Call to Order:	The Chair called the meeting to order at 8:31 a.m. at which time quorum was established and excused Ms. Boyer and Ms. Okawa from today's meeting.
<u>Chair's Report</u> :	Announcements/Introductions
	The Chair asked the audience to introduce themselves.

Approval of the Previous Minutes – July 11, 2017

The Chair called for a motion in regards to the minutes of the July 11, 2017 meeting.

There being no corrections, upon a motion by the Vice Chair, seconded by Mr. Duldulao, it was voted on and unanimously carried to approve the minutes of the July 11, 2017 meeting as circulated.

Executive Officer's Conferences/Seminars/Meetings

Report:

2017 Tri-Regulator Symposium, July 25-26, 2017, Chicago, Illinois The EO provided a written report to the Board and gave a brief oral report. She reported that the "Tri-Regulators" include the Federation of State Medical Boards (FSMB), the National Association of Boards of Pharmacy (NABP) and the National Council of State Boards of Nursing (NCSBN). This was the third symposium of the Tri-Regulators, who have formed a collaboration in order to advance dialogue and consensus building on issues of state-based licensure and regulation that benefit public health, safety and welfare.

2017 NCSBN Annual Meeting, August 16-18, 2017, Chicago, Illinois The EO reported that the Chair, Vice Chair, Ms. Kodama, Ms. Napoleon, Ms. Daub and Ms. Kim will be attending.

2017 NCSBN NCLEX Conference, September 25, 2017, Chicago, Illinois The EO reported that Ms. Boyer will be attending instead of Ms. Daub.

The Vice Chair stated regarding Conferences/Seminars/Meetings, he is interested in attending the 2017 NCSBN Leadership & Public Policy Conference.

2017 Legislature

The EO reported on the status of the following:

Act 153 Relating to Workers' Compensation Physician

Act 153, which amends the definition of "Physician" in HRS Chapter 386 (Worker's Compensation Law) to include APRNs, was signed into law on July 10, 2017, effective upon approval.

Amendments to Title 16, Chapter 89 – Status Report

The EO reported that the DAG has completed her thorough review, and that she will now check the DAG's recommendations and send any non-substantive changes to office services.

Amendments include, but is not limited to the following:

- Placing a limit (3) as to how many times a candidate may sit for the NCLEX before being required to take a remedial course;
- Allows the Board to require all nurse applicants to obtain an additional background check, including a self-query report from the National Practitioner Data Bank;
- Includes failure to report oneself or the director of nursing, nursing supervisor, peer or colleague, any disciplinary action, termination or resignation of a nurse before conclusion of any disciplinary proceeding as "unprofessional conduct";
- Amends APRN "recognition" to APRN "license"; and
- Allows the Board to conduct a random audit of the renewal of APRNs with prescriptive authority compliance with the continuing education requirement.

Criminal Background Checks – Board Delegation

The EO stated because we now require Criminal Background Checks (CBC), the Licensing Branch has been receiving applications where the applicant answers "no" to the conviction question, however when the CBC report comes in, it is showing a hit, but it may be that the offense was dismissed or nolle prossed. However, it still appears on their record because it has not been annulled or expunged. The applicant is then sent a notice asking them to explain why they answered "no" to the question, explain the circumstances that led to the charge or charges, and provide any court documentation. Once that is received, the EO will bring the application to the Board for review because the applicant answered "no". If the applicant answers "yes", then we will follow the Policy on Applications with Prior Convictions - Board Delegation guidelines as updated.

Upon a motion by the Chair, seconded by Ms. Kodama, it was voted on and unanimously carried to delegate to the EO authority to process applications with certain offenses pursuant to the document entitled Policy on Applications with Prior Convictions as updated, except for those applicants who failed to answer "yes" to the question pertaining to prior convictions that have not been annulled or expunged.

Temporary Nurse Permit – Report on Change of Procedures

The EO reported there has been some changes in procedure. We no longer issue temporary's over the counter. There must be at least one current license, however they will have to provide verification of all licenses ever held. If all requirements are met, the temporary will be faxed directly to the employer within 3 days. The application was updated in July 2017 and there is now a \$50 fee for a temporary.

Currently the temporary remains tied to the endorsement application so the EO still needs to discuss with the DAG regarding temporary's for GEPN or MEPN students.

The Board was provided with copies of the 7/14/17 and 7/21/17 Legislative updates from NCSBN. Below are highlights of what NCSBN is tracking:

- ✓ DE H 201 clarifies that after a physician-patient relationship has been established, treatment may be conducted as the doctor and patient deem appropriate;
- NH S 137 requires the board of nursing to grant a 120-day temporary license to eligible applicants who are current or former residents of Vermont, Massachusetts, and Connecticut;
- HI H 912 allows APRNs to offer community health services similar to those provided by physicians;
- RI S 863 requires health care facilities to report to the Department of Health on the use of non-Rhode Island nurses;
- ✓ HI S 513 allows pharmacists to prescribe and dispense contraceptives;
- NY A 8598 revised qualifying conditions for medical marijuana use to give additional discretion to the authorizing practitioner and changes definition of "practitioner" from a physician to any practitioner authorized to prescribe a controlled substance;
- ✓ NY A 8547 allows current RNs and LPNs to provide volunteer emergency medical services for ambulance and advanced life support response services alongside EMTs;
- NC H 550 adopts the eNLC, making North Carolina the 26th state to adopt the eNLC;
- ✓ DE S 63 removes an obsolete definition for APRN and makes changes to collaborative agreement requirements;
- MA H 3818 creates the cannabis control commission to regulate the sale and use of medical marijuana and authorizes physicians, physician assistants, and CNPs to issue certifications for medical marijuana to qualifying patients;
- TX H 189a makes changes to the frequency and location of meetings required by a prescriptive authority agreement;
- US S 1554 requires certain practitioners authorized to prescribe controlled substances to complete continuing education; and

> TX S 79a changes definitions of qualifying patients and medical practitioners authorized to recommend medical marijuana use.

<u>Hawaii State</u> <u>Center for Nursing</u>: Ms. Reichhardt reported that this past renewal period that ended 6/30/2017, there were 3,000 more responses to the survey than in 2015. One interesting thing is of the responses, there was a decrease in the number of nurses who say they are working LPNs. They are targeting this November to get the workforce report out.

<u>Applications</u>: The Board moved into Executive Session.
