Scope:

a. <u>Email Inquiry Regarding Protective Relays for Industrial and Utility Scale Customers; Testing, Maintenance and Commissioning.</u>
(Deferred April 14, 2015 meeting)

The Board again reviewed the email inquiry from Deven Matsumoto asking if any license is required to perform testing, maintenance, and commissioning of Protective Relays for industrial and utility scale customers. He further emphasized that the work would contain no installation/replacement/repair of wiring, conduit, equipment, switches, or breakers and the work would be only testing/verification of protective relaying operation and circuitry.

Mr. Matsumoto further explained in his email that some journey worker industrial electricians test relays but due to the high cost of the equipment and the specialization of the field, testing is usually contracted out to the manufacturer of the protective devices.

Mr. Lucero opined that a license is required if the testing, maintenance and commissioning involves electrical work and electrical wiring as defined in HAR chapter 16-80-3 as follows:

"Electrical wiring" means any electrical conductor, material, device, fitting, apparatus, appliance, fixture, or equipment, constituting a part of or connected to any electrical installation attached or fastened to any building, structure, or premises and which installation or portion thereof is designed, intended or used to generate, transmit, transform, or utilize electrical energy within the scope and purpose of the National Electrical Code, as adopted by each county.

"Electrical work" means the installation, alteration, reconstruction, or repair of electrical wiring.'

DAG Tam inquired as to what is involved in the testing, maintaining and commissioning of Protective Relays for industrial and utility scale customers.

After further discussion, it was moved by Mr. Brady, seconded by Mr. Lucero and unanimously carried to defer the email inquiry asking if a license is required to perform testing, maintenance, and commissioning of Protective Relay for industrial and utility scale customers until the Board receives clarification of the testing, maintaining and commissioning process or procedures.
