Call to Order: There being a quorum present, the Chair called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m.

Approval of the Previous Minutes – December 19, 2013

The Chair called for a motion in regards to the minutes of the December 19, 2013 meeting. Upon a motion by the Chair, seconded by Ms. Okamura, it was voted on and unanimously carried to approve the minutes for the December 19, 2013 as circulated.

Laws and Rules **Committee Report:**

The Chair reported on the Committee's December 19, 2013 meeting.

The Chair stated the Committee will be reviewing the March 17, 2010 draft of HAR 16-95 regarding collaborative agreements. Currently only the emergency contraception section talks about collaborative agreements. The Committee will be looking at the language to define what a collaborative agreement is and what the requirements are. The Committee will also be reviewing

the definition of immunizations to come up with a better definition. Right now a pharmacist may administer immunizations, but it does not cover other medications such as in the event of adverse reactions to the immunization.

The Chair stated the issues the Rules Committee will be focusing on in 2014 are collaborative agreements, miscellaneous permits and the definition of pharmacy.

Executive Officer's
Report:

2014 Legislature

Relating to Pharmacists – Veterinary Continuing Education

The EO reported that the Laws and Rules Committee reviewed a draft of the veterinary continuing education HB 2106 at their November 21, 2013 meeting. In the December 19, 2013 Board meeting minutes that were just approved, the November 21, 2013 Laws and Rules Committee recommendations are included. The recommendations are to have the Board of Veterinary Examiners document be posted as a "guidance document" on the Board's webpage and also answers to six questions the Board of Veterinary Examiners asked the Board. The EO suggested amending the answer to question #5 to state – "A pharmacist will use their professional judgment to assist patient in proper delivery of medications and will consult and/or defer questions to the prescribing veterinarian". The EO asked the Board for their approval to post the guidance document on the Board's webpage and also to approve the Committee's responses to the Board of Veterinary Examiners six questions with the suggested amendment to #5.

Upon a motion by Ms. Okamura, seconded by Dr. Ma, it was voted on and unanimously carried to approve the Laws and Rules Committee's recommendations and post the Board of Veterinary Examiners "guidance document" on the Board of Pharmacy's webpage and approve the Committee's responses to the Board of Veterinary Examiners six questions with the EO's amendment to #5.

Guest Patrick Adams stated his concern with this bill is a group besides the Board of Pharmacy is mandating what the scope of practice is for pharmacists.

The Chair thanked Mr. Adams for his comments and stated the Board is acting in response to the bill.

The EO stated at the November 21, 2013 Laws and Rules Committee meeting they reviewed a draft of HB 2106 and their concerns were:

- Veterinary prescriptions are not defined
- The Board of Pharmacy is not qualified to develop a training program for pharmacist to dispense veterinary medications
- The availability of medications to animals would become severely limited
- Bill is unnecessary because most veterinary medications are dispensed by veterinarians

The EO asked the Board for their comments, concerns, recommendations and/or position on the bill.

Upon a motion by the Chair, seconded by Mr. Lau, it was voted on and unanimously carried to oppose HB 2106 because of the concerns raised by the Laws and Rules Committee and the comments from Mr. Patrick Adams.

HB 2144 – Relating to Prescriptions

The EO reported this bill limits the number of days of supply of narcotic drugs that a physician may prescribe for pain management. Requires a blood or urine test and consultation with a pharmacist for refills of narcotic drugs in certain circumstances. Excludes hospice patients from these limitations.

SB 2055 – Relating to Narcotic Drugs

The EO reported this bill amends prescriptive authority for narcotic drugs listed in schedule III of the controlled substances act by requiring a written prescription from a practitioner; limiting the prescriptions to a thirty day supply with no refill; and limiting who may prescribe these drugs.

2013 Renewals – Final Report

The EO reported as of January 7, 2014 out of 2,459 licensed pharmacists 2,301 have renewed. Out of 279 licensed pharmacies 260 have renewed. Out of 472 licensed pharmacy miscellaneous permits 415 have renewed and out of 75 licensed wholesale prescription drug distributors 50 have renewed.

NABP e-News

NABP VPP Facilitates Nonresident Pharmacy Licensure; Program Accepted in Virginia as Meeting State’s New Inspection Requirements

NABP has launched the Verified Pharmacy Program (VPP) which was developed in partnership with member boards of pharmacy to facilitate the sharing of information and to help provide for consistency among requirements related to nonresident pharmacy licensure. Effective July 1, 2013, the Virginia Board of Pharmacy has implemented new regulations regarding inspection requirements for pharmacy licensure and is accepting VPP inspections as meeting the new requirements if a nonresident pharmacy has not been inspected by the regulatory or licensing agency of the jurisdiction in which it is located.

Virginia Board of Pharmacy Letter to Nonresident Pharmacies

The Virginia Board of Pharmacy requested that NABP share a letter with all executive officers of state boards of pharmacy regarding nonresident pharmacy registrations. The letter states, in order for a nonresident pharmacy to renew, they are required to submit a copy of a current inspection report that meets Virginia’s criteria for acceptance as follows:

- The inspection must have been conducted by the regulatory or licensing agency of your resident state no more than two years prior to the date of submission of the application for renewal of the Virginia registration;
- The inspection shall indicate compliance with the requirements of the Virginia Drug

Control Act, including compliance with United States Pharmacopeia-National Formulary (USP-NF) standards for pharmacies performing sterile and nonsterile compounding.

Letter from the FDA Regarding the New Drug Quality and Security Act

The letter from the FDA is asking the reader to encourage nonresident compounding pharmacies that ship compounded sterile drugs into their state to register with the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) as outsourcing facilities under the new legislation that was signed into law November 27, 2013. The registration of pharmacies as outsourcing facilities will help FDA identify and more effectively regulate these facilities.

Old Business:

HAR Title 16, Chapter 95 – Status Report

The EO reported she had to have another draft printed and will have it to the DAG by the end of the month.

Pharmacy Technician Survey – Status Report

The EO reported that of the 250 surveys faxed to Hawaii pharmacies, 96 responses were received. The breakdown is as follows:

Total number of pharmacy technicians	-	423 (267 retail, 156 institution/other)
Total number of pharmacy interns	-	35 (32 retail, 3 institution/other)
Total number of cashiers	-	56 (56 retail)

Pharmacy technicians with National Certification	87/267 retail, 57/156 institution other
Pharmacy technicians with On the Job training	167/267 retail, 73/156 institution other

The survey also asked the question, "Should the Board regulate pharmacy technicians?" **56** Yes (46 retail, 15 institution/other) and **38** No (28 retail, 4 institution/other).

The EO stated she will provide the results to the Hawaii Pharmacists Association since they assisted with the survey.

The EO stated she looked at the National Association Boards of Pharmacy ("NABP") 2014 law survey and according to their statistics 8 states license pharmacy technicians, 34 states register pharmacy technicians and 8 certify pharmacy technicians.

The EO suggested the Laws and Rules Committee discuss the results and information provided and make a recommendation to the Board.

Open Forum:

The Chair stated he met with Dr. Sara Park in regards to pandemic influenza planning. What Dr. Park has suggested is in case we have an outbreak of pandemic influenza, she is seeking an opportunity for pharmacies to get involved in the distribution and administration of vaccines to the public. Dr. Park asked the Chair if he could start meeting with pharmacy chains to start the process of obtaining local contacts and discuss identifying some of the barriers that would need to be overcome so this could occur. The Chair stated the Department of Health ("DOH") feels

that if pharmacies could be involved, the CDC could ship the vaccines to the pharmacies and they can vaccinate the community under specific guidelines issued by the DOH.

Guest Marcella Chock and Patrick Adams stated they will provide the Chair with some contact information.

The EO asked guest Greg Edwards to provide his responses to inquiries that had been sent to the Board but did not come under the Board's purview and were therefore referred to Mr. Edwards for a response.

Mr. Edward stated an inquiry regarding biologics through interstate travel, this would come under the FDA and therefore Mr. Edwards forwarded that inquiry to the FDA. Mr. Edwards stated another inquiry regarding electronic prescriptions and faxes and whether or not they have to be printed, the printout of electronic prescriptions is not required.
