical abortions and that the nurse practice allows an APRN that has prescriptive authority to prescribe prescription drugs within the APRN's scope of practice and practice specialty, provided the APRN has received the appropriate education and training. This determination does not apply to "surgical" abortions.

2014 Legislature – Status Report

<u>Continuing Competency/Continuing Education Bill</u> The EO provided a brief history of the bill thus far.

October 2, 2014 -	BON reviewed/discussed draft of continuing competency bill with Wendy Suetsugu, Executive Director for the Hawaii State Center for Nursing (HSCFN). As a result of this discussion, a new draft was provided to the Board and reviewed/discussed at their November meeting.
November 6, 2014 –	BON reviewed/discussed and made recommendations to the continuing competency bill.
December 4, 2014 -	BON reviewed/discussed another draft of the continuing competency bill that included recommendations previously discussed. After a lengthy discussion, it was the consensus of the Board to have the EO draft a bill that requires nurses to complete continuing education courses in order to renew their license. The Board emphasized among other reasons, keeping the process as simple as possible. This is the draft that was included in your packet with the briefing sheet and emailed to the HSCFN. Soon after receiving, the HSCFN called for a meeting with the Licensing Administrator and Director's Office.
January 2, 2015 -	The Chair, Vice Chair, EO, Licensing Administrator, Deputy Director and Laura Reichhardt met to discuss the continuing competency bill. The HSCFN prepared a comparison sheet and Draft 11 or Reconciliation Bill (reverting it back to continuing competency). At the meeting Ms. Reichhardt also distributed the "Continuing Competency Bill Talking Points". The DCCA expressed their concerns regarding the cost and time it would take for a nurse to complete one of the learning activity options.

There were some recommendations discussed at the meeting that have been incorporated into the HSCFN's latest Draft 11 which is the current draft to be considered.

The HSCFN also sent the recertification requirements for ANCC, to substantiate some of the learning activity options and a copy of the 2013 Workforce study that indicates Nurses Primary Employment Settings.

Hawaii State Center for Nursing: Ms. Reichhardt passed out a new draft (13) of the continuing competency bill for the Board's consideration. She stated the difference between draft 11 and draft 13 is that the professional development components have been added back under the learning activities for reasons based on community feedback, the HSCFN feels this is a mechanism that can support nurses while they are working to achieve the continued competency in their workforce. A lot of feedback from the nursing unions is that they are doing professional development in the workplace anyway, and this is a way they can achieve continued competency without a significant impact on cost or time, which was the concern of both DCCA and the community members.

Amy Thomas from Hawaii Pacific Health (HPH) stated she is here today to provide HPH's position in support this bill. As the bill is drafted, she finds it very well rounded with a lot of options for nurses. Speaking on behalf of a large employer of nurses in Hawaii, many of the professional development options are something that they already have in place. One of them is the new graduate residency program option. HPH runs new residency graduate programs a couple of times a year, as do several other organizations in Hawaii. As far as some of the other options like writing an article or doing an evidence based project, those are also some things they have in place for their nurses that are doing clinical ladders. As employers we support national certification and some hospitals even have certification bonuses. We offer continuing education classes as well.

Ms. Thomas also stated that with the Academic Progression in Nursing movement and their support of promoting nurses toward BSN preparation, a lot of the professional development components in the bill exist in the RN to BSN programs.

The Chair stated it appears a lot of the discussion they had on January 2, 2015 has gone to the wayside.

Ms. Reichhardt stated when submitting the bill to the Legislature, you really want to make sure you can provide the best opportunity for the nurses, and they feel the professional development opportunities do that.

The Chair stated her concern as an example, you can say its 500 hours of preceptoring, but the quality of the preceptorship can be very different depending on where it's done. So if you have no standards for that, using that as an indicator that someone has met competence is not valid. She stated that the Board is not opposed to these components, but to merely list them without defining the standards or criteria, does not appear to substantiate competency.

Dean Boland, stated that the core group of the Continuing Education Joint Advisory Committee (CEJAC) worked on this for 3 years. The concern was the evidence base for continuing education is so weak that when NCSBN came and spoke to the CEJAC they recommended to not use a continuing education model. They recognize the Board's responsibility and ability to write regulation once legislation is passed. The CEJAC and the HSCFN would like to see the activities in the bill, recognizing that the Board will set regulation to define whatever you see as appropriate.

The Chair stated she agrees that continuing education is not the "end all" and that the Board's position is continuing education was the more manageable requirement for the Board to implement having a very limited staff.

Dean Boland stated the EO was in many of the meetings regarding this, and the Committee was very sensitive to the workload impact on the Board because of the staffing constraints. However as you look to monitor, the burden in this bill is really on the nurse to maintain documentation.

The EO asked on page 6, number (9) Completion of a board-recognized nurse residency program, what does that mean?

Dean Boland stated that would be whatever you want it to be. As the Chair stated, you really want to be able to identify the quality.

Ms. Reichhardt stated since you mentioned that, the one change that did not make it into draft 13, is that to be consistent with Chapter 457, we're going to change the terminology to board-recognized instead of board-approved.

The EO stated on page 5 of draft 11, based on the January 2, 2015 discussion, we included another category "board-approved professional development activities". So anything that was not listed that the nurse may have done, the board could consider it.

Dean Boland asked if it should state "board-approved" or "board-recognized".

The Chair asked the DAG if there is a difference.

The DAG stated no.

Ms. Reichhardt stated she will add that line item in regarding "board-approved professional development activities".

The DAG stated you are under the concept of continued competency, and you want to achieve that through learning activities. In draft 13, you say learning activities on page 2, and Ms. Reichhardt stated professional development but professional development is not a term used in this draft.

Ms. Reichhardt stated when we're talking about professional development; we're talking about items 5 through 9 of the learning activities.

The DAG asked, you go from competency to learning activities, and then learning activities say professional development and CE's?

Dean Boland stated in her mind, you are talking about professional development as the umbrella and then within that there is the continued competency with continuing education units as well as learning activities and anything new the board may approve.

The DAG stated then this is backwards. This bill is entitled continued competence, but you are saying the umbrella is professional development, and that professional development is only learning activities 5 through 9.

Dean Boland stated then we are not being clear. We are not asking to put professional development in the bill, so we will put professional development in the parking lot and focus on continued competency and achieving that.

The EO asked, so you are taking out the category "board-approved professional development activities"?

The DAG stated going back, to re-state, the umbrella is competency and to achieve that you are doing learning activities, and of learning activities numbers 5 through 9 are professional development but we're not going to say that, and of the learning activities, besides professional development you are also going to have a miscellaneous category.

Dean Boland stated that what we're saying in the text is CE and learning activities, we are not going to use professional development.

The Chair stated another matter that was discussed at the January 2, 2015 meeting, is that some state employers attest to the competence of the staff that are working for them as one indication of a person's ability or competence.

Dean Boland stated there was a lot of discussion about that and one of the first models was in fact with the burden on the employers to attest and the employers at that point were not inclined to do that because it increased cost and time for them.

Ms. Kodama stated that would be the best competency statement.

Dean Boland stated the original focus was for the onus to be on the individual nurse and take responsibility for their practice.

The EO stated the Board will review the new draft 13 provided to them today, and any new recommendations, support or opposition will be provided to Ms. Reichhardt hopefully today.

Dean Boland stated on a different note, Wendy Suetsugu will not be returning to HSCFN.

The DAG stated on page 6, line 19, is there still the self-assessment component?

Dean Boland stated it means continuing self-assessment, but not requiring anything formal from that.

Ms. Reichhardt stated would you recommend adding the following language starting from line 18, "<u>maintaining and documenting competence through ongoing</u> <u>development and implementation of a personal learning plan and subsequent</u> <u>reassessment</u>".

The DAG stated that would be appropriate.

Dean Boland thanked the Board for their time and left.

The Chair stated if we delineate that all the activities must be board-recognized, we then have the opportunity through audits to pull someone's file and look at what their activities were.

The DAG stated without details and standards, you are going to have to go through a round of rule-making. During an audit, before you can pull a record and say this is not satisfactory, you would have to have some standards enforced.

The EO stated that was already discussed that the learning activities would have to be clarified. If the bill goes through as is, you have to get the word out to 20,000 plus nurses and promulgate rules by the 2017 renewal.

The Chair stated we can look to some of the other states and get their criteria.

The DAG asked if the Board still thinks it is biased or targeted to academia nurses vs. clinical frontline nurses.

Ms. Kodama says she does.

The Chair stated what about nurses who are not working, how would they maintain their competence?

The Vice Chair stated continuing education is a place to start. If you have to do at least 30 hours of CE's, it will at least open their eyes to things they may have not known and maybe push them into some competency.

The Chair stated when we can start developing criteria for those that do the alternative professional development options; we can audit and see how they look.

The EO asked how would you know which learning activity a licensee did?

The Chair stated they would have to tell us what they did.

The EO stated we don't have it listed on the renewal where they can check off what they did, it's just an attestation saying that they completed the continuing competency requirements.

The Chair stated it could say "...completed the continuing competency requirements evidenced by learning activities or learning activities and CE's, or CE's.

The EO stated she has to see if that can be put on the renewal application and then extracted for a list to be created.

The Chair stated you could do an attachment, I think I would want to know if they did CE's or one of the other options.

The EO asked the DAG if we are able to delineate, and then target those who did not do CE's but one of the other learning activity options and if that defensible.

The DAG stated yes.

The EO stated as soon as she receives the final bill she will provide it to the Board right away.
