

Notice of Informational Meeting – the Maui Island Grid
STATE OF HAWAII PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION

The Public Utilities Commission (“PUC”) will host this hybrid informational meeting so that the Hawaiian Electric Companies (“Hawaiian Electric”) can provide an informational presentation to the local community to learn more about Hawaiian Electric’s current operations and future plans for Maui’s electric grid. The public is invited to provide public comments at this meeting.

Time: 5:00 p.m.

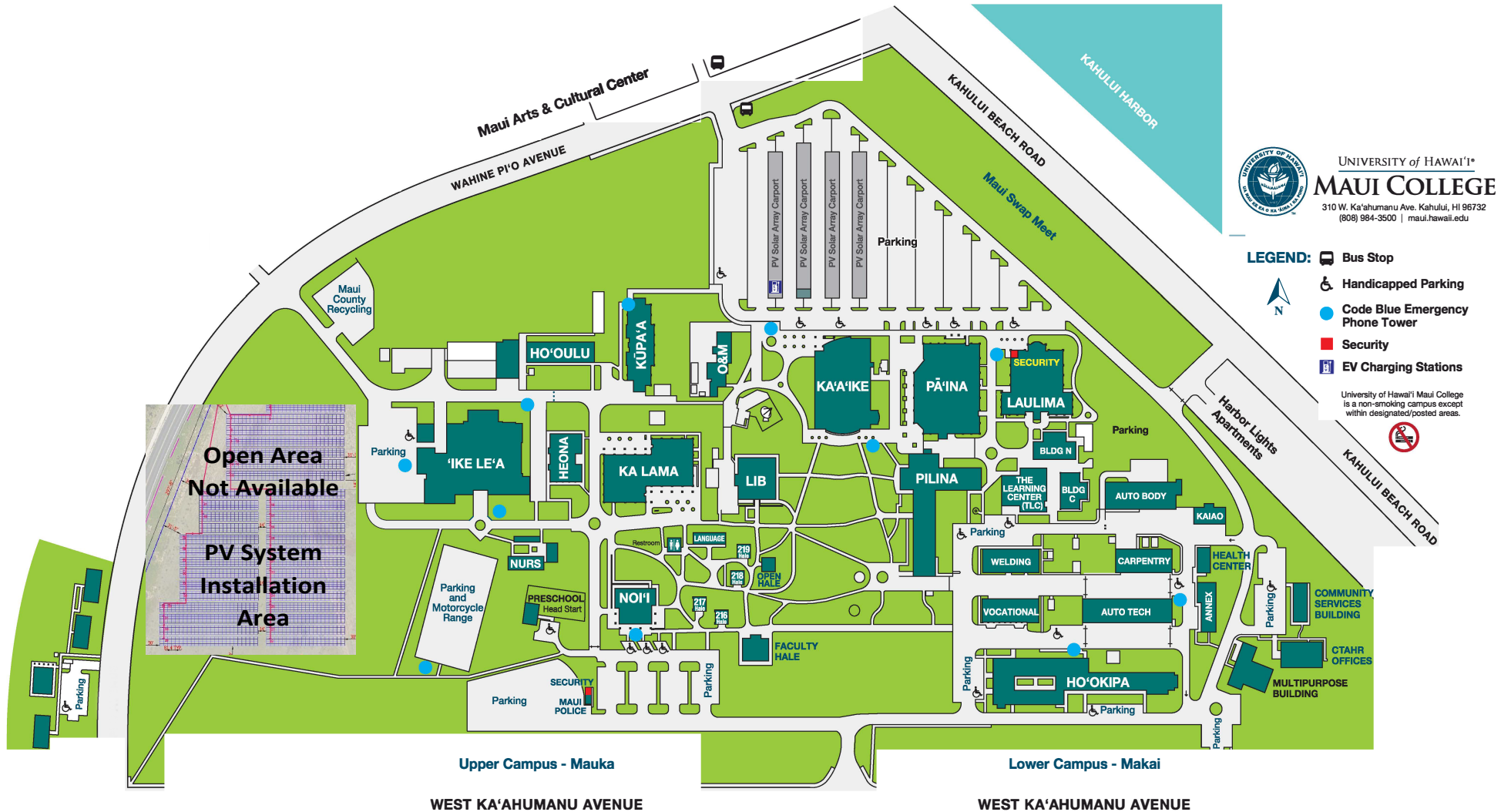
