Call to Order: The Chair called the meeting to order at 8:30 a.m. at which time quorum was established.

Approval of the The Chair called for a motion in regards to the minutes of the December 10, 2015  
Minutes: meeting.

There being no discussion, upon a motion by Ms. Kodama, seconded by Ms. Daub, it was voted on and unanimously carried to approve the minutes of the December 10, 2015 meeting as circulated.

Chair's Report:                   **Announcements/Introductions**

The Chair wished everyone a Happy New Year!

Vice Chair's Report:       No Report.

Executive Officer's Report:       **Conferences/Seminars/Meetings**

Psychopharmacology Conference, Outrigger Reef Waikiki Beach Resort, Honolulu, Hawaii, February 3-5, 2016 (pending approval by the AANP)

The EO reported there will be a Psychopharmacology Conference February 3-5, 2016, and when she checked yesterday, they were still waiting for approval by the AANP.

Ms. Kodama stated that the February Board meeting is currently scheduled on February 4 so if any Board member wanted to attend they would miss the 2<sup>nd</sup> day.

The Chair asked the Board members to check their schedules to see if the meeting could be moved to the following Thursday, February 11<sup>th</sup>, provided staff can confirm an available meeting room.

2016 NCSBN Midyear Meeting, March 14-16, 2016, Baltimore, Maryland – The Chair

The EO reported that the NCSBN is able to sponsor 2 representatives to attend the Midyear meeting and that the Chair has volunteered to attend and asked if anyone else was interested and able to attend as she needs to register participants today.

After some discussion, Ms. Kodama volunteered to attend.

2016 NCSBN APRN Roundtable, April 5, 2016, Rosemont, Illinois – Thomas Joslyn

The EO confirmed that Mr. Joslyn would be attending.

**2016 Legislature – Status Report**

Amend DLIR, DOH and DHS Statutes for APRN Recognition

The EO deferred to Ms. Reichhardt.

Ms. Reichhardt reported that she amended the bill slightly to clarify an APRNs ability to initiate psychiatric evaluations or involuntary psych assessment as it was inadvertently omitted previously and the draft was sent to Senator Baker.

She also stated that she did discuss this with Representative McKelvey but was told that it probably won't get a lot of support because it is an election year and they don't want to address any new issues.

The Chair stated that perhaps Ms. Reichhardt can gather support from nursing organizations such as HAPN and the Hawaii Medical Board since psychiatrist are already doing this.

#### Repeal Joint Formulary Advisory Committee Bill

The EO reported that she has not received any official word on the status of this admin bill.

#### Amend Board Member Terms to Four Years Bill

The EO reported that she has not received any official word on the status of this admin bill.

#### NURSYS Bill

The EO reported that she has not received any official word on the status of this admin bill.

#### Naloxone Bill

The EO reported that there is a proposal for a bill that would create immunity for individuals who prescribe, possess, or administer an opioid antagonist such as naloxone hydrochloride during an opioid-related drug overdose. The bill would authorize emergency personnel to administer naloxone and requires Medicaid coverage.

#### Criminal Background Check ("CBC") Bill

The EO deferred to Ms. Reichhardt.

Ms. Reichhardt reported that she submitted a draft of a bill requiring CBCs for nurse licensure to Senator Baker but removed the language pertaining to convictions of a sexual offense after discussing with the EO.

The EO stated that if we start specifying every offense for which a license can be denied, the list will be endless. Furthermore, there is existing language to cover any conviction.

Ms. Reichhardt stated that if the Board joins the compact, the language may have to be added.

The Chair recommended that biological ID should also be included.

### **Amendments to Title 16, Chapter 89 – Status Report**

The Board reviewed a draft of proposed amendments to the rules that would require mandatory reporting of unprofessional conduct, amend and update the list of national certifying bodies, allow the Board to conduct a random audit of APRNs with prescriptive authority renewals for compliance with the continuing education requirement, limit the number of times an individual may fail the NCLEX before mandatory remediation and requiring a self-query of the National Practitioner Data Bank (“NPDB”) for initial and renewal of the nurse license.

The EO explained that the self-query of the NPDB is a requirement in both the Dental and Medical Boards’ admin rules. The cost of a self-query is \$5. She drafted language in the current draft to allow the Board to require a self-query report to try to address the CBC.

The Chair stated that the self-query report doesn’t replace the CBC, the reports are only actions pertaining to the health care professional’s practice.

After some discussion, it was the consensus of the Board to accept the language pertaining to the NPDB self-query report.

### **Continuing Competency Program**

The EO reported that the Vice Chair will be doing a short presentation On January 14, 2016 at the Castle Medical Center on the continuing competency program/requirements with Ms. Reichhardt.

### **Article Regarding NLC**

The Board reviewed an article on “Make Doctor’s Licenses Like Driver’s Licenses? Medical Groups Say No” as it relates to the nurse licensure compact.

### **National Transportation Safety Board – *Drug Use Trends in Aviation: Assessing the Risk of Pilot Impairment* (Was Previously Discussed at December 2015 Meeting) – Additional Information**

The Board reviewed additional information from the Arizona Board of Nursing’s study on the opioid problem, Oregon Board of Nursing’s initiative for APRN’s prescriptive and dispensing authority that includes an information booklet,

Washington's BON, Board of Pharmacy, Medical Commission's Adoption of Joint Rules on Chronic Non-Cancer Pain Management, Colorado's BON Policy for Prescribing and Dispensing Opioids and information from a CDC Report Regarding Opioid Prescribing/Deaths.

The EO reported that the Board of Pharmacy, Hawaii Medical Board and the Board of Dental Examiners will also be reviewing the same information and if all are willing, the EOs for these boards will be developing a general policy statement for the boards to adopt/endorse.

Old Business:

**Scope of Practice Guidance Document**

The EO distributed a "draft" of a decision tree that an LPN can use to determine if the activity falls within the nurse's scope of practice. She asked the Board to review and make recommendations to be discussed at the February meeting.

- That the applicant shall inform any and all current and future employers, director of nursing and immediate supervisor of her conditional license and present to all employers, current and future, with a copy of the Board’s issued conditional letter and to ensure that you employer acknowledges the terms of your conditional license by signing and returning a signed copy of the conditional letter to the Board’s Office within ten (10) days of signing; and
- That the applicant shall provide written notice and documentation within 30 (thirty) days to the Board of any judgment, award, disciplinary

sanctions, order, or other determination, which adjudges or finds that the licensee is civilly, criminally or otherwise liable for any personal injury, property damage or loss caused by the licensee's conduct in the practice of nursing.

Upon a motion by the Vice Chair, seconded by Mr. Joslyn, it was voted on and unanimously carried to deny the following application. The Board determined that based on the information provided, the basis for the Arizona disciplinary action, including failing to take appropriate action(s) or to follow policies and procedures in the practice setting to safeguard the patient and falsifying a physician's order, constitutes unprofessional conduct in accordance with the following Board's laws (Hawaii Revised Statutes) and rules (Hawaii Administrative Rules) and the Code of Ethics as adopted by the Board at their September 5, 2013 meeting:

§457-12 (a):

- (6) Unprofessional conduct as defined by the board in accordance with its own rules;
- (8) Revocation, suspension, limitation, or other disciplinary action by another state of a nursing license for reasons as provided in this section;

§436B-19:

- (8) Failure to maintain a record or history of competency, trustworthiness, fair dealing, and financial integrity;
- (9) Conduct or practice contrary to recognized standards of ethics for the licensed profession or vocation;

§16-89-59 Unprofessional conduct. Nursing behavior which fails to conform to legal standards and accepted standards of the nursing profession and which reflect adversely on the health and welfare of the public shall constitute unprofessional conduct.

§16-89-60:

- (6) Performing unsafe or unacceptable patient care or failing to conform to professional standards required of a nurse which poses a danger to the welfare of a patient which shall include:
  - (A) Intentionally or negligently causing physical or emotional injury to a patient;

- (C) Failing to take appropriate action or to follow policies and procedures in the practice setting designed to safeguard the patient;
- (D) Failing to take appropriate action in safeguarding a patient from incompetent health care practices;
- (7) Engaging in any act inconsistent with the practice of nursing as defined in section 457-2, HRS, for that of a licensed practical nurse or a registered nurse including:
  - (A) Engaging in conduct which evidences a lack of ability or fitness to discharge the duty owed by the licensee to a patient;
  - (C) Willfully, or deliberately, falsifying or altering a patient's, health care facility's, or employee's record;

And Provision 4 of the Code of Ethics for Nurses:

“The nurse is responsible and accountable for individual nursing practice and determines the appropriate delegation of tasks consistent with the nurse’s obligation to provide optimum patient care.”
