2015 Legislative		
Session	a)	SB5 Relating to Professional and Vocational Licensing
		This measure requires classes that are required as a condition of licensure and offered by a trade union to be made available to all licensees at the same cost, regardless of whether a licensee is a member of the trade union, but only if no equivalent public classes are available. No hearing has been scheduled and the bill has been referred to the Senate Committee on Commerce and Consumer Protection.
		Members commented that the plumber's union offers classes to non-union members and each attendee is charged a fee for the class and the electrician's union pays for their members to attend the classes.
		It was moved by Mr. Brady, seconded by Mr. Hiraki and unanimously carried to support SB5 Relating to Professional and Vocational Licensing.
	b)	HB109 Relating to Taxation
		This measure requires a tax clearance before a professional or vocational license may be issued or renewed. Applies to taxable years beginning after 12/31/2016.
		The Executive Officer informed the Board that tax clearances are done manually by the Department of Taxation. Last year, they issued over 34,000 tax clearances. This bill would place a workload burden on both departments.
		It was moved by Mr. Kaya, seconded by Mr. Brady and unanimously carried to support the intent of the bill but the Board has concerns about the process of issuing tax clearances and the impact on timely processing of license renewals.
	c)	HB713/SB168 Relating to Contractors
		House Bill 713 and Senate Bill 168 require the Contractors Licensing Board and Board of Electricians and Plumbers to hire and train private deputies to investigate the use of unlicensed persons by contractors on construction sites. The bills will increase penalties for violation of scope of contracting, requires a report and appropriates moneys from the compliance resolution

fund.

The Executive Officer stated that the House Committee on Labor and Public Employment ("Committee") held a hearing on HB 713 on 02/03/2015. The Committee passed the bill with amendments, to require the State Department of Labor and Industrial Relations rather than informed the licensing Board to handle the responsibility of volunteer investigators on public works projects. The Executive Officer will monitor SB 168.

d) <u>SB478/HB284 Relating to the Hawaii Public Housing Authority</u>

Both measures appropriate funds for 30 permanent full-time equivalent multi-skilled worker civil service positions to assist the Hawaii Public Housing Authority in repair and maintenance of lowincome housing properties.

It was moved by Mr. Kaya, seconded by Mr. Brady and unanimously carried that the Board has no position on funding as long as the workers performing the trades are in compliance with HRS Chapter 448E.

Scope: a. Email Inquiry Regarding Fire Safety Sensors

The Board reviewed the email inquiry from Lisa Fields asking if a license is required for their wireless, plug and play LifeShield system Fire Safety Sensors.

After discussion, it was moved by Mr. Kaya, seconded by Mr. Brady and unanimously carried that no license is required for the Lifeshield system Fire Safety Sensors since no hard electrical wiring is required.

b. Email Inquiry Regarding Home Theater Equipment Installation

The Board reviewed the email inquiry from Anne Lockner asking if an electrical license is required to install home theater equipment.

After further discussion, it was moved by Mr. Kaya, seconded by Mr. Brady and unanimously carried that no license is required to install home theater equipment if no electrical hard wiring is required.
