As a condition, the Board indicated that the continuing education submitted with her reactivation would not be counted for the current biennium, and Dr. Emmerich will need to complete 20 hours of Hawaii approved continuing education by the end of the next biennium in order to renew in the next biennium as required by law.

<u>New Business</u>: A. <u>National Board of Chiropractic Examiners Ethics and</u> Boundaries Examination.

Dr. Pleiss informed members that he attended the National Board of Chiropractic Examiners' Part IV Test Committee Meeting on June 6 - 7, 2014.

Dr. Pleiss shared a power point presentation to the Board on the Ethics and Boundaries examination (E&B).

Dr. Pleiss informed members that Ethics and Boundaries Assessment Services, LLC (EBAS), was established in 2013 to address the post-licensure testing needs of regulated professions concerning ethical and/or boundary issues. He also informed members that EBAS provides regulatory/licensing agencies with a tool to assess a licensee's understanding of ethical and boundary issues as relevant to the professional workplace environment.

Dr. Pleiss indicated that EBAS is looking for interested individuals who are professionals with licensing/regulatory experience to become graders. He further indicated that EBAS requires graders to complete a comprehensive Grader Orientation Workshop and if interested to call Dr. Judi Gerstung at 970-775-3729.

Dr. Pleiss shared with the Board important features of the Ethics and Boundaries Assessment Services Essay Examination. He indicated that the examinees have a maximum of 60 minutes and receive five unique, randomized essay scenarios that includes Boundary Violations (Including Harrassment Concerns); Fraud (Including Advertising and Billing Issues); Professional Standards (Including Standards of Care, Workplace Standards, Risk Management, and Quality Assurance Issues); Office Protocols (Including Records and Documentation); and Unprofessional Conduct (Including Drug and Alcohol Abuse).

Dr. Pleiss also informed the Board that agencies and sanctioned licensees can easily access the EBAS website at <u>www.ebas.org</u>.

		Discussion followed. The Board discussed the E&B as another tool for licensure, however, rules would need to be promulgated to incorporate E&B as an exam requirement. DAG Jacob cautioned the Board as to how it will affect Regulated Industries Complaint Office and informed members that he will look into it more and will report back to the Board at a later meeting.
