Call to Order: The Chair called the meeting to order at 8:30 a.m. at which time quorum was established.

Additions to the Agenda/Additional Distribution: None.

Approval of the Minutes: The Chair called for a motion in regards to the minutes of the November 5, 2015 meeting.

There being no discussion, upon a motion by the Vice Chair, seconded by Ms. Daub, it was voted on and unanimously carried to approve the minutes of the November 5, 2015 meeting as circulated.

The Chair called for a motion in regards to the minutes of the May 7, 2015 meeting to amend the minutes to include the specific sections for which the application was denied.

Upon a motion by the Vice Chair, seconded by Ms. Kodama, it was voted on and unanimously carried to amend the minutes of the May 7, 2015 meeting as follows:

Upon a motion by Ms. Kodama, seconded by Ms. Daub, it was voted on and unanimously carried to accept the recommendations of the Education Committee.

Executive Officer's  
Report:

**Conferences/Seminars/Meetings**

Leadership and Public Policy Conference, October 27-29, 2015, West Lake, California – Report on Attendance by Ms. Kodama – Deferred from November 5, 2015 Meeting

Ms. Kodama reported on her attendance at the above mentioned conference. She informed the Board that most of the presentations were about an hour long and are available on the NCSBN web page and pointed out one of the presentations from an Illinois nurse who did a study and raised funds to fight breast cancer.

Psychopharmacology Conference, Outrigger Reef Waikiki Beach Resort, Honolulu, Hawaii, February 3-5, 2016 (pending approval by the AANP)

The EO reported there will be a Psychopharmacology Conference February 3-5, 2016, pending approval by the AANP in case anyone was interested in attending.

2016 NCSBN APRN Roundtable, April 5, 2016, Rosemont, Illinois – Thomas Joslyn

The EO reported she had asked Mr. Joslyn if he would be able to attend the 2016 NCSBN APRN Roundtable but asked if anyone wanted to be an “alternate” in case he cannot attend. The Chair volunteered.

**2015 Legislature – Status Report**

Amend DLIR, DOH and DHS Statutes for APRN Recognition

The EO reported that she emailed the latest draft to Ms. Reichhardt that included the clarifying amendment to enforce the Board’s previous interpretation that APRNs with prescriptive authority may dispense non-controlled substances to patients under their care and the amendment to include APRNs under the definition of “Out-of-state practitioner” under HRS 328-1.

Ms. Reichhardt stated that the amendment to include both an APRN and certified nurse midwife (“CNM”) under HRS 328 appeared to be redundant so they were deleting reference to CNMs.

The Board had no objections.

Repeal Joint Formulary Advisory Committee Bill

The EO reported that she has not received any word on the status of this admin bill.

Amend Board Member Terms to Four Years Bill

The EO reported that she has not received any word on the status of this admin bill.

### NURSYS Bill

The EO reported that she has not received any word on the status of this admin bill.

### **Amendments to Title 16, Chapter 89 – Status Report**

The EO reported that she is preparing a draft for the Board's consideration at their January 2016 meeting.

### **Continuing Competency Program**

#### Clarification Regarding the 2 Semester Credits of Post-Licensure Academic Education Learning Activity Option

The EO stated that she received a phone call asking about the 2 semester credit learning activating option for the continuing competency requirement.

She stated that according to the language in the statute, the semester credit has to be provided by an accredited nursing program and that the course must be relating to nursing.

The Chair stated that "semester credit" is defined under HAR §16-89-2 as, "a minimum of fifteen hours of classroom instruction or a minimum of thirty hours of laboratory or clinical instruction, or equivalent quarter hours which means a minimum of ten hours of classroom instruction or a minimum of twenty hours of laboratory or clinical instruction."

The EO clarified so if a nurse completes a 3 credit course that is related to nursing, this should satisfy this learning activity?

After some discussion, it was the consensus of the Board that in order to satisfy learning activity option (4), the provider of the course must be an accredited nursing program; the course must be at least 2 semester credits and related to nursing or nursing practice.

#### Strategies Youth for Change – CE Provider

The Board reviewed emailed information from Youth for Change as a provider of continuing education courses for nurses. According to the email, Youth for Change is an approved provider by the California Board of Registered Nursing as a continuing education provider for nurses and that although most of their training events are designed towards social workers, they also have a few courses suitable for nurses.

After some discussion, the Board directed the EO to obtain more information on this provider and their continuing education courses for nurses.

Connecticut League of Nursing – RN Refresher Course (Didactic and Clinical)

The Board reviewed an email from a nurse asking if the above mentioned refresher course is still Board approved for both the didactic and clinical hours.

The EO explained that previously, the Board accepted this provider's refresher course to satisfy both the didactic and clinical hours required for a nurse who has not practiced for at least 5 years. The previous Board reviewed the virtual clinical portion and due to the interaction, determined it would meet the clinical hours.

Ms. Daub stated that she was concerned about the online clinical component because it would be difficult to evaluate.

The Chair agreed and stated that "clinical" should be hands on. She stated that nursing programs cannot substitute "simulation" hours for clinical hours and that clinical hours should involve patient care and not virtual models.

After some discussion, it was the consensus of the Board to accept the didactic hours of the Connecticut League of Nursing but not the clinical portion.

**Star Advertiser Articles on the Hawaii Medical Board, Professional and Vocational Licensing Division/Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs, and Regulated Industries Complaints Office**

The Board reviewed a series of articles mentioned above and asked the EO to re-review the Board's laws and rules and procedures to ensure that we are proactive in ensuring that applications are being processed with all the information required, including but not limited to license verifications for any and all states an applicant ever held a nurse license, even if the license is no longer current and that complaints or reports of violations are being reported to the Regulated Industries Complaints Office in a timely manner.

**Breach of Pearson Vue Credential Manager System**

The EO reported that there was a breach in Pearson Vue's Credential Manager System used by adult learners to support professional certifications and licenses but that this system is not used by the NCSBN or its membership. She said she will continue to monitor this issue and inform the Board of any updates.

Hawaii State  
Center for Nursing:

Ms. Reichhardt had several items to report on as follows:

1. The continuing competency sections in HRS 457 have been assigned section numbers;
2. That they are working on an amendment to the physician assistants ("PAs") practice act that would allow nurses to work with PAs since the current

language in the definition of scope of practice of an LPN and scope of practice of an RN is scheduled to be repealed in 2017.

The EO stated that amending the PA practice act may not necessarily give the nurse the ability to carry out the orders of a PA. By amending the PA practice act, a PA may be able to delegate to a nurse, however, if the nurse practice act specifically addresses who a nurse can accept delegation from and it does not include a PA, then the nurse may not accept delegation from a PA. Nurses comply with their own practice act, not someone else's.

She asked to see the language and discuss this further.

3. That per her conversation with Senator Baker, she has drafted a bill, which was disseminated to the Board members, taking language from the NCSBN model act/rule to require criminal background checks (CBC") for nurse applicants and renewals.

The EO expressed her concerns with the current CBC process for security guards that PVL is currently following where an applicant pays for their own CBC by getting fingerprinted. PVL then has a window of time to download or print the CBC before it expires. If PVL is unable to download the CBC before it expires, the applicant will have to go back and pay for another CBC and get fingerprinted and nurse applications out number any other professional license. So for various reasons like no application is received or received late or if we get behind in our processing, the applicant will have to go pay for another CBC which she was told cost somewhere like \$80.

The Chair expressed concerns that the bill only refers to "fingerprints" but that there may be other biologic tests that can be done to initiate a CBC. She also asked if there was another process where the applicant can obtain his/her CBC and submit it with their application?

The DAG asked Ms. Reichhardt if she considered putting general language in HRS 436B so that it may apply to other health care professionals and not only nurses.

The EO stated that she would not advise her to do that until she has discussed with PVL and DCCA admin because placing it in HRS 436B will impact all the professions under PVL.

The Chair asked Ms. Reichhardt to give a brief report on the IOM webinar.

Ms. Reichhardt said basically they said to keep doing what we're doing.

Correspondence:            **LPN Scope of Practice Inquiry**

The Board reviewed and discussed an email inquiry regarding the LPN scope of practice. After some discussion, it was the consensus of the Board to respond to the questions as follows:

Can a LPN:

-Call, fax, e-prescribe and do verbal orders for all types of medications including the controlled?

Response:        ***An LPN may call in or electronically transmit a prescription for non-controlled substances to a pharmacy as designated by the physician or prescribing practitioner as an “authorized agent” of the physician or prescribing practitioner and as supervised by the physician or prescribing practitioner or RN. You may contact the Department of Public Safety, Narcotics Enforcement Division at (808) 837-8470 for their response if an LPN may perform the same duties for a controlled substance prescription.***

-Call and initiate a Prior Authorization for a medication to the client’s insurance company? This is needed for a client when their insurance company declines to pay for their medicine unless the MD validates the need for this specific medication.

Response:        ***The Board determined that a nurse license is not required to perform this activity.***

-Ordering labs for a patient via requisition form, such as CBC, Lipid Panel, Lithium levels, etc?

Response:        ***The Board determined that an LPN may conduct this activity as directed by the physician or prescribing practitioner.***

-Receive sample medications and dispense to clients after the MD has completed the sample label and signed it?

Response:        ***The Board determined that an LPN may not “dispense” any prescription drugs or manufacturers prepackaged samples of prescription drugs.***

The Board further determined that the nurse is still accountable and responsible to the consumer for the quality of nursing care rendered, including when carrying out the orders of the physician, prescribing practitioner or RN.

### **HRS 671-1, Definition of “Health care provider”**

The Board reviewed an email from an APRN asking about the definition of “health care provider in HRS 671 relating to medical torts and also medical record retention under HRS 622 that refers to the definition of “health care provider” under HRS 671.

After reviewing HRS 671-1, it was the consensus of the Board that this appears to be a reimbursement issue that may affect the APRN practice (if the APRN is not getting paid, they may not treat the patient) but that this may not be an issue the Board would pursue as it does not prevent the APRN from actually practicing.

### **National Transportation Safety Board (“NTSB”) – *Drug Use Trends in Aviation: Assessing the Risk of Pilot Impairment***

The EO stated that in September 2014, the NTSB submitted information on effects of drugs on pilots and that practitioners should warn their patients of how these drugs may affect their ability to perform their job and wanted the Board’s assistance in disseminating the information.

The Chair stated that APRNs are required to discuss the risks and/or benefits of drugs prescribed.

After further discussion, it was the consensus of the Board that pursuant to the American Nurses Association’s Code of Ethics for Nurses, previously recognized by the Board as the code of ethics for nurses, section 1.4 “The right to self-determination” states that a nurse must provide the patient with accurate, complete and understandable information in a manner that facilitates informed judgment, each nurse has an obligation to be knowledgeable about the moral and legal rights of all patients to self-determination, therefore, nurses have an obligation to inform the patient of any risks of drugs they prescribe.

The EO stated that in order to disseminate the information, she will have the NTSB recommendations posted on the nurse web page.

### **Another Barrier for APRN Practice**

The Board reviewed an email from an APRN expressing her concerns with the rejection of her claim for treatment because APRNs are not included in the definition of “health care provider” under HRS Chapter 386.

The Board determined that based on their previous discussion of the APRN barrier bill to be submitted by the Hawaii State Center for Nursing, one of the proposed amendments is to include APRNs under the definition of “health care provider” under HRS Chapter 386 so this should hopefully resolve this issue for the APRNs.



Old Business:                    **Scope of Practice Guidance Document – Status Report**

The EO reported that she hopes to complete some of the guidance documents by the end of the year.

### **Advanced Practice Registered Nurse (APRN)**

#### Ratification List

Upon a motion by the Chair, seconded by Ms. Kodama, it was voted on and unanimously carried to ratify the attached list of APRNs and APRN-Rx.

#### APRN Applicants with prior convictions and/or disciplinary action

Upon a motion by the Vice Chair, seconded by Ms. Kodama, it was voted on and unanimously carried to deny the following applications based on the nature of the prior disciplinary actions. The Board determined that because APRNs are considered primary care providers/independent practitioners in this State, the basis for the disciplinary actions taken were directly related to the qualifications for an APRN license. The Board cited the following sections as a basis for the denial of the APRN license:

**HRS §457-12 Discipline; grounds; proceedings; hearings.** (a) In addition to any other actions authorized by law, the board shall have the power to **deny**, revoke, limit, or suspend any license to practice nursing as a registered nurse or as a licensed practical nurse applied for or issued by the board in accordance with this chapter, and to fine or to otherwise discipline a license for any cause authorized by law, including but not limited to the following:

- (8) Revocation, suspension, limitation, or other disciplinary action by another state of a nursing license for reasons as provided in this section;

**HAR §16-89-125 Discipline; grounds; proceedings.** (a) In addition to any other actions authorized by law, the board shall have the power to deny, revoke, limit, condition, or suspend prescriptive authority granted, in accordance with this chapter, and to fine or to otherwise discipline an APRN with prescriptive authority for any cause authorized by law, including but not limited to the following:

- (3) Violation of any applicable state statutes and rules or federal laws or regulations;
- (5) Unprofessional conduct, including but not limited to:
  - (B) Prescribing or administering drugs in an unsafe manner or not in accordance with acceptable and prevailing standards of practice;

**HRS §436B-19 Grounds for refusal to renew, reinstate or restore and for revocation, suspension, denial, or condition of licenses.** In addition to any other acts or conditions provided by law, the licensing authority may refuse to renew, reinstate or restore or may deny, revoke, suspend, or condition in any manner, any license for any one or more of the following acts or conditions on the part of the licensee or the applicant thereof:

- (7) Professional misconduct, incompetence, gross negligence, or manifest incapacity in the practice of the licensed profession or vocation;

- (8) Failure to maintain a record or history of competency, trustworthiness, fair dealing, and financial integrity;
- (9) Conduct or practice contrary to recognized standards of ethics for the licensed profession or vocation;
- (12) Failure to comply, observe, or adhere to any law in a manner such that the licensing authority deems the applicant or holder to be an unfit or improper person to hold a license;
- (13) Revocation suspension, or other disciplinary action by another state or federal agency against a licensee or applicant for any reason provided by the licensing laws or this section;
