<u>Call to Order</u>: There being a quorum present, Chairperson Akasaki called the meeting to

order at 8:35 a.m.

Agenda: The agenda for this meeting was filed with the Office of the Lieutenant

Governor, as required by Hawaii Revised Statutes ("HRS") section 92-7(b).

Minutes: It was moved by Mr. Konishi, seconded by Mr. Kamai, and unanimously

carried to approve the March 20, 2015 executive session minutes, April 24,

2015 meeting minutes, and the May 11, 2015 Applications Committee meeting and executive session meeting minutes as circulated.

Chapter 91, HRS, Adjudicatory Matters:

Chairperson Akasaki called for a recess from the Board's meeting at 8:36 a.m. to discuss and deliberate on the following adjudicatory matters pursuant to HRS chapter 91.

1. <u>Settlement Agreements</u>

a. <u>In the Matter of the Contractors' Licenses of Mainland-Pacific, Ltd., dba Mainland-Pacific Builders and Michael K. Coates, RME; CLB 2015-63-L</u>

RICO received a complaint alleging that Mainland-Pacific, Ltd., dba Mainland-Pacific Builders (Respondent "MPL") with Michael K. Coates as the RME ("Respondent Coates") performed work on a project located in Waikiki and assisted an unlicensed entity to also perform work on the same condominium project.

If proven at an administrative hearing before the Board, the allegations would constitute violations of the following laws:

- HRS section 436B-19(6) (aiding and abetting an unlicensed person to directly or indirectly perform activities requiring a license); and
- HRS section 436B-19(16) (employing, utilizing, or attempting to employ or utilize at any time any person not licensed under the licensing laws where licensure is required).

Respondents do not admit to violating any law or rule but agree to pay a fine in the amount of \$7,500.00.

After discussion, it was moved by Mr. Kamai, seconded by Mr. Mochida, and unanimously carried to approve the Settlement Agreement Prior to Filing of Petition for Disciplinary Action and Board's Final Order in the above case.

b. <u>In the Matter of the Contractors' Licenses of S & A Industries,</u> Inc., and Maiser M. Aboneaaj; CLB 2013-483-L

RICO received a complaint alleging that S & A Industries, Inc. ("Respondent S & A") and Maiser M. Aboneaaj, RME ("Respondent Aboneeaj") failed to follow the licensing laws related to responsible managing employees. It is alleged that Respondent Aboneeaj was not in residence in Hawaii for periods of time while the project was under construction.

If proven at an administrative hearing before the Board, the allegations would constitute violations of the following statutes and rules:

- HRS section 436B-19(17) (violating chapter or applicable licensing laws); and
- HAR section 16-77-71(a)(4) (RME shall be in residence in the State during the period a project is under construction).

Respondents do not admit to violating any law or rule, but agree to pay an administrative fine, jointly and severally, in the amount of \$75,000.00.

After discussion, it was moved by Mr. Kamai, seconded by Mr. Konishi, and unanimously carried to approve the Settlement Agreement Prior to Filing of Petition for Disciplinary Action and Board's Final Order in the above case.

<u>Jesse Dunning</u> – Mr. Dunning is requesting a determination on whether a C-15b Telecommunications and/or a C-68TN Communications tower contractor may perform grounding work on communication towers.

Mr. Dunning stated that the "grounding" on cell sites he is referring has nothing to do with power. It is not about installing an electrical system. The grounding is to protect the system from potential lightning strikes and to keep static charges from building and causing damage to the equipment and causing interference in the frequencies that the calls and data are on.

Mr. Suehiro stated that grounding is considered electrical work and cannot be performed by the C-15. The C-13 is required to install the rod in the ground and ground the tower and perimeter fence around the cell tower.

DAG Tam stated that the Board is being consistent with its prior determination that "grounding and bonding" should be done by the C-13 Electrical contractor.

Mr. Dunning stated that his point is if there is going to be any discussion on cell phone tower work. He felt that the Board should create a new classification just for cell tower work as it does involve multiple classifications. Various communication companies are contracting work to unlicensed mainland contractors and it is hurting the licensed contractors in Hawaii who are able to do the work. Executive Officer Ito related that this discussion is limited to his inquiry pertaining to whether a C-15 or C-68TN may perform grounding on cell towers. His concerns regarding creating a new classification for cell tower work only will be discussed later in the agenda, under "Correspondence".

Mr. Dunning inquired about coaxial grounding and bonding to the ground buss bar or to the tower. On page 146 of the specs he provided, the outer shield of the coaxial cable and elliptical waveguide must be bonded to the tower. Mr. Suehiro replied that it is still considered grounding and bonding that must be performed by a C-13.

Mr. Dunning stated that "grounding" questions are included in the C-15 exam, so why should they be tested on it if they are not able to do it? Executive Officer Tamanaha related that being tested on grounding doesn't necessarily

mean that you are being tested to install; it may be that it is required knowledge because it is related to C-15 work.

Mr. Dunning stated that the point he is trying to make is that this industry should be regulated correctly because Hawaii contractors cannot compete with unlicensed mainland contractors. Executive Officer Tamanaha related that utility companies can use their own employees if they are doing the work in-house and they don't need to use a licensed electrician. Mr. Dunning stated that mainland communication companies do not do their own work; they contract work to unlicensed mainland contractors. The Board indicated that unlicensed activity is under the Regulated Industries Complaints Office jurisdiction, and suggested that Mr. Dunning file a complaint with that office.

Mr. Dunning also felt that a classification for cell towers should be created where an exam is required. DAG Tam responded that requiring an exam does not solve the problem of unlicensed mainland contractors coming here to do work. Mr. Dunning agreed that it does not, but he is talking about cell phone work as a new trade. Mr. Polischeck related that cell phone tower work needs subcontractors, because the C-68TN can only build the tower. Executive Officer Tamanaha explained that the Board does not create new classifications just because of new technology. New technology work is usually already covered in existing classifications.

Mr. Suehiro stated that it appears that their clients need to be educated on the trades involved in cell phone tower work. Mr. Dunning stated that his apprentice can do the tower work, but he is not a licensed electrician. The available employees in his industry who are at the journeyman level are generally not licensed electricians, so it will be difficult for him to hire someone who can do the tower work and also be a licensed electrician.

The Board indicated that the problem is competition and all licensees have to go through the same thing and hire subs to do work they are not licensed to do themselves. The Board cannot roll all the classifications involved in cell tower work into a new classification. There is an existing licensing scheme where different work performed on cell towers fall under different classifications.

Recommendation: All grounding and bonding work must be performed by the C-13 Electrical contractor. Thus, neither the C-15 Telecommunications nor the C-68TN Communications tower contractor is allowed to perform grounding work on communication towers.

This inquiry is concerning clarification and what it means in HAR section 16-77-80(a)(6) that states: "A clear statement of the risk of loss of any payments made to a sales representative (printed in distinct capital letters next to the owner's signature line)".

The Board indicated that the sales representative only sells services. If the consumer makes the check payable to the salesperson and the salesperson does not pay the contractor, the consumer is still responsible for paying the

contractor. The Board came to a consensus that this disclosure notifies the consumer that if they make payments to a salesperson (i.e., issues a check payable to salesperson), there is a risk that the salesperson may not pay the contractor and the consumer will be responsible for paying the contractor.
