2015 Legislative Session - Condominium Law

[Act 242](#) as it related to condominiums, amends the condominium law to void or prohibit some discriminatory practices in governing documents of a condominium against a person living in a condo who has a valid certificate for medical use of marijuana unless those governing documents prohibit the smoking of tobacco and if the medical marijuana is smoked. Act 242 applies to both chapters 514A and 514B condominiums. Please read the full act [here](#).
