with the board's attorney on questions and issues pertaining to the
board's powers, duties, privileges, immunities, and liabilities, as provided
in HRS § 92-5(a)(1) and (4).

At 3:02 p.m., it was moved by Mr. Nakamine, seconded by Mr. Tsunemoto, and unanimously carried for the Board to move out of Executive Session.

c. Examination

• Christopher Webster

Before discussion began, Mr. Webster disclosed that Board members Tsunemoto and Paahaha-Garcia are his co-employees. However, he felt that they could be fair and impartial in reviewing and deciding on his application for examination and licensure. The two Board members also felt that they could be fair and impartial in their review.

Mr. Webster was of the opinion that he only needed to have two years of experience under the supervision of a licensed elevator mechanic in order to be eligible to take the examination. However, the Board explained that the licensing law now requires four years under the supervision of a licensed elevator mechanic in order to take the examination.

After due consideration of Mr. Webster's application for examination and licensure and supporting documents, it was moved by Mr. Nakamine, seconded by Ms. Paahana-Garcia and unanimously carried to deny Mr. Webster's application for examination and licensure, basing its decision on the following grounds in the Hawaii Revised Statutes ("HRS") and Hawaii Administrative Rules ("HAR"), which find support in the records and files of his application:

HRS 448H-1: "Apprentice elevator mechanic" means any person who is in training to acquire the skill to become an elevator mechanic and who is required to work for at least four years under the supervision of an Page 3 Elevator Mechanics Licensing Board Minutes of the July 1, 2016 Meeting

elevator mechanic duly licensed under section 448H-6;

- HRS 448H-6: Qualifications for license. No person shall be licensed as an elevator mechanic unless the person has satisfactorily passed the examination administered by the board, and satisfactorily completed at least four years of training under the supervision of a licensed elevator mechanic; and
- HAR 16-81-5(d): An apprentice elevator mechanic shall complete a minimum of two years of work experience before applying for the elevator mechanic's examination and license. The starting date of the two-year experience requirement shall be the recorded date of registration as an apprentice elevator mechanic with the board.

In reviewing his application and supporting documents, the Board noted the date of his apprentice elevator mechanic registration as February 28, 2014, which is less than the four years required by Statute. As a result, the Board denied his application.

It was determined that a license is not required, pursuant to Hawaii Administrative Rules section 16-81-4, if the work does not penetrate the interior cab shell or adversely affect the operation or safety of the elevator.
