- Call to Order: There being a quorum present, the meeting was called to order at 10:55 a.m. by Chairperson Galas.

- Executive Session: At 10:57 a.m., it was moved by Mr. Chang, seconded by Mr. Denis, and unanimously carried to move into executive session pursuant to HRS §92-5 to consider and evaluate personal information relating to individuals applying for professional or vocational licenses cited in section HRS §26-9 or both, and to consult with the board's attorney on questions and issues pertaining to the board's powers, duties, privileges, immunities, and liabilities, as provided in HRS §92-5(a)(1) and (4).

(i) James R. Kendrick Jr. (Sole)

It was moved by Mr. Denis, seconded by Mr. Chang, and unanimously carried to approve Mr. Kendrick's application for a guard license. Ms. Tamanaha explained to Mr. Kendrick that he applied as a sole proprietor. If he intends to be an additional principal for API, he must change his status from sole proprietor to principal guard for API by filing a status change application (form PDG-23).

Chairperson Galas thanked Mr. Chang and the Board for their earnest effort in checking and reviewing all the applicant's criminal histories and documentation to determine registration requirements.

e. Guard Employee Ratification

It was moved by Chief Perry, seconded by Mr. Chang, and unanimously carried to ratify the approval of the guard employees assigned registration numbers GDE-18050 to GDE-18345 (see attached list).

Scope:

a. Letter from Lacey Rutter, HireRight, LLC

HireRight is a consumer reporting agency regulated under the federal Fair Credit Reporting Act and applicable state laws. They are contracted by businesses to conduct employment-related screening of their job candidates and/or existing employees. They do not have an office or any employees physically located in the State of Hawaii and does not conduct in-person investigations in Hawaii. The employment screening services provided by HireRight consist largely of public

records searches and telephone inquiries designed to confirm educational and employment histories, and in some instances, a reference check may be performed telephonically by HireRight personnel utilizing information that was provided by the prospective employee with consent authorizing HireRight to undertake such public searches and verification/reference checks.

Ms. Rutter inquired whether a private detective license would be required for HireRight to operate remotely in Hawaii.

After discussion, it was moved by Mr. Denis, seconded by Chief Faaumu, and unanimously carried that HireRight, LLC is not required to obtain a private detective license based solely upon the description of the services they provide. However, if HireRight performs any other type of activity that falls within the definition of "detective" or "private detective" in the Board's laws or rules, a private detective license may be required.

Legislation:

a. S.B. 1264, S.D.1, H.D.2 – Relating to Security Guards

After the House came out with their amendments in HD2, the Senate did not agree with changes that were made, thus a conference committee meeting was held. The Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs ("Department") submitted comments and a proposal to the measure which was adopted by the conference committee and passed out as a CD1.

The Department, with comments from the Board:

- Supports changing the biennial renewal period to a triennial one only for security guard registrants and leaving the license cycle for the other licensees within the Board's jurisdiction on a biennial renewal. In addition, the HD2 amendments to section 463-10.5(c)(2), HRS, that would've changed the biennial renewal to a triennial renewal also provided for a one-time exemption to be provided to registrants who were issued a new registration within one year of the renewal date. The Board supports this change with an amendment that the triennial renewal become effective June 30, 2018, which will allow registered guards an additional year to obtain their continuing education ("CE") hours and be less burdensome.
- Supports the SD1 version for section 463-10.5(a), HRS, which does not revise the current standard, whereas the HD2 proposed to amend it by allowing guard employees to meet the registration, instruction, and training requirements "from the first day of employment".

- Supports the amendment in section 463-10.5(a)(2), HRS, with a slight revision to allow guard registration applicants to satisfy the high school education requirement by self-attesting that they "possess" and not "have proof" of a high school education or its equivalent.
- Supports the SD1 version for amending section 463-10.5(a)(4), HRS, which does not change the timing of the criminal history record checks, whereas the HD2 version proposed to amend the section by requiring a guard registration applicant to obtain a State and federal criminal history record checks "before the first day of employment". The Board also recommended adding language to clarify a criminal history record check from the Hawaii Criminal Justice Data Center, under Chapter 846.
- Supports eight classroom instruction hours for initial registration and prefers four hours of CE on a triennial renewal that is mandated by statute rather than through the Board's rules. The HD2 proposed to amend section 463-10.5(c), HRS, by replacing the requirement of up to eight hours of instruction every triennial renewal period, whereas the SD1 would've amended the requirement of four hours of CE every other biennial renewal period.

The Department and Board also support amending this section to specify the definition of "classroom instruction" which would include teleconferencing for both the eight-hour initial registration and the four-hour CE.

b. G.M. 672 – Kenneth Chang; for a term to expire on June 30, 2021

Mr. Chang was reappointed to a second term that will expire on June 30, 2021. Chairperson Galas thanked Mr. Chang for his dedicated service as the private detective member on the Board.

c. G.M. 673 – Douglas Inouye; for a term to expire on June 30, 2020

Mr. Inouye was appointed to fulfill the public member vacancy on the Board with a term to expire on June 30, 2020. Mr. Inouye was previously a member of this Board when his term expired on June 30, 2016.
