Call to Order: There being a quorum present, Vice Chairperson Akasaki called the meeting to order at 8:35 a.m.

The agenda was taken out of order and continued with "Chapter 91, HRS, Adjudicatory Matters".

Chapter 91, HRS, Adjudicatory Matters:

Vice Chairperson Akasaki called for a recess from the Board's meeting at 8:36 a.m. to discuss and deliberate on the following adjudicatory matters pursuant to HRS chapter 91.

1. Settlement Agreements

b. In the Matter of the Contractor's License of Cesar Franco; CLB 2008-551-L

RICO alleges that Cesar Franco ("Respondent") acted outside the scope of his license when he referred an unlicensed plumber to work on a plumbing job, participated in the bidding for the plumbing job, and received money for the plumbing job.

Respondent does not admit to violating any law or rule, but agrees to pay a fine in the amount of \$1,000.00 in two \$500.00 increments.

After discussion, it was moved by Mr. Matsuzaki, seconded by Mr. Mochida, and unanimously carried to approve the Settlement Agreement Prior to Filing of Petition for Disciplinary Action and Board's Final Order in the above case.

c. In the Matter of the Contractors Licenses of Ponita K. Kaufusi, dba North Shore Contractors; CLB 2011-396-L

RICO received a complaint alleging that Ponita K. Kaufusi dba North Shore Contractors ("Respondent") entered into a contract to build a six-foot rock wall and fence. Contract specifications were not followed and Respondent failed to include the requisite bond and lien rights and homeowner contract disclosures, amongst other things in the subject contract.

Respondent does not admit to violating any law or rule, but agrees to the voluntary surrender of his license, which shall become effective immediately upon the approval of this Settlement Agreement. Respondent shall not apply for a new license until the expiration of at least five years from the effective date of the surrender of his license.

After discussion, it was moved by Mr. Matsuzaki, seconded by Mr. Polischeck, Jr., and unanimously carried to approve the above Settlement Agreement Prior to Filing of Petition for Disciplinary Action and Board's Final Order in the above case.

a. In the Matter of the Contractor's License of Robert A. Ancheta, dba Rob Landscape and Trees; CLB 2010-241-L – Requests Reconsideration of Noncompliance with Board's Final Order

A Board's Final Order ("BFO") for this case was approved by the Board on October 18, 2013 in which Mr. Ancheta was ordered to pay an administrative fine, pay restitution to the complainant, and satisfy three judgments that were filed in 2011. It was also specified in the BFO that if he fails to pay the fine, restitution, and satisfy the

judgments within the time specified (six months), then his license will be automatically suspended.

The Board received an April 25, 2014 affidavit from RICO attesting to Mr. Ancheta's noncompliance with the BFO. At a previous meeting, the Board agreed to give Mr. Ancheta a chance to appear before the Board and contest the contents of RICO's affidavit and/or demonstrate that he is in compliance with the BFO.

Mr. Ancheta stated that the complainant did not want him to fix the problems or finish the project.

Executive Officer Ito related that Mr. Ancheta disclosed that he did receive the Hearings Officer's Finding of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Recommended Order dated August 27, 2013; Board's Final Order dated October 18, 2013; and Declaration of Noncompliance with Board's Final Order Filed on October 21, 2013 dated April 25, 2014. On July 11, 2014, the Board mailed these documents to Mr. Ancheta. Thus, the purpose of his appearance today is to address whether he will be able to make payments as required in the BFO.

The Board asked Mr. Ancheta why he did not comply with the BFO.

Mr. Ancheta stated that he did not have a lot of jobs and sometimes used the money to pay for the materials.

Vice Chairperson Akasaki informed Mr. Ancheta that he did not demonstrate that he was going to comply with the BFO; thus, his license will be automatically suspended in accordance with the BFO.

It was moved by Mr. Akasaki, seconded by Mr. Lee, and unanimously carried to suspend Mr. Ancheta's license effective July 25, 2014 for five years, and require him to pay the fine, restitution amount, and three judgments before reapplying for a contractor's license.

**Lipps & Son, Ltd.** – Lipps and Son, Ltd. requests a determination on whether a “B” General Building contractor may install suspended ceilings in commercial projects. Mr. Lipps related that a potential client was informed by a building inspector in Kona that a C-12 Drywall contractor is not licensed to install suspended ceilings.

Mr. Lipps is also requesting that the Board consider the following:

- Removing suspended ceilings from the C-1 Acoustical and insulation classification and/or including it in the C-12 Drywall classification; and/or
- Approving a C-1 contractor license for himself (RME) and his company without the usual requirements associated with obtaining a license based upon his 33 years of experience.

Recommendation: The C-1 Acoustical and insulation contractor license is required to install suspended ceilings. The Board is considering amending its administrative rules to add suspended acoustical ceiling systems to the C-12 Drywall classification.

**University of Hawaii (“UH”)** – The UH is inquiring whether the Board’s prior determination on January 13, 2013 that an “A” General Engineering, C-17 Excavating, grading and trenching, or C-68HD Horizontal drilling and micro tunneling classification is required to perform micro tunneling to insert smaller (30 to 48-inch) sewer lines for the City and County’s Kaneohe-Kailua Sewer Tunnel project applies to the horizontal directional drilling and micro tunneling work required for the UH’s project for drilling under Kaneohe Bay to Coconut Island for the installation of pipe for sewer, water, electrical, and telecommunication purposes.

The UH is also inquiring whether a general contractor can perform the work required for this project under Technical Specifications Section 02442 – Horizontal Directional Drilling, Section 02510 - High Density Polyethylene (“HDPE”) Pipe, and Section 02600 – Polyvinyl Chloride (“PVC”) Pipe for Horizontal Directional Drilling (“HDD”) with an “A” General Engineering license and a C-17 Excavating, grading and trenching specialty license which it holds automatically by virtue of its “A” license and without holding a C-68HD specialty license and/or without utilizing the services of a subcontractor who holds a C-68HD specialty license.

Robert Takamatsu, attorney representing Goodfellow Bros., Inc., and Matthew Heahlke, Oahu Regional Manager of Goodfellow Bros., Inc., were present to provide testimony.

Mr. Takamatsu stated that they believe Goodfellow Bros. Inc. has the proper “A” General Engineering license to do this work and the C-17 Excavating, grading and trenching automatically comes with the “A”. They had provided written testimony with the Board’s January 18, 2013 meeting minutes which determined the “A”, C-17, or C-68HD license classifications could perform certain trenchless excavation work in the Kaneohe-Kailua Sewer Tunnel project, which is a similar project to this one.

The Board related that its scope determinations are based upon information provided by the inquirer; however, the project owner (in this case UH) has the right to request any proper specialty classification or classifications for the project.

Recommendation:

- (1) Would the Board’s prior determination on January 13, 2013 that an “A” General Engineering, C-17 Excavating, grading and trenching, or C-68HD Horizontal drilling and micro tunneling classification is required to perform micro tunneling to insert smaller (30 to 48-inch) sewer lines for the City and County’s Kaneohe-Kailua Sewer Tunnel project apply to the horizontal directional drilling and micro tunneling work required for the University of Hawaii’s project for drilling under

Kaneohe Bay to Coconut Island for the installation of pipe for sewer, water, electrical, and telecommunication purposes?

Response: Yes.

- (2) Can a general contractor perform the work required for this University project under Technical Specifications Section 02442 – Horizontal Directional Drilling, Section 02510 – High Density Polyethylene (HDPE) Pipe, and Section 02600 – Polyvinyl Chloride (PVC) Pipe for Horizontal Directional Drilling (HDD) with an “A” General Engineering license and a C-17 Excavating, grading and trenching specialty license which it holds automatically by virtue of its “A” license and without holding a C-68HD specialty license and/or without utilizing the services of a subcontractor who holds a C-68HD specialty license?

Response: Either an “A” General Engineering, C-17 Excavating, grading and trenching, or C-68HD Horizontal drilling and micro tunneling classification may perform the work required for this University project under Technical Specifications Technical Specifications Section 02442 – Horizontal Directional Drilling, Section 02510 – High Density Polyethylene (HDPE) Pipe, and Section 02600 – Polyvinyl Chloride (PVC) Pipe for Horizontal Directional Drilling (HDD).

**Sheet Metal Workers’ International Association Local 293, Sheet Metal Contractors Association, Commercial Sheetmetal Co. Inc.** – They are requesting reconsideration of the Board’s June 20, 2014 scope determination regarding the Kailua District Park Gymnasium project, which involves the installation of louvers which are factory made with coating and weep holes in one frame.

Neal Arita, Executive Director of the Sheet Metal Contractors Association (“Association”), representing Sheet Metal Contractors in Hawaii, voiced the Association’s concerns on the Board’s recent determination that the “B” General Building, C-5 Cabinet, millwork, and carpentry remodeling and repairs, C-22 Glazing and tinting, or C-44 Sheet metal contractors can install the factory made louvers with coating and weep holes in one frame. The Association also provided written testimony.

Mr. Arita stated that the Association believes that only the C-44 Sheet metal contractor can install these louvers based on the following:

- The louvers are prefabricated and made of metal;
- The C-44 classification specifically states that they can “install pre-manufactured sheet metal products such as metal chutes, lockers, shelving, louvres”, whereas the “B”, C-5, and C-22 do not make any similar reference;

- In the AIA Master Specification, Louvers are in the Division 8 – Openings section and are identified separately from doors and windows;
- The Kailua District Park specifications section listed louvers in the windows and door section, but the installer still should be the C-44 contractor; and
- The Board’s rationale that because the metal louvers go in an “opening,” they can be installed by the various trades is not allowable, as the installation is regulated by the Board’s rules. To have any other contractor other than the C-44 install these metal louvers is in violation of the Board’s rules and will require a rule change.

Arthur Tolentino, Business Manager/Financial Secretary-Treasurer of the Hawaii Sheet Metal Workers’ International Association, Local No. 293, had also provided written testimony and testified that the Board’s determination is troubling for the men and women of their union membership, as they believe there is a potential for the City and County to rely upon this decision when awarding future jobs to a contractor without the C-44 Sheet metal license on similar projects.

Dwayne Arelliano of the Glaziers Union stated that it was ludicrous to say that only the C-44 contractors can install these louvers as the specifications say that the louvers are fixed and inoperable “windows” with weep holes, and therefore it is still a window. Mr. Arelliano brought pictures of several projects they worked on around town installing free-standing louvers and vents, and the glaziers have been installing these louvers and vents for the past 30 years.

Mr. Lee stated that he walked around town this morning and took pictures of louvers on Ali’i Place building. He showed pictures of louvers above the fire door and stairwell and he stated that air seemed to be going back and forth. He also showed a picture of vents by the mechanical room.

Commercial Sheetmetal Co. Inc. also provided written testimony requesting the Board to reconsider its determination as they also believe the installation of metal louvers should be according to the administrative rule scope description and not dependent on where they are located in/on a building or where it appears in the project specifications. Their testimony also stated that metal louvers have been customarily and should be installed by sheet metal and mechanical contractors only because they have the experience, knowledge and tools to install these louvers.

Executive Officer Tamanaha stated that usually the classifications in the rules are not meant to be exclusive. For example, if painting work is for waterproofing purposes, then it could be done by the C-55 waterproofing contractor or C-33 Painting and decorating contractor. It depends on the intent or purpose of the job.

The Board related that it did not appear that the louvers were tied in to a HVAC system. Confirmation on whether it is connected to a mechanical system is therefore needed.

Mr. Tolentino believes that the mechanical engineer meant the purpose of the louver was for mechanical reasons and not architectural. There is engineering behind the design of the louver for ventilation. When a louver moves air, it becomes a mechanical function. The purpose of the louver is to move or release air, and therefore, it is mechanical. Architectural louvers are for nonfunctional purposes and usually it will look like a louver but the other side of it will be a solid blank piece.

Mr. Arelliano felt that they are inoperable metal louvers and glaziers do not do work on mechanical louvers. However, if half of a window is glass and the other half is louvers, the glaziers do not want to be excluded from doing the louver work.

Richard Wurdeman, attorney representing the Sheet Metal Union, felt this was a jurisdictional dispute. Installation of these louvers is sheet metal work based on past practice. Initial testimony was based on the Hawaii Administrative Rules and this starts to create a dangerous situation and it could set a bad precedence. Since the Board's determination is an informal non-binding opinion, the City and County should file a petition for declaratory relief.

After discussion, it was moved by Mr. Kagawa, seconded by Mr. Lee, and unanimously carried to defer reconsideration of its prior determination on the installation of louvers in the Kailua District Park Gymnasium project pending the receipt of additional information from the City & County of Honolulu; specifically, the Board would like to see the plans and specifications for this project, and have the City & County of Honolulu describe the purpose of the metal louvers(e.g., ventilation, decorative, air conditioning, etc.).
