After discussion, it was moved by Dr. Geimer-Flanders, seconded by Dr. Bintliff and unanimously carried to reject the Settlement Agreement Prior to Filing of Petition for Disciplinary Action and Board's Final Order.

After due consideration of the information received, it was moved by Dr. Holt, seconded by Dr. Sept, and unanimously carried to defer Dr. Wilcox's application for medical licensure. In deferring Dr. Wilcox's application the Board requests that Dr. Wilcox appear before the Board by phone or in person.

Paul M. Scheele, M.D.

After due consideration of the information received, it was moved by Dr. Bintliff, seconded by Chair Desai, and unanimously carried to approve Dr. Scheele's application for medical licensure, and issue him a Non-Disciplinary Letter of Education due to his failure to provide accurate information on his application. Additionally, the Board requires that Dr. Scheele submit a revised application.

Ryan H. Kwon, D.O.

After due consideration of the information received, it was moved by Dr. Geimer-Flanders, seconded by Dr. Sept, with Dr. Akaka abstaining, and carried to deny Dr. Kwon's application for osteopathic licensure, basing its decision on the following grounds of the Hawaii Revised Statutes ("HRS"), which find factual support in the records and files of Dr. Kwon's application:

HRS § 453-8(a)(7): Professional misconduct, hazardous negligence

causing bodily injury to another, or manifest incapacity in the practice of medicine, osteopathy,

or surgery;

HRS § 453-8(a)(9): Conduct or practice contrary to recognized

standards of the ethics of the medical profession as adopted by the Hawaii Medical Association, the American Medical Association, the Hawaii Association of Osteopathic Physicians and Surgeons, or the American Osteopathic

Association:

HRS § 453-8(a)(11): Revocation, suspension or other disciplinary action

by another state or federal agency of a license, certificate, or medical privilege for reasons as

provided in this section;

HRS § 453-8(a)(15): Submitting to or filing with the board any notice,

statement, or other document required under this chapter, which is false or untrue or contains any material misstatement or omission of fact:

HRS § 436B-19(5): Procuring a license through fraud,

misrepresentation, or deceit;

HRS § 436B-19(8): Failure to maintain a record or history of

competency, trustworthiness, fair dealing, and

financial integrity; and

HRS § 436B-19(12): Failure to comply, observe, or adhere to any law in

a manner such that the licensing authority deems the applicant or holder to be an unfit or improper

person to hold a license.

The Board also considers Dr. Kwon's conduct extremely concerning and contrary to the recognized standards of medical ethics as adopted by the American Osteopathic Association ("AOA"). Specifically, the Board believes that Dr. Kwon failed to uphold the following sections of the AOA Code of Ethics:

Section 13. A physician shall respect the law. When necessary a physician shall attempt to help to formulate the law by all proper means in order to improve patient care and public health; and

Section 18. A physician shall not intentionally misrepresent himself/herself or his/her research work in any way.

Roderick L. Paras, M.D.

After due consideration of the information received, it was moved by Chair Desai, seconded by Dr. Holt, and unanimously carried to defer Dr. Paras' application for medical licensure pending additional information.

After due consideration of the information received, it was moved by Chair Desai, seconded by Dr. Kosasa and unanimously carried to defer Dr. Bussell's request to have the conditions modified on his conditional medical license.

Necessity of Medical License for Training Activity: Physicians
Providing Training Sessions for FDA-approved Non-surgical
Devise to Treat Hemorrhoids

This matter was deferred from the December 11, 2014 meeting.

The Board received a letter dated May 23, 2014, from Michaela D. Poizner, regarding the necessity of a medical license for training activities.

According to Ms. Poizner's letter, she "seek[s] confirmation from the Hawaii Medical Board that physicians providing training sessions regarding the device [an FDA-approved non-surgical device to treat hemorrhoids] are not required to be licensed in [Hawaii]." She explains further that:

Licensed surgeons are available to prospective and current users of the device for training, consultation, and support as needed. To receive the benefit of this support, a physician practicing in Hawaii may infrequently call one of the surgeons into Hawaii to be present while that physician performs a procedure using the device. In addition to a didactic training session, the surgeon observes the use of the device and examines the doctor's placement of the band to confirm that the physician has used it correctly. The surgeon would not treat the patient or bill the patient. The patient remains under the care and responsibility of the Hawaii-licensed physician.

Emphasis added.

Discussion followed. After due consideration of the information received, it was moved by Chair Desai, seconded by Dr. Kosasa and unanimously carried to have its Executive Officer inform Ms. Poizner that providing advice, direction, and examination during a patient care encounter is considered the treatment of a patient, and is therefore the practice of medicine. The Board did not believe billing of a patient to be relevant to or determinative of her question. However, the Board did consider examination of "the doctor's placement of the band to confirm that the physician had used it correctly" to necessitate the surgeon's direct involvement with and/or touching of the patient. As such, the out-of-state licensed surgeon would be required to obtain a medical license pursuant to Hawaii Revised Statutes §§453-3.2 or 453-4.

In accordance with Hawaii Administrative Rule § 16-201-90, the above interpretation is for informational and explanatory purposes only. It is not

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an official opinion or decision, and therefore is not to be viewed as binding on the Board or the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs.
