Under HRS chapter 444, at least half of all individuals performing plumbing work employed on a construction job site by a plumbing contractor must be licensed in accordance with HRS chapter 448E. However, the Board felt he had the necessary experience and he possessed the PJ license for at least 18 months.

Mr. Lee reported on the following:

**H.B. No. 570** – This bill, which the Board supported, enhances penalties when an elderly person is targeted (maximum fine increased from \$10,000 to \$20,000). This bill was signed into law on April 23, 2014 and became Act 32.

**S.B. No. 2475** – The Board testified in support of this bill, which clarifies that a licensed contractor who aids and abets an unlicensed contractor may be subject to additional discipline by the Board. This bill was signed into law on April 23, 2014 and became Act 29.

6. Scope of Activity Committee:

Mr. Yamada asked for any testimony from the audience regarding the scope items on the agenda before making any determinations.

Dwayne Arelliano of the Glaziers Union/DC 50 testified on Eric Carson and Derek L.'s inquiries regarding whether the C-22 contractor may install solid phenolic exterior wall panels and exterior composite aluminum wall panels. He stated that the glaziers have been doing this type of work in town for a while now. He brought information, drawings and photos of different types of phenolic panels used for the projects. He also brought pictures of wrap around storefronts that screw into hat channels. Examples of current and future glazier projects with phenolic panels are the UH Manoa IT building, FBI building, National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA), Kapiolani Hospital, and Walgreens. Mr. Arelliano also stated that while a lot of the panels are tied into glass, not all of them are. Maintenance is low because they last a long time and has protective properties. Chairperson Lau stated that the Board looks at scope questions on a case-by-case basis. He

noted that the information submitted by Mr. Carson indicates that the phenolic skin is placed directly on the wall system and does not appear to be part of glazing fenestration. Chairperson Lau stated that blind clips are usually made of stainless steel and historically the Board had called this type of work as “cladding” or “siding”.

With regard to the inquiries submitted by Hawaii Works, Inc. and the Department of Education pertaining to whether a C-22 contractor’s license is required to install prefabricated windows for the custodial storage project at Ala Wai Elementary School, Mr. Arelliano stated that the C-22 licensee should install the prefabricated windows.

Mitchel Shimabukuro of the Painters Union/DC 50 testified that the C-33 Painting and decorating license is required for Coating Works Hawaii, Inc.’s scope inquiry on whether a C-62a Pole contractor classification includes the application of protective polyurethane, epoxy, or other similar materials for the purpose of protective coating/painting steel transmission poles.

At 12:16 p.m., it was moved by Mr. Yamada, seconded by Mr. Lee, and unanimously carried to consult with Rodney J. Tam, deputy attorney general, on questions and issues pertaining to the Board’s powers, duties, privileges, immunities, and liabilities pursuant to HRS section 92-5(a)(4).

At 1:26 p.m., it was moved by Mr. Lee, seconded by Mr. Yamada, and unanimously carried to move out of executive session and to reconvene to the Board’s regular order of business.

Mr. Yamada presented the following scope recommendations of the Board.

**Eric Carson** – Requests determination on whether a C-22 Glazing and tinting contractor may install solid phenolic exterior wall panels.

**Derek L.** – Requests determination on whether a C-22 Glazing and tinting contractor may install exterior composite aluminum wall panels and solid phenolic exterior wall panels.

Recommendation: The C-5 Cabinet, millwork, and carpentry remodeling and repairs, C-5b Siding, C-6 Carpentry framing contractor, or C-22 Glazing and tinting contractor (if the phenolic exterior wall panels are affiliated with the glass and glazing industry) may install the solid phenolic exterior wall panels and exterior composite aluminum wall panels.

**Hawaii Works Inc.** – Requests a determination on whether a C-22 contractor’s license is required to install prefabricated windows for the custodial storage project at Ala Wai Elementary School. Requirements and specifications for the project states that work includes: provide and install aluminum jalousie windows shown on drawings and as specified; anchors,

brackets, and attachments; and hardware. The contract amount is \$109,000 and the cost of the window work is \$1,000.

**Department of Education** – Requests a determination on whether a general contractor is required to have a C-22 license or list a subcontractor who has the C-22 to perform the window work on the custodial storage building at Ala Wai Elementary School.

The contractor does not have a C-22 license, nor did he list a subcontractor who has this license. The bid amount is \$109,100 and his breakout cost for the window work is \$2,200.00.

Recommendation: A C-22 Glazing and tinting, C-5 Cabinet, millwork, and carpentry remodeling and repairs, or “B” General Building contractor may install the prefabricated windows for the Ala Wai Elementary School project as stated above.

**Honolulu Builders, LLC** – Requests a determination on whether a C-5 Cabinet, millwork, and carpentry remodeling and repairs contractor may install Vetrazzo counter tops. Honolulu Builders, LLC is certified by Vetrazzo for fabrication; however, for this project the counter tops are being fabricated on the mainland and Honolulu Builders, LLC is providing the labor for the installation. Installation consists of gluing the prefabricated Vetrazzo pieces to wood, drywall or masonry substrate just like any other type of solid surface material like Corian.

Recommendation: A “B” General Building, C-5 Cabinet, millwork, and carpentry remodeling and repairs, C-51 Tile, or C-51a Cultured marble contractor may install Vetrazzo counter tops in the above scenario.

**Hawaii Energy Connection, LLC** – Requests a determination on the license required to install a solar hybrid hot water system. The solar hybrid hot water system contains PV panels, micro inverters, and a water heater.

Recommendation: The C-60 Solar power systems, C-13 Electrical, and C-37 Plumbing contractor licenses are required to install a solar hybrid hot water system as described above. In addition, for hot water piping systems with a heat input of more than 200,000 BTU/h, a C-4 Boiler, hot-water heating, hot water supply, and steam fitting contractor license is also required.

**County of Hawaii** – The County of Hawaii requests a determination on the licenses required to install an electronic scoreboard and the metal column supports and appurtenant work for the unit. Electronic scoreboards are typically mounted atop steel wide flange columns cast with reinforced concrete footings.

More specifically, the County of Hawaii asks the following questions:

1. Is a C-13 specialty contractor within its scope to install the electronic scoreboard?
2. Is a C-14 specialty contractor within its scope to install the electronic scoreboard if a C-13 contractor provides and connects the power?
3. Is a C-25 specialty contractor within its scope to install the electronic scoreboard if a C-13 contractor provides and connects the power?
4. Is a C-13 specialty contractor within its scope to erect the metal column supports and perform the work associated with their foundations: excavation, forming (if necessary), concrete placement and reinforcing steel installation?
5. Is a C-14 specialty contractor within its scope to erect the metal column supports and perform the work associated with their foundations: excavation, forming (if necessary), concrete placement and reinforcing steel installation?
6. Is a C-25 specialty contractor within its scope to erect the metal column supports and perform the work associated with their foundations: excavation, forming (if necessary), concrete placement and reinforcing steel installation?

The following question pertains to electronic scoreboards that can be attached to the metal column supports via brackets are either bolted or welded to said columns:

7. If welding is the preferred method of connecting the scoreboard mounting brackets to the columns, is the C-13 specialty contractor within its scope to perform such welding or would a C-48 Structural steel or C-56 Welding license be required?
8. If welding is the preferred method of connecting the scoreboard mounting brackets to the columns, is the C-14 specialty contractor within its scope to perform such welding or would a C-48 Structural steel or C-56 Welding contractor license be required?
9. If welding is the preferred method of connecting the scoreboard mounting brackets to the columns, is the C-25 specialty contractor within its scope to perform such welding or would a C-48 Structural steel or C-56 Welding license be required?

Recommendation: The Board made the following determinations in answer to the above specific questions:

1. Yes, it is within the scope of the C-13 Electrical contractor to install the electronic scoreboard.
2. Yes, it is within the scope of the C-14 Sign contractor to install the electronic scoreboard if a C-13 Electrical contractor provides and connects the power.
3. No, it is not within the scope of the C-25 Institutional and commercial equipment contractor to install the electronic scoreboard.
4. Yes, it is within the scope of the C-13 Electrical contractor to erect the metal column supports and perform the work associated with their

- foundations: excavation, forming (if necessary), concrete placement and reinforcing steel installation.
5. Yes, it is within the scope of the C-14 Sign contractor to erect the metal column supports and perform the work associated with their foundations: excavation, forming (if necessary), concrete placement and reinforcing steel installation, provided it is for sign support.
  6. No, it is not within the scope of the C-25 Institutional and commercial equipment contractor to erect the metal column supports and perform the above described work associated with their foundations: excavation, forming (if necessary), concrete placement and reinforcing steel installation.
  7. The C-13 Electrical contractor may perform welding required to connect the scoreboard mounting brackets to the columns; thus a C-48 Structural steel or C-56 Welding contractor would not be required.
  8. The C-14 Sign contractor may perform welding required to connect the scoreboard mounting brackets to the columns; thus a C-48 Structural steel or C-56 Welding contractor would not be required.
  9. The installation of electronic scoreboards is not within the scope of the C-25 Institutional and commercial equipment contractor.

**Coating Works Hawaii, Inc.** – Coating Works Hawaii, Inc. requests a determination on whether a C-62a Pole contractor classification includes the application of protective polyurethane, epoxy, or other similar materials for the purpose of protective coating/painting steel transmission poles.

Recommendation: A C-33 Painting and decorating contractor license is required to apply the protective polyurethane, epoxy, or other similar materials for the purpose of protective coating/painting steel transmission poles.

**NWP Services Corporation** – NWP Services Corporation requests a determination on which license classification is required to install a water sub meter in an apartment complex.

Recommendation: A C-37 Plumbing contractor license is required to install a submeter within five (5) feet of the building line, at an apartment complex.

**National Drilling Association** – The National Drilling Association is inquiring on whether contractor's licenses are required for drillers in the State of Hawaii, including geotechnical, environmental (including monitor well), and water well drilling.

Recommendation: A C-57 Well contractor license or a C-57b Injection well contractor license is required for water well drilling. A contractor's license is not required for scientific, geothermal or environmental drilling.

After discussion, it was moved by Mr. Lee, seconded by Mr. Akasaki, and unanimously carried to approve the above scope recommendations.
