Agenda: The agenda for this meeting was filed with the Office of the Lieutenant Governor as required by Hawaii Revised Statutes ("HRS") section 92-7.

Call to Order: There being a quorum present, the meeting was called to order at 11:00 a.m. by Chairperson Galas.

Approval of the Board Minutes: It was moved by Chief Faaumu, seconded by Chief Perry, and unanimously carried to approve the Applications Review Committee minutes and the Board and Executive Session minutes of the May 4, 2017 meeting.

Chapter 91, HRS, Adjudicatory Matters: At 11:01 a.m., Chairperson Galas recessed the Board's meeting to discuss the following adjudicatory matters pursuant to Chapter 91, HRS:

- a. In the Matter of the Guard Employee License of JIM S. PUAKELA, Respondent, PDG 2016-61-L

It was moved by Mr. Inouye, seconded by Vice Chair Denis, and unanimously carried to approve the above settlement agreement.

Mr. Buchanan is currently employed at the HPD and is not licensed or has applied for a guard, guard employee or private detective license. With his training from HPD, he is qualified to be an instructor; however, the Executive Officer asked the Board if there would be a conflict pursuant to section 16-97-8, HAR.

As guard instructors are not acting in a guard capacity, nor are they issued a license or registration and since the instructors are merely approved by the Board, it was moved by Vice Chair Denis, seconded by Mr. Chang, and unanimously carried to approve Mr. Buchanan as a guard instructor and that allowing a currently employed law enforcement officer to be a guard instructor is not a conflict of interest pursuant to section 16-97-8, HAR, and hence current law enforcement officers may be approved by the Board to be guard instructors.

The Board discussed whether a new 8-hour initial training course should be retaken for someone who is reapplying after their license has forfeited or whether the training that they've already taken for initial registration would still be acceptable.

The Executive Officer requested guidance by the Board in addressing applicants who failed to renew on or before June 30, 2016 and then failed to restore before June 30, 2017 and who are then required to reapply as a new applicant. As such, these applicants are made to be fingerprinted for a new criminal history record check and must submit the 8-hour initial training certificate. The guidance required is whether these applicants must re-take the initial 8-hour course or will they be allowed to submit the same certificate submitted for their initial registration.

The Board discussed the fact that since the initial 8-hour training curriculum has not changed since it was first offered, the previous courses the above licensees took would still be acceptable. Should the curriculum change, the applicant should be made to retake the course.

It was moved by Mr. Chang, seconded by Vice Chair Denis, and unanimously carried to approve the above guard employee applications whose licenses were forfeited and to accept the 8-hour training certificate submitted with their application for initial registration.

g. Guard Employee Ratification

It was moved by Chief Faaumu, seconded by Mr. Inouye, and unanimously carried to ratify the approval of the guard employees assigned registration numbers GDE-18346 to GDE-18794 (see attached list).

New Business:

a. Private Security Guards Carrying Firearms with Law Enforcement Officers Safety Act ("LEOSA") Certification, but Without County Police Authorization

Currently in section 16-97-17, Hawaii Administrative Rules, it states that "Private detectives or guards shall not carry firearms, blackjacks, batons, night sticks, chemical sprays, stun devices, or other weapons unless specifically authorized in writing by the appropriate state agency or chief of police in the county or counties in which the private detective or guard is doing business."

Chief Faaumu stated that should a licensee receive authorization by the appropriate Chief of Police in the county they are doing business in, they must be wearing a uniform when carrying their weapon. They cannot be in plain clothing.

Mr. Alvarado, a guard licensee, appeared before the Board and discussed his experience in trying to obtain authorization to carry a concealed weapon ("CCW"). As a former marine with no law enforcement training, he has had experience with fire arms. He applied for a CCW permit in Maui in 2011 explaining his need was based upon the dangerous situations where he and/or his employees have come across, but his request was denied as he needed to provide documentation of his qualification/training. He flew to Nevada to obtain his training as it was very difficult to find anyone in Hawaii who could train him at that time. Since then, he has received CCW permits for Nevada, Florida, and Texas, but not for Maui.

He would like to expand to do armored car service type of work, which would include receiving approval from each county Chief of Police; however, he requested guidance from the Board so that he can do things legally.

Vice Chair Denis thanked Mr. Alvarado for flying in from Maui to appear before the Board and expressed his understanding of the situation; however, indicating that the Board has no jurisdiction with regards to the matter of being able to carry a weapon and he will need to contact the county Chiefs of Police.

Implementation:

a. Continued Competency 4-Hour Curriculum for Renewal

The continuing education ("CE") curriculum for the next renewal period was approved at the February 16, 2017 Board meeting, but did not include a breakdown of the minimum time allotments for each topic. It was omitted in error.

The website will be updated to portray the Board's approved 4-hour CE curriculum and the minimum time allotments for each topic (see attached).

With regards to the impending change of license renewals for guard employees changing from a biennial to triennial cycle upon enactment of S.B. 1264, Mr. Owen inquired whether CE course providers can start to offer courses now, or would they have to wait until after the June 30, 2018 renewal as language in S.B. 1264 specifically state that four hours of instruction are to be completed during the triennial registration renewal period.

As Mr. Owen's inquiry was not an agenda item, this issue will be placed for further discussion at the next meeting. Mr. Owen was thanked for his concern and for bringing this matter to the Board's attention.
