APPROVING HAWAII ELECTRIC LIGHT COMPANY, INC.'S REQUEST FOR AUTHORIZATION TO READ METERS FOR CERTAIN

CUSTOMERS AFFECTED BY THE KILAUEA LAVA FLOWS ON AN OTHER-THAN-MONTHLY BASIS, WITH CONDITIONS

By this Order, the commission approves HAWAII ELECTRIC LIGHT COMPANY, INC.'s ("HELCO") request for authorization to read meters for certain customers affected by the Kilauea lava flows on an other-than-monthly basis, and instead provide estimated bills for those customers based on historical readings, pursuant to the commission's General Order No. 7, Standards for Electric Utility Service in the State of Hawaii ("G.O. 7"), Section 3.3 ("request for authorization"), subject to the conditions that:

Letter from Kevin Katsura, Hawaiian Electric Companies' Manager, Regulatory Non-Rate Proceedings, to the commission, "Hawaii Electric Light Company, Inc. Meter Reading for Customers Impacted by Kilauea, Notification to the Commission," filed on June 5, 2018 ("HELCO Letter"). HELCO states that the Kilauea lava flows are impacting "approximately 1736 customers, with 100 of these meters serving other than residential customers." Id.

(1) HELCO shall include "[a] distinct marking to identify [the] estimated bills," pursuant to G.O. 7, Section 4.3(f); (2) HELCO shall file a report with the commission by June 15, 2018, setting forth its methodology for estimating the affected customers' bills based on historical readings; and (3) HELCO shall file a report on the last day of every month regarding customer bill contests or complaints received, if any, as a result of HELCO's use of the estimated bills for the customers affected by the Kilauea lava flow ("affected customers"), for as long as HELCO is unable to read the affected customers' meters.

I.

#### Background

HELCO filed its Letter with the commission on June 5, 2018, requesting authorization to read meters for certain customers affected by the Kilauea lava flows on an other-than-monthly basis, and to instead base customers' bills on historical readings. HELCO stated that "[t]he Company is doing everything it can to maintain the service of those customers affected by the lava flows. In various locations, however, Company personnel are unable to safely read the meters of

the affected customers." HELCO requests authorization to use estimated bills for the affected customers pursuant to G.O. 7, Section 3.3, which states:

All meters, other than residential, shall be read monthly, except that authority may be obtained from the Commission for reading the meters at other than monthly intervals. Residential meters may be read bi-monthly. As nearly as practicable, utilities shall avoid sending a customer two successive estimated bills.

II.

#### Request for Authorization

The commission recognizes the dangerous situation on Hawaii Island as a result of the ongoing volcanic eruptions and lava flows, as well as HELCO's responsibility to protect its employees. As a result, the commission approves HELCO's request for authorization to read meters on an other-than-monthly basis, and use estimated bills for affected customers based on historical readings until such time that the meters can be safely read. In doing so, the commission imposes the conditions detailed below, so as to balance the safety of HELCO's employees with the needs of HELCO's customers during this time.

The commission, in support of its approval, specifically finds and concludes:

- 1. The ongoing volcanic eruptions and lava flows in areas of Puna on Hawaii Island have led HELCO to determine that in certain parts of this area of its service territory "Company personnel are unable to safely read the meters . . . . "
- 2. According to HELCO, this "impact[s] approximately 1736 customers . . . ."
- 3. G.O. 7, Section 3.3 allows "authority [to] be obtained from the Commission for reading the meters at other than monthly intervals . . . ."
- 4. As such, the commission grants HELCO's request for authorization.
- 5. As conditions of this approval, the commission requires that:
- A. HELCO shall include "[a] distinct marking to identify [the] estimated bills," for the affected customers, as required by G.O. 7, Section 4.3(f);4
- B. HELCO shall file a report with the commission by June 15, 2018, setting forth its methodology for estimating the affected customers' bills based on historical readings; and

C. HELCO shall file a report on the last day of every month regarding customer bill contests or complaints received, if any, as a result of HELCO's use of the estimated bills for the affected customers, for as long as HELCO is unable to read the affected customers' meters.

III.

#### Orders

#### THE COMMISSION ORDERS:

- 1. The commission approves HELCO's request for authorization to read meters for certain customers affected by the Kilauea lava flows on an other-than-monthly basis, and instead provide estimated bills for those customers based on historical readings, pursuant to the commission's G.O. 7, Section 3.3, subject to the following conditions:
- A. HELCO shall include "[a] distinct marking to identify [the] estimated bills," for the affected customers, as required by G.O. 7, Section 4.3(f);
- B. HELCO shall file a report with the commission by June 15, 2018, setting forth its methodology for estimating the affected customers' bills based on historical readings; and

C. HELCO shall file a report on the last day of every month regarding customer bill contests or complaints received, if any, as a result of HELCO's use of the estimated bills for the affected customers, for as long as HELCO is unable to read the affected customers' meters.
