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Executive Officer's Report:

a. Record of Candidates Examined: For the Examination for Professional Practice in Psychology (EPPP)

Executive Officer Ferrer reported that during the period of June 4, 2017 through July 1, 2017, there were five (5) candidates who took the EPPP exam of which three (3) passed and two (2) failed.

b. <u>Annual Disclosure of Financial Interests with the Hawaii State</u>
<u>Ethics Commission – Separate Filing Requirement</u>

Executive Officer Ferrer reminded the Board members of their responsibility to file their annual disclosure of financial interests. She emphasized that this requirement is separate from other disclosures that may be required of individuals who hold certain other state positions. She noted that any questions about filing requirements should be directed to the ethics commission.

c. Statistics on Hawaii Licensed Psychologists

EO Ferrer informed the members that as of July 20, 2017 there were 1,103 active psychologists in Hawaii and 108 are inactive. Currently, there are two industrial-organizational psychologists in the state.

b. <u>Association of State and Provincial Psychology Boards ("ASPPB")</u>
 <u>2017 Meeting, October 18 – 22, 2017, Waikoloa, Hawaii –</u>
 Selection of Delegate

EO Ferrer informed the Board that the ASPPB will waive the registration fee for one voting delegate from each jurisdiction. All members present declined the fee waiver and suggested that the offer be made to Mr. Oliphant.

Open Forum: a. (Public comment on issues not on the agenda, for consideration for Board's agenda at a subsequent meeting.)

Dr. Jeffrey Akaka addressed the Board on the topic of prescriptive authority for certain psychologists. He raised concerns about the adequacy of psychopharmacology training for psychologists and the potential impact on consumer safety. He expressed concern that a board, whose purpose is to protect the public against psychologists practicing within their scope of practice would testify in support of a bill that would essentially, add the scope of an entirely different profession to the current scope for psychologists.

DAG Moriarty suggested to Dr. Akaka that he forward any written remarks to the executive officer to avoid the possibility of mischaracterizing the information in the meeting minutes.

Executive Officer Ferrer said that to allow fairness to individuals who might want to attend a Board meeting at which certain matters will be discussed; the Board may consider issues raised at an open forum and include those items on the agenda for a future meeting.

Dr. Akaka noted that a bill which addressed collaborative care went through legislation, but died in conference. He further indicated that if some of the costs related to patient care could be paid by Medicaid, it would help resolve some problems with access to care.

Dr. Akaka indicated that he would e-mail his concerns to the EO.
