Call to Order: The agenda for this meeting was filed with the Office of the Lieutenant Governor, as required by section 92-7(b), Hawaii Revised Statutes ("HRS").

There being a quorum present, the Chair called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m.

Chair's Report:

Announcements and Introductions – HRS §92-3 Open Meetings, and HAR §16-95-118 Oral Testimony

The Chair asked the Board members and audience to introduce themselves.

The Chair read HRS §92-3 Open Meetings and HAR §16-95-118 Oral Testimony as follows:

§92-3 Open meetings. Every meeting of all boards shall be open to the public and all person shall be permitted to attend any meeting unless otherwise provided in the constitution or as closed pursuant to sections 92-4 and 92-5; provided that the removal of any person or persons who willfully disrupts a meeting to prevent and compromise the conduct of the meeting shall not be prohibited. The boards shall afford all interested persons an opportunity to submit data, views, or arguments, in writing, on any agenda item. The board shall also afford all interested persons an opportunity to present oral testimony on any agenda item. The boards may provide for reasonable administration of oral testimony by rule.

§92-3.1 Limited meetings (a) if a board determines that it is necessary to meet at a location that is dangerous to health or safety, or if a board determines that it is necessary to conduct an on-site inspection of a location that is related to the board's business at which public attendance is not practicable, and the director of the office of information practices concurs, the board may hold limited meeting at that location that shall not be open to the public; provided that at a regular meeting of the board prior to the limited meeting:

(1) The board determines, after sufficient public deliberation, that it is necessary to hold the limited meeting and specifies the reasons for its determination that the locations is dangerous to health or safety or that the on-site inspection is necessary and public attendance is impracticable;

(2) Two-thirds of all members to which the board is entitled vote to adopt the determination required by paragraph (1); and

(3) Notice of the limited meeting is provided in accordance with section 92-7.

(b) At all limited meetings, the board shall:

(1) Videotape the meeting, unless the requirement is waived by the director of the office of information practices, and comply with all requirements of section 92-9;

(2) Make the videotape available at the next regular meeting; and

(3) Make no decisions at the meeting.

§16-95-118 Oral testimony. (a) The board shall accept oral testimony on any item which is on the agenda, provided that the testimony shall be subject to the following conditions:

(1) Each person seeking to present oral testimony is requested to notify the board not later than forty-eight hours before the meeting, and at that time to state the item on which testimony is to be presented;

(2) The board may request that any person providing oral testimony submit the remarks, or a summary of the remarks, in writing to the board;

(3) The board may rearrange the items on the agenda for the purpose of providing for the most efficient and convenient presentation of oral testimony;

- (4) Persons presenting oral testimony at the beginning of the testimony shall identify themselves and the organization, if any, that they represent;
 - (5) The board may limit oral testimony to a specified time period but in no case shall the period be less than five minutes, and the person testifying shall be informed prior to the commencement of the testimony of the time constraints to be imposed; and
 - (6) The board may refuse to hear any testimony which is irrelevant, immaterial, or unduly repetitious to the agenda item on which it is presented.
- (b) Nothing in this section shall require the board to hear or receive any oral or documentary evidence from a person on any matter which is the subject of another proceeding pending subject to the hearings relief, declaratory relief, or rule relief provisions of chapter 16-201.
- (c) Nothing in this section shall prevent the board from soliciting oral remarks from persons present at the meeting or from inviting persons to make presentations to the board on any particular matter on the board's agenda.

The Chair called for a motion in regards to the minutes of the February 13, 2014 meeting.

Report on Attendance at FDA's Meeting to Discuss the Oversight of Compounding Pharmacy Compounding, March 20-21, 2014, Silver Spring, Maryland

The Chair reported that he was unable to attend due to a family emergency.

Laws and Rules Committee Report:

The Chair reported on the Committee's February 13, 2014 meeting.

At its last meeting the Chair provided a copy of a draft he had prepared of a collaborative agreement section for the Committee to review and discuss.

The UH Hilo College of Pharmacy students who were present at the meeting via webcast were asked to research and provide the Committee with information on what other states are doing collaborative agreements and how they are doing it.

Guest Dan Purcell asked at this time if he could comment on item 6.a.1) on the agenda since he has to leave and may not be present to comment when the agenda item comes up. He said his comment is only about 15 seconds.

The DAG stated that Mr. Purcell can be accommodated at this time.

National Association of Boards of Pharmacy (NABP)

NABP Collaborates with Health Care Stakeholders on Ensuring Delivery of Responsible and Effective Patient Care – Consensus Document on Prescribing and Dispensing Controlled Substances Issued

Guest Dan Purcell stated this is talking about collaborating to get better prescribing and dispensing of controlled substances. Mr. Purcell stated he was at a recent Board of Health meeting with Dr. Rosen and she expressed concern regarding collaborating with pharmacist more. She feels that facilities and hospitals need to do more to give the best drugs and give the people what they need, there needs to be more cooperation between the pharmacist and the medical people who are out in the field. Mr. Purcell stated he is not speaking for Dr. Rosen.

Further discussion was deferred.

Executive Session:

At 9:18 a.m., upon a motion by the Chair, seconded by the Vice Chair, it was voted on and unanimously carried to move into executive session pursuant to §92-5(a)(1) and (4), HRS, “to consider and evaluate personal information relating to individuals applying for professional or vocational licenses cited in section 26-9 or both;” and “To consult with the Board’s attorney on questions and issues pertaining to the board’s powers, duties, privileges, immunities, and liabilities;”.

Also, upon a motion by the Chair, seconded by Ms. Okamura, it was voted on and unanimously carried to allow guest Greg Edwards from the Dept. of Health, Food and Drug Branch to stay in executive session so he may participate in the discussion.

At 9:53 a.m. upon a motion by the Chair, seconded by the Vice Chair it was voted on and unanimously carried to move out of executive session.

Executive Officer’s Report:

Presentation by Daria Loy-Goto, CEO, Regulated Industries Complaints Office on Complaint/Investigation Process

Ms. Loy-Goto provided the members with confidential information about the Regulated Industries Complaints Office (“RICO”) and gave a brief presentation.

NABP 110th Annual Meeting, May 17-20, 2014, Phoenix, Arizona – Mary Jo Keefe

The EO reported that Ms. Keefe will be attending the NABP 110th Annual Meeting in Phoenix, Arizona, May 17-20, 2014.

Latest Gallup Poll Ranks Nurses, Pharmacists and Grade School Teachers as Having the Highest Ethical Standards

The EO reported that the latest Gallup poll finds Americans viewing nurses, pharmacists and grade school teachers as having the highest ethical standards. Lobbyists, members of Congress, and car salespeople sit at the bottom of the list.

Report on CE Audit for 2012 – 2013 Biennium

The EO reported as of April 14, 2014, out of 107 audited pharmacists, only 45 have not responded yet. The deadline to respond is May 23, 2014.

National Association of Boards of Pharmacy (NABP)

NABP Collaborates with Health Care Stakeholders on Ensuring Delivery of Responsible and Effective Patient Care – Consensus Document on Prescribing and Dispensing Controlled Substances Issued

The Board reviewed a news release from NABP. It states that NABP, along with a coalition of health care industry stakeholders, has issued a consensus statement regarding the collaborative steps that will be taken to help ensure the delivery of responsible and effective patient care as it relates to the prescribing and dispensing of controlled substances.

The consensus statement was the result of stakeholder meetings convened by NABP in October 2013 and December 2013. The document was finalized at the December meeting and was delivered by NABP and the following organizations:

- American Academy of Family Physicians
- American Medical Association
- American Osteopathic Association
- CVS Caremark
- Federation of State Medical Boards (observer)
- National Association of Chain Drug Stores
- National Community Pharmacists Association
- Pharmaceutical Care Management Association
- Pharmaceutical Research and Manufacturers of America
- Rite Aid
- Walgreen Co.

All participating organizations acknowledge support for the consensus document, which is available in the Members section of the NABP website, under Position Papers.

Verified Pharmacy Program Update

The Board reviewed a memo from NABP regarding updates to the Verified Pharmacy Program (VPP). The VPP is an inspection service and information sharing network the boards of pharmacy may use to share critical inspection and licensing data with their fellow boards.

The Board also reviewed a sample of a VPP facility inspection alert memo that is sent to the member boards of pharmacy from NABP.

Questions about Collaborative Practice from the University of Nebraska Medical Center

Mr. Lau lead the discussion on an inquiry from the University of Nebraska Medical Center, College of Pharmacy.

The College of Pharmacy is proposing to do a research project focusing on using rapid diagnostic testing technology, Clinical Laboratory Improvement Amendments (CLIA) waived rapid diagnostic

tests in the community pharmacy setting and providing appropriate pharmacotherapy as a result of that testing. They are asking if the study proposed is something that could be legal in Hawaii and does Hawaii have specific statutes, rules or regulations about the components of a collaborative practice agreement between a pharmacist and a licensed diagnostician? Can the collaborating practitioner be any legal prescriber or only a physician?

It was the consensus of the Board to refer this inquiry to Hawaii Revised Statutes §461-1.

Electronic Recordkeeping Inquiry from Walmart

Ms. Okamura lead the discussion on an inquiry regarding electronic recordkeeping. Four specific questions asked in the inquiry are as stated below with the Board's responses:

1. Can we discontinue printing the erx? We can print on demand - **Refer to Department of Health, Food and Drug Branch**
2. Can we discontinue printing the fax rx? We can print on demand - **refer to HAR 16-95-82 and Department of Health, Food and Drug Branch**
3. Can we file non-controlled rx's by day rather than by 100? **–Refer to Department of Health, Food and Drug Branch**
4. Can we file non-controlled rx's by day without attaching the End of Day information? We can print the rx with the End of Day information on demand. – **Refer to Department of Health, Food and Drug Branch**

Mr. Edwards from the Department of Health, Food and Drug Branch was present and addressed the questions. A fax rx is an electronic rx, therefore the answer to questions 1 and 2 are yes. The manner in which the rx is received is the prescription. So if it was truly received electronically, meaning no paper involved, that is the form that it needs to be maintained in. In reference to questions 3 and 4, Chapter 328 does not address that and therefore Mr. Edwards could not answer those questions.
