#### Approval of the Previous Minutes – October 17, 2013 meeting

The Chair called for a motion for the minutes of the October 17, 2013 meeting.

Upon a motion by Ms. Okamura, seconded by Mr. Lau, it was voted on and unanimously carried to approve the minutes of the October 17, 2013 meeting as circulated.

#### <u>New Business</u>: **Dispensing of Veterinary Drugs**

The Chair lead the discussion on the dispensing of veterinary drugs.

The Chair stated in reading the correspondence, a lot of the problems that occurred was due to the pharmacist changing the drug dosage without consulting with the veterinarian. The Chair found this action very troublesome that someone would make an adjustment without first call the veterinarian.

The EO asked if a substitution for generic drugs was made.

The Chair stated no, the adjustment was in the dosage amount. A substitution for generic drugs as stated in Chapter 328 applies only to humans and human medications. Therefore if you received a branded prescription for dog, you could not apply a generic substitution.

The EO stated there are sixteen statements provided by the Hawaii Board of Veterinary Examiners in regards to veterinary prescription for the Committee to consider and there are six questions. The questions with the Committee's

responses are as follows:

- 1. If a pharmacy changes or alters the veterinary prescriptions, who is liable or responsible for any ill consequences to the veterinary patient that may result? *A pharmacist is not allowed to change or alter a prescription without first consulting the prescriber.*
- 2. How does the Pharmacy Board feel about diversion of veterinary products and medications? *The Board of Pharmacy's current laws and rules do not dictate where a pharmacy obtains prescription drugs from.*
- If diversion occurs, how are quality control, safety and efficacy of products managed if manufacturers void their liability/product guarantees because their products are being sold by non-veterinary sources? See response #2.
- 4. If diversion occurs, how are quality control, safety and efficacy of products managed if a manufacture recalls a product? *See response #2.*
- 5. Will appropriate dispensing equipment be supplied with prescription? Will the pharmacist be responsible for providing the proper implement(s) for delivery of the medication? *A pharmacist will use their professional judgment to assist patient in proper delivery of medications.*
- 6. Currently, what information is required by pharmacists in order to process

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a prescription for a veterinary patient (e.g. breed, drug name, dosage, client information, etc)? *Refer to §16-95-82.* 

Regarding the sixteen statements provided by the Hawaii Board of Veterinary Examiners, it was the consensus of the Committee to recommend that the information be placed on the Board of Pharmacy's webpage as a guidance document provided by the Hawaii Board of Veterinary Examiners.

# Defining "Otherwise Qualified Pharmacy" for Act 226, SLH 2013 Per Request from the Insurance Commissioner

The Chair lead the discussion on a request from the Insurance Commissioner to define "otherwise qualified pharmacy."

The EO clarified the request is based on the Pharmacy Benefit Managers bill and the Insurance Commissioner has to come up with a definition to otherwise qualified pharmacy. The EO stated she does not think it is up to the Board to determine what an otherwise qualified pharmacy is for the purpose of this bill.

Mr. Lau stated to provide them the definition of pharmacy as stated in Chapter 461.

# Relating to Pharmacists – Requires pharmacists to complete a training program approved by the board of pharmacy to dispense veterinary prescriptions.

The Chair lead the discussion on proposed legislation Relating to Pharmacists that would require pharmacist to complete a training program approved by the Board of Pharmacy to dispense veterinary prescriptions.

The Chair stated he has concerns with the language of the bill. Veterinary prescriptions are not defined. Also, currently the Board is not qualified to develop a training program for pharmacist to dispense veterinary medications.

The EO asked the Committee if this bill is necessary.

Ms. Okamura stated the bill is unnecessary because most veterinary medications are dispensed by veterinarians. What they are not dispensing and having a pharmacy dispense are medications that they don't have.

The Chair stated it would severely limit the availability of medications to animals.
