Call to Order: There being a quorum present, Chairperson Akasaki called the meeting to

order at 8:32 a.m.

Chairperson Akasaki introduced and welcomed Mr. Isemoto who is appointed

as a member of the Board on an interim basis.

Governor, as required by Hawaii Revised Statutes ("HRS") section 92-7(b).

Minutes: It was moved by Mr. Konishi, seconded by Mr. Leong, and unanimously

carried to approve the Applications Committee meeting and Executive Session meeting minutes of February 8, 2016, and the Board Meeting and Executive Session meeting minutes of January 29, 2016 as circulated.

The meeting was taken out of order and continued with "HRS Chapter 91,

Adjudicatory Matters".

<u>Chapter 91, HRS,</u> <u>Adjudicatory</u> Matters:

Chairperson Akasaki called for a recess from the Board's meeting at 8:34 a.m. to discuss and deliberate on the following adjudicatory matters pursuant to HRS chapter 91.

1. Settlement Agreements

a. <u>In the Matter of the Contractors' Licenses of Hurst & Seibert,</u> Inc., and Lynn S. Hurst; CLB 2015-341-L

After discussion, this matter was deferred for amendments requested by the Board.

b. <u>In the Matter of the Contractors' Licenses of American</u>
<u>Technologies, Inc. doing business as American Restoration</u>
and Interiors, and Gary P. Moore; CLB 2014-339-L

Respondent American Technologies, Inc. doing business as American Restoration and Interiors ("Respondent American Technologies") and Respondent Gary P. Moore ("Respondent Moore") are licensed in the C-19 classification. The licenses were issued on or about December 11, 2003; and is due to expire or forfeit on or about September 30, 2016. At all relevant times herein, Respondent Moore was the Responsible Managing Employee for Respondent American Technologies.

RICO alleges Respondent American Technologies was issued a citation by the California Contractors State License Board based on work performed by subcontractors. Respondent was assessed a \$1,500.00 fine. RICO alleges Respondent failed to timely report the citation.

If proven at an administrative hearing, the allegations would constitute violations of the following law:

• HRS section 436B-19(15) (failure to report disciplinary action within thirty days).

Respondents agree to pay an administrative fine, jointly and severally, in the amount of \$500.00.

After discussion, it was moved by Mr. Konishi, seconded by Mr. Lee, and unanimously carried to approve the Settlement Agreement Prior to Filing of Petition for Disciplinary Action and Board's Final Order in the above case.

c. <u>In the Matter of the Contractors' Licenses of Horizon Retail</u>

CLB 2015-216-L

d. <u>In the Matter of the Contractor's License of Thomas E.</u>
O'Leary, dba O'Leary Construction; CLB 2014-323-L

Respondent Thomas E. O'Leary dba O'Leary Construction ("Respondent") was licensed as a "B" General building contractor on or about April 5, 2013, and the license is due to expire on or about September 30, 2016.

RICO alleges that on or about April 9, 2013, Respondent employed or utilized an unlicensed person to perform work that required a license.

If proven at an administrative hearing, the allegations would constitute violations of the following law:

 HRS section 444-17(17) (entering into a contract with an unlicensed contractor involving work or activity for the performance of which licensing is required under chapter 444).

Respondent does not admit to violating any law or rule, but agrees to pay an administrative fine in the amount of \$1,000.00.

to Filing of Petition for Disciplinary Action and Board's Final Order in the above case.

Committee Reports:

1. <u>Examination Committee</u>: Aldon Mochida, Chairperson

The Contractors Examination Summary for January 2016 was distributed to the Board for their information.

2. Recovery/Education Fund Committee:

The Recovery Fund Litigation Report for January 23, 2016 to February 19, 2016 prepared by Ronald Michioka, Esq., the Board's Recovery Fund Attorney, was distributed to the Board for their information.

3. <u>Legislation Committee</u>: Peter H. M. Lee, Chairperson

Mr. Lee presented the Legislation Committee Report. A summary was distributed to the Board for their review and comment.

H.B. No. 129 – This bill allows the Board to accept equivalent knowledge, training, or experience, including self-employment and unlicensed experience, in lieu of a specific experience requirement for licensure, if the Board investigates and makes a detailed written finding available for public inspection. The Board is opposed to this bill because it already has the authority in its administrative rules to accept equivalent knowledge, training, and experience; and requiring disclosure of detailed information regarding an applicant's qualifications may violate HRS chapter 92F. In addition, the Board already does take unlicensed activity into account when considering experience for applicants.

On January 29, 2016, the House Committee on Labor & Public Employment ("LAB") held a hearing on H.B. No. 129. The Board submitted testimony in opposition.

LAB passed this measure with amendments to address concerns raised by International Union of Elevator Constructors. LAB amended this measure by clarifying that the reasonably equivalent knowledge, training, and applicant experience licensing substitutes that the CLB may accept under this measure does not apply to elevator mechanics under HRS chapter 448H.

H.B. No. 129, H.D.1 was referred to the House Committee on Consumer Protection and Commerce ("CPC") on February 2, 2016. On February 10, 2016 the CPC held a hearing on H.B. No. 129, H.D.1. The Board submitted testimony in opposition.

On February 11, 2016, the CPC deferred H.B. 129 H.D.1.

H.B. No. 130 – This bill prohibits the "A" and "B" general contractors from doing any work it is not licensed in and defines "incidental and supplemental". The Board strongly opposes this bill because all general contractors automatically hold certain specialty contractors which allow them to perform the broad scope of their work and the Board's Final Order Upon Remand in the <u>DC 50</u> case already defines "incidental and supplemental" work.

On January 29, 2016, the House Committee on Labor & Public Employment ("LAB") held a hearing on H.B. No. 130. The Board submitted testimony in strong opposition. LAB deferred this measure.

4. <u>Rules Committee</u>: Tyrus Kagawa, Chairperson

5. <u>Investigation Committee</u>: Kent Matsuzaki, Chairperson None.

6. <u>Scope of Activity Committee</u>: Nathan T. Konishi, Chairperson

Michael LaCasse – Requests a determination on which license classification is required to perform the following types of electrical testing: circuit breaker testing, transformer testing, cable testing, and relay testing and calibration.

The Board deferred this matter at its January 29, 2016 meeting pending the receipt of additional information on the work that is performed; specifically whether there is testing in place, removal of any breakers, removal and replacement after testing, and whether there is any energized testing.

Mr. LaCasse provided the requested information and was present at the meeting. He related that insurance companies are forcing people to get this type of maintenance testing done.

Ryan Takahashi from the Hawaii Electricians Market Enhancement Program Fund testified that although he is not familiar with this type of business, if it is related to NEC, this work would require the C-13 license.

Mr. La Casse stated that this is not simple testing and shared that there was an incident where the wrong test was used to test the circuit for power sharing and it knocked out the board.

Orgo-Thermit Inc. – Requests a determination whether a license is required to perform "Initial or Preventative Grinding" on the HART Light Rail Project. Three qualified operators and the Autech VM8000 Rail Grinder will perform the rail grinding work. The new rail needs to be ground to remove all mill scale and any anomalies from the mill. This process also extends the overall life of the rail and provides better conductivity for signaling.

Arnold Wong from the Ironworkers Local Union 625 Stabilization Fund stated that the rail is structural steel and that grinding of the steel rail should require a C-48 Structural steel contractor's license.

Eric Carson – (1) Requests a copy of the law or regulation that states if a door or window is installed in a block frame (non-nail on frame) that the product needs to be installed by someone with a C-22 glazing license; (2) Is a C-22 Glazing and tinting contractor's license required to install wood clad doors that have wood frames and aluminum tracks in condos as replacement product? (3) Can a contractor install doors that require a C-22 license by working under another license and is not affiliated with the business?

Dwayne Arelliano, District Council 50/Glaziers Union testified that this work requires a C-22 license.

Royal Contracting Company – Requests a determination on which license classification is required to screen dirt for topsoil. Mr. Leong recused himself from the discussion on this matter.
