Call to Order: There being a quorum present, Vice Chairperson Akamu called the

meeting to order at 10:44 a.m.

the Minutes: It was moved by Mr. Kaneshiro, seconded by Mr. Kaya and unanimously

carried to approve the minutes of the April 15, 2014 Board meeting.

Executive Officer's

Report Executive Officer Rutkowski reported that online renewals are now

available until June 30, 2014.

Chairperson Kimura joined the meeting at 10:53 a.m.

Executive Officer Tamanaha informed everyone that this was the last meeting for Chairperson Kimura and Mr. Kaneshiro and thanked them for their eight (8) years of volunteer service and dedication to the Board.

Examinations: No results.

Scope a. Electrical Contractors Association of Hawaii NECA Hawaii

Chapter letter requesting clarification of the work that may be performed by a journey worker specialty electrician (EJS) on the installation of electrical conduits or electrical raceways for the systems listed in their scope of work. (Deferred from the April 15,

2014 meeting.)

Executive Officer Tamanaha stated that the electrician and plumber laws and rules do not specifically address electrical

conduits in low voltage work or work performed by journey worker specialty electricians. However, the contractor's laws and rules state that only a C-15 contractor can do conduit work.

Vice chairperson Akamu added that it is standard practice that conduits are installed by journey worker electricians, and journey worker specialty electricians install the wires and do the terminating. He also believed that journey worker specialty electrician employees of a C-13 contractor are able to install conduits, and employees of a C-15 contractor cannot install conduits. Also, a trainee meeting the one-to-one ratio can install conduits.

DAG Tam stated that the Board should only focus on HRS chapter 448 in answering the question. The Board should not consider the contractor's law because the Board does not have jurisdiction over that law.

Executive Session:

It was moved by Mr. Brady, seconded by Mr. Kaneshiro, and unanimously carried to enter into executive session pursuant to HRS sections 92-4 and 92-5, to consult with the Board's attorney on questions and issues pertaining to the Board's powers, duties, privileges, immunities and liabilities at 11:08 a.m.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

It was moved by Mr. Brady, seconded by Mr. Kaneshiro, and unanimously carried to reconvene to the Board's regular order of business at 11:34 a.m.

It was moved by Chairperson Kimura, seconded by Mr. Kaya, and unanimously carried that a journey worker specialty electrician (EJS) can install electrical conduits or electrical raceways within their scope of practice based on the definition of a "journey worker specialty electrician" in HRS chapter 448E.

The Board asked DAG Tam to further explain this decision. DAG Tam said that the definitions of "journey worker electrician", "journey worker industrial electrician", "journey worker specialty electrician", and "maintenance electrician" authorize these licensees to, among other things, perform "electrical work". HAR section 16-80-3 defines "electrical work" as "electrical wiring". That section then defines "electrical wiring" as "any electrical conductor, material, device, fitting apparatus, appliance, fixture, or equipment", and that electrical conduits and raceways seem to fall within this terminology. The Board members all concurred. Thus, it appears that each of the licensing categories above, including journey worker specialty electricians, can install conduits and raceways within their respective scopes of practice.

Chairperson Kimura announced he was taking the agenda out of order to address New Business.

New Business: a. <u>HAR Title 16 Chapter 80, "Electrical Work" as pertains to Photovoltaic installations.</u>

Executive Officer Rutkowski informed the Board that no additional rule amendment suggestions on solar PV systems have been received as of the last meeting.

Mr. Cahill wanted asked for an explanation of the rule amendment process. Executive Officer Rutkowski stated that the rule amendment process is a formal process that is governed by State law. The process involves the review and input by other government agencies such as the Department of the Attorney General, Legislative Reference Bureau, Small Business Regulatory Review Board, and the Governor's Office. The process culminates in a public hearing. During the process, the Board considers the comments and input from the public. The Board encourages the public to submit their recommendations and suggested language for consideration.

Mr. Yoshimura added that he will try to get more comments. He stated that the solar industry is interested in participating in the process. DAG Tam added that the Board's April 15, 2014 interpretation on solar photovoltaic systems should be used as the starting point to provide comments.

Ms. Alivado suggested that the agenda item should be listed as "Proposed Rule Revisions" for those individuals who would want to attend the meeting specifically for that item. DAG Tam suggested that the Board may want to name it "Solar Photovoltaic Systems Rule Amendments". The Board members concurred with this.

Chairperson Kimura announced he was resuming the order of the agenda.
