Chairperson De Luz announced he was taking the agenda out of order to address HRS chapter 91, Adjudicatory Matters.

Chairperson De Luz recessed the meeting at 9:03 a.m.

- a. In the Matter of the Motor Vehicle Dealer's License of ENVY HAWAII, LLC, doing business as VOLVO OF HONOLULU, Respondent, MVI 2014-30-L

Settlement Agreement Prior to Filing of Petition for Disciplinary Action and Board's Final Order.

The Board reviewed the settlement agreement. After discussion, it was moved by Mr. Hansen, seconded by Mr. Johnsen and unanimously carried to approve the settlement agreement in which:

- (i) Respondent enters into this Settlement Agreement freely, knowingly, voluntarily and under no coercion or duress;
- (ii) Respondent admits to the veracity of the allegations and that Respondent's acts violate the following statute(s) and/or rule(s): Hawaii revised Statutes ("HRS") §§ 437-12(a) (no legal ownership certificate prior to sale), 437-12(b) (failure to deliver ownership certificate within the time period specified), 437-28(a)(2) (failure to comply with laws relating to sale), and 437-28(a)(13) (entering into an agreement contrary to chapter).
- (iii) Respondent enters into this Settlement Agreement as a compromise of the claims and to conserve on the expenses of proceeding with an administrative hearing on this matter.
- (iv) Respondent agrees that this Settlement Agreement is intended to resolve the issues raised in RICO's investigation in RICO No. MVI 2014-30-L.
- (v) Administrative fine. Respondent agrees to pay a fine in the amount of FIVE HUNDRED AND NO U.S. DOLLARS (\$500.00). Payment shall be made by cashier's check or money order made payable to "DCCA - Compliance Resolution Fund" and mailed to the Regulated Industries Complaints Office. Payment of the fine shall be due at the time this Settlement Agreement is returned to RICO.
- (vi) Failure to Comply with Settlement Agreement. If Respondent fails to fully and timely comply with the terms of this Settlement Agreement as set forth in paragraph(s) C.1, Respondent's license shall be automatically revoked upon RICO's filing of an affidavit with the Board attesting to

such failure. In case of such revocation, Respondent shall turn in all indicia of the license to the Executive Officer of the Board within ten (10) days after receipt of notice of the revocation.

b. In the Matter of the Motor Vehicle Dealer's License of ENVY HAWAII, LLC, doing business as WINDWARD MOTORS, Respondent, MVI 2015-18-L

Settlement Agreement Prior to Filing of Petition for Disciplinary Action and Board's Final Order.

The Board reviewed the settlement agreement. After discussion, it was moved by Mr. Johnsen, seconded by Mr. Hansen and unanimously carried to approve the settlement agreement in which:

- (i) Respondent enters into this Settlement Agreement freely, knowingly, voluntarily and under no coercion or duress;
- (ii) Respondent admits to the veracity of the allegations that Respondent's acts violate the following statute(s) and/or rule(s). Hawaii Revised Statutes ("HRS") § 437-15 (allowing a salesperson to engage in car sales activity without being licensed by the dealership) and 437-28(a)(2) (failure to comply with laws relating to sale).
- (iii) Respondent alleges that it registered the salesperson's license with the dealership as soon as it was notified of the issue.
- (iv) Respondent enters into this Settlement Agreement as a compromise of the claims and to conserve on the expenses of proceeding with an administrative hearing on this matter.
- (v) Respondent agrees that this Settlement Agreement is intended to resolve the issues raised in RICO's investigation in RICO Case No. MVI 2015-18-L;
- (vi) Administrative fine. Respondent agrees to pay a fine in the amount of FIVE HUNDRED AND NO/100 U.S. DOLLARS (\$500.00). Payment shall be made by cashier's check or money order made payable to "DCCA - Compliance Resolution Fund" and mailed to the Regulated Industries Complaints Office. Payment of the fine shall be due at the time this Settlement Agreement is returned to RICO;

- (vii) Failure to Comply with Settlement Agreement. If Respondent fails to fully and timely comply with the terms of this Settlement Agreement as set forth in paragraph(s) C.1, Respondent's license shall be automatically revoked upon RICO's filing of an affidavit with the Board attesting to such failure. In case of such revocation, Respondent shall turn in all indicia of the license to the Executive Officer of the Board within ten (10) days after receipt of notice of the revocation.

Chairperson De Luz announced that the Board would return to the order of the agenda at 9:15 a.m.

Vice Chairperson Wong joined the meeting at 9:15 a.m.

Chairperson De Luz again announced he was taking the agenda out of order to address Applications.

Executive Session: At 9:30 a.m., it was moved by Vice Chairperson Wong, seconded by Mr. Johnsen, and unanimously carried to enter into Executive Session to consider and evaluate personal information relating to the individual applying for licensure in accordance with HRS section 92-5(a) (1), and to consult with the Board's attorney on questions and issues pertaining to the Board's powers, duties, privileges, immunities, and liabilities in accordance with HRS section 92-5(a) (4).

EXECUTIVE SESSION

At 9:59 a.m., it was moved by Mr. Johnsen, seconded by Mr. Hansen, and unanimously carried to return to the Board's regular order of business.

- (v) James B. Mitchell II – Motor Vehicle Salesperson
After considerable discussion and review of all of the documents and information provided, it was moved by Mr. Hansen, seconded by Mr. Johnsen and unanimously carried to approve a conditional motor vehicle salesperson's license for James B. Mitchell II. Chairperson De Luz informed Mr. Mitchell that he is authorized to engage in motor vehicle sales only at Windward Auto Sales, Inc. (Windward). Mr. De Luz further stated that the license will automatically terminate if his employment with Windward terminates, for whatever reason. Should Mr. Mitchell desire to sell vehicles at another dealership, he must reapply to for a new license.

Executive Session: At 10:05 a.m., it was moved by Mr. Johnsen, seconded by Mr. Hansen, and unanimously carried to enter into Executive Session to consider and evaluate personal information relating to the individual applying for licensure in accordance with HRS section 92-5(a) (1), and to consult with the Board's attorney on questions and issues pertaining to the Board's powers, duties, privileges, immunities, and liabilities in accordance with HRS section 92-5(a) (4).

It was moved by Mr. Hansen, seconded by Mr. Short and unanimously carried to approve the motor vehicle salesperson application for Grant Miyahara.

Chairperson De Luz announced that the Board would return to the order of the agenda at 10:24 a.m.

Meeting:

It was moved by Mr. Wong, seconded by Mr. Johnsen and unanimously carried to approve the minutes of the meeting.

Executive Officer's
Report:

The Executive Officer reported that Alice Worthy left the Professional Vocational Licensing division in June 2015. Roni Bumgarner is a newly hired secretary and will be auditing the meeting, and Christine Hironaka has been assigned as secretary to the Board.

Upon a motion by Mr. Short, seconded by Mr. Hansen, it was unanimously carried to ratify the above lists for the licenses sought (as attached).

b. Applications

- (i) The Braun Corporation – Motor Vehicle Manufacturer

Vice-Chairperson Wong stated that in order to sell the vehicle, both the dealer and manufacturer must be approved and licensed.

It was moved by Mr. Hansen, seconded by Vice-Chairperson Wong and unanimously carried to approve the above application for motor vehicle manufacturer license.

Chairperson De Luz again announced he was taking the agenda out of order to address Old Business, a. Motor Vehicle Manufacturers – End Stage.

Old Business:

a. Motor Vehicle Manufacturers – End Stage

Denise Soderholm, stated that she is authorized to represent Halcore Group, Inc. and WMK Inc. dba Mobility Works dba Transitworks.

Ms. Soderholm said that Soderholm Sales & Leasing Inc. represents manufacturers of school buses, tour buses, and paratransit vehicles (handi-vans).

She stated that the majority of their manufacturers are known as second stage manufacturers. She added that these manufacturers are required to comply with Federal standards. As the authorized dealer, they have written franchise agreements with the second stage manufacturers, who in turn have written authorizations with the original manufacturers of the incomplete vehicle. Further, they are an authorized warranty center with repair equipment and trained technicians. When they sell vehicles, they always advise their customers to bring the vehicle back to them, if there are any problems. Because of their repair equipment, they are successful at locating the problems and make sure the repairs are done. They will work with the franchised dealer of the incomplete vehicle to have the warranty repair done, if that is where the problem lies. If the issue is with the part of the vehicle for which they represent, they perform the warranty work themselves.

Ms. Soderholm said that there seem to be concerns about how the vehicles are registered. She asserted that it is not them nor the dealer that dictates how the vehicle is registered, rather it is the County that decides. She cited to an example of a paratransit van that may have been built on a Ford chassis. When they take the MSO to the county DMV for registration, the DMV that decides how to register the vehicle. She added that there is no correlation between the County's decision to register the vehicle as a Ford and the fact that they are not an authorized Ford dealer.

Corianne Lau, Esq. stated that she was present for another agenda item, and not for this matter. Chairperson De Luz stated that she made a previous presentation to the Board regarding second stage manufacturers. He asked her if she could provide insight. Ms. Lau related that she understands the Board's

concerns regarding the warranty and consumer protection. She said that the dispute appears to be about business competition. She added that competition is good for the public.

Chairperson De Luz added that there are concerns about who will honor the warranty. Mr. Short added there is a need for these vehicles and that if the manufacturer of the incomplete vehicle authorizes another company to put their body on the incomplete vehicle and warranties are in place, the consumer is protected. T

Anna Oshiro, Esq. from Damon Key, the law firm representing H T & T Truck Center, is requesting that the Board review and clarify the new motor vehicle dealer licensing requirements under HRS chapter 437. They are asking whether the Board will allow a dealer who lacks a franchise agreement with a manufacturer or distributor of new motor vehicles to sell such new motor vehicles because they have been combined with a body or body part for which the dealer has a franchise agreement with a different manufacturer. She suggests the licensing laws were specifically crafted to prevent dealers from circumventing the law in this manner.

Ms. Oshiro cited to the Board's August 2007 minutes which she stated is creating confusion within the industry. She explained that the Board's interpretation that allows dealers with a franchise agreement with the manufacturer of the body only and not the actual self-propelling component of the vehicle (the chassis) amounts to creating an exception to the law. On the basis of her discussion, Ms. Oshiro requested that the Board declare that the franchise agreement requirement of HRS chapter 437 for new motor vehicle dealers is interpreted to mean that a dealer who lacks a franchise agreement with the manufacturer or distributor of new motor vehicles may not lawfully sell such new motor vehicles simply because they have been supplemented with a body, body part, or other component for which the dealer has a franchise agreement with a different manufacturer.

Mr. Short commented that in following Ms. Oshiro's argument, a Ford dealer would not be able to sell an unfinished chassis.

After considerable discussion, it was moved by Chairperson De Luz, seconded by Mr. Hansen and unanimously carried to defer the discussion on motor vehicle manufacturer end.

Scope:

- a. October 12, 2015 request from Tesla Motors, Inc. regarding display of motor vehicles at unlicensed premise – Ala Moana Center Space No. 2204 (Deferred October 20, 2015 meeting)

Jonathan Chang, representing Tesla Motors, informed the Board that Tesla is planning to open a dealership at the Ala Moana

Center. As a short-term measure, Tesla has taken a temporary lease (2 to 3 months) for Space No. 2204 where they desire to operate a gallery, where they will sell only Tesla apparel and accessories. The concept is for brand awareness. Mr. Chang added that they will not be selling cars from the gallery.

Vice-Chairperson Wong expressed concerns that Tesla Motors may have been operating the gallery and displaying the vehicles without Board approval and in disregard of the laws. Mr. Chang stated that Tesla received written approval from the Board's Executive Officer in October 2015. The Executive Officer stated that an approval was granted for a location other than Space 2204. However, upon further communication with Tesla representatives, the Executive Officer learned that the Space number that Tesla initially provided was not Space 2204. Further, their request was for more than the "mall" usual displays that the Board's office receives. With the available information, the matter was placed on the agenda for the Board's review.

DAG Tam asked Mr. Chang how many cars were on display at the gallery and how many employees are at the Ala Moana location. Mr. Chang responded that there are two cars on display and there are five product specialists there to answer questions. Vice-Chairperson Wong added that the display location should be a licensed, branch location. Mr. Chang remarked that "display" is not defined in the statute.

Mr. Short asked "how many designated parking stalls are assigned to Tesla at the mall?" Mr. Chang responded "none, there are EV parking stalls available." Vice-Chairperson Wong stated that if product specialists are answering questions or selling the vehicles they and Tesla are engaging in motor vehicle dealer activity at the site, which would then require a license as a dealership or a branch location.

Mr. Chang stated that the vehicles are considered to be fixtures or props since they are sitting in an apparel store.

Executive Session: At 11:47 a.m., it was moved by Vice Chairperson Wong, seconded by Mr. Hansen, and unanimously carried to enter into Executive Session to consider and evaluate personal information relating to the individual applying for licensure in accordance with HRS section 92-5(a) (1), and to consult with the Board's attorney on questions and issues pertaining to the Board's powers, duties, privileges, immunities, and liabilities in accordance with HRS section 92-5(a) (4).

EXECUTIVE SESSION

At 12:10. A.m., it was moved by Vice Chairperson Wong, seconded by Mr. Hansen, and unanimously carried to return to the Board's regular order of business.

After further discussion, it was moved by Chairperson De Luz, seconded by Mr. Hansen and unanimously carried to approve Tesla Motors, Inc. display of motor vehicles at Ala Moana Center Space No. 2204 subject to the following conditions:

- 1) No sales or selling activity at this location as defined in HRS section 437-1.1, Definitions:

“Sale”, “selling”, and equivalent expressions, mean the act or attempted act, either as principal or an agent or in any capacity whatsoever, of selling, bartering, exchanging, or otherwise disposing of, or negotiating, or offering, or attempting to negotiate the sale, purchase, or exchange of, or interest in, a motor vehicle, including an option to purchase a motor vehicle.

- 2) Employees must send potential vehicle customers to Tesla's licensed premise in Waipahu.

- 3) No test drives are to be given at the mall.

Chairperson De Luz announced he was returning to the order of the agenda.

- (iii) Independent Protection Company, Inc. -Motor Vehicle Manufacturer

It was moved by Mr. Johnsen, seconded by Vice Chairperson Wong and unanimously carried to approve the Independent Protection Company, Inc. application for motor vehicle manufacturer.

- (iv) WMK Inc. dba Mobility Works, dba Transitworks -Motor Vehicle Manufacturer

It was moved by Vice Chairperson Wong, seconded by Mr. Johnsen and unanimously carried to approve the WMK Inc. dba Mobility Works dba Transitworks application for motor vehicle manufacturer.

Open Forum: Dave Rolf of the Hawaii Automobile Dealers Association ("HADA") distributed the Let's Ride publication to the Board members. Mr. Rolf stated that the HADA board would like the Board to revisit the matter of salespersons being employed by more than one dealership when the dealerships are owned by a single owner. He stated that he would submit a request in writing.
