



Sailing Schedule Update for the Islands of Moloka'i and Lāna'i

January 29, 2024

Dear Valued Customer,

Poor weather and ocean conditions continue to be forecasted this week. Young Brothers anticipates that the large, forecasted swells will impact our ability to safely enter the Port of Kaunakakai due to surge in the harbor. As a result, Young Brothers' Tuesday Molokai/Lanai sailing will load and depart from Honolulu, as normally scheduled but will bypass Lanai and sail directly to the Port of Kaunakakai in time for the regularly scheduled arrival. There will be no changes to cargo availability and gate hours for the Port of Kaunakakai

After discharging Moloka'i-bound cargo, the barge will then sail to the Port of Kaunakakai and attempt re-entry on Thursday, February 1, 2024, when the ocean conditions are forecasted to be less severe. If successful, Young Brothers will discharge the barge and extend gate hours until 3:30 p.m. for the pick up of all cargo. The port of Kaunakakai will accept Honolulu-bound cargo on Tuesday, January 30, 2024.

Young Brothers continues to monitor weather and ocean conditions for all scheduled sailings through the remainder of the week and may have to adjust sailings, cargo acceptance, and cargo delivery as forecasted weather and ocean conditions change.

In addition, we recommend that customers should take precautions to secure their cargo appropriately (i.e., using additional lashing and weatherproofing less than container load cargo). As a reminder, dry palletized cargo is shipped on open flat racks, on open-air barges and may get wet during transit, especially in severe ocean conditions.
