It was moved by Dr. Akaka, seconded by Dr. Dao, and unanimously carried to remove the conditions from Dr. Morton's conditional license, Hawaii Medical License No. MD-18379.

The Board reviewed and considered the records and files of Dr. Lee's application, information received from Dr. Lee and from other organizations, as well as his oral testimony. These records and files include, but are not limited to: 1) the revocation of Dr. Lee's North Dakota medical license by Order dated August 27, 2008; 2) the surrender of Dr. Lee's medical license to practice allopathic medicine in the state of Arizona by Consent Agreement for Surrender of License dated February 2, 2009; 3) the reprimand and numerous conditions placed on Dr. Lee's North Dakota medical license by Stipulation and Order dated November 14, 2009; 4) Dr. Lee's exclusion from participation in any capacity in the Medicare, Medicaid and all Federal health care programs; and Hawaii Medical Board Minutes of Meeting of November 9, 2017 Page 4

5) the most recent decision to deny Dr. Lee's participation in Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Minnesota on April 12, 2017.

After due consideration of the information received, it was moved by Dr. Halford, seconded by Dr. Sept, and unanimously carried to deny Dr. Lee's application for licensure, basing its decision on the following grounds of the Hawaii Revised Statutes ("HRS") and Hawaii Administrative Rules ("HAR"), which find factual support in the records and files of Dr. Lee's application:

HRS §453-8 provides that:

(a) In addition to any other actions authorized by law, any license to practice medicine and surgery may be revoked, limited, or suspended by the board at any time in a proceeding before the board, or may be denied, for any cause authorized by law, including but not limited to the following:

*

- Professional misconduct, hazardous negligence causing bodily injury to another, or manifest incapacity in the practice of medicine or surgery;
- Incompetence or multiple instances of negligence, including but not limited to the consistent use of medical service, which is inappropriate or unnecessary;
- (9) Conduct or practice contrary to recognized standards of ethics of the medical profession as adopted by the Hawaii Medical Association, the American Medical Association, the Hawaii Association of Osteopathic Physicians and Surgeons, or the American Osteopathic Association; and
- (11) Revocation, suspension, or other disciplinary action by another state or federal agency of a license, certificate, or medical privilege.

HRS §436B-19 provides that:

In addition to any other acts or conditions provided by law, the licensing authority may refuse to renew, reinstate or restore, or may deny, revoke, suspend, or condition in any manner, any license for any one or more of the following acts or conditions on the part of the licensee or the applicant thereof:

*

(8) Failure to maintain a record or history of competency, trustworthiness, fair dealing, and financial integrity;

- (9) Conduct or practice contrary to recognized standards of ethics for the licensed profession or vocation; and
- (12) Failure to comply, observe, or adhere to any law in a manner such that the licensing authority deems the applicant or holder to be an unfit or improper person to hold a license.

HAR §16-85-107 provides that:

(a) An application for issuance of a license or certificate shall be denied when an application is insufficient or incomplete or when an applicant has failed to provide satisfactory proof that the applicant meets the requirements under chapters 453 or 463E, HRS, or this chapter. In addition, the board may deny issuance of a license or certificate:

* * *

- When the applicant has committed any of the acts for which a license or certificate may be suspended or revoked under sections 453-8 or 463E-6, HRS, or section 16-85-112;
- (2) If the applicant fails to demonstrate that the applicant possesses a good reputation for honesty, truthfulness, fairness, and financial integrity; and
- (3) If the applicant has had disciplinary action taken by any jurisdiction, including any federal or state regulatory body.

The Board considers Dr. Lee's conduct extremely concerning and contrary to the recognized standards of ethics as adopted by the American Medical Association ("AMA"). Specifically, the Board believes that Dr. Lee failed to uphold the following AMA Principles of Medical Ethics:

- A physician shall be dedicated to providing competent medical care, with compassion and respect for human dignity and rights;
- (II) A physician shall uphold the standards of professionalism, be honest in all professional interactions, and strive to report physicians deficient in character or competence, or engaging in fraud or deception, to appropriate entities;

- (III) A physician shall respect the law and also recognize a responsibility to seek changes in those requirements which are contrary to the best interests of the patient; and
- (IV) A physician shall respect the rights of patients, colleagues, and other health professionals, and shall safeguard patient confidences and privacy within the constraints of the law.

It was moved by Dr. Egami, seconded by Dr. Halford, with the exceptions of Dr. Bintliff and Dr. Sept who opposed the motion, and carried by a majority to approve Dr. LeVeen's application.

It was moved by Dr. Holt, seconded by Dr. Egami, and unanimously carried to approve Dr. Knoll's application, contingent upon providing proof of meeting the requirements set forth in Hawaii Revised Statutes §453-4(d), which states:

> Applicants who are licensed in another state by virtue of having passed a state-produced examination may qualify for licensure if they have passed the Special Purpose Examination (SPEX) or the Comprehensive Osteopathic Medical Variable-Purpose Examination – USA (COMVEX-USA) and meet the requirements of subsection (b); provided that the board may require letters of evaluation, professional evaluation forms, and interviews with chiefs of service, attending physicians, or osteopathic physicians who have been associated with an applicant, or chief residents on a service who have been associated with an applicant during the applicant's training or practice, to be used by the board in assessing the applicant's qualifications to practice medicine.

Given that Dr. Knoll passed a state-produced examination, he shall provide proof of passing the SPEX or COMVEX-USA in order to be issued a medical license in the State.

<u>Correspondence:</u>	a.	Letter dated October 13, 2017, from Kelley J. Clark, MD, MBA, DFAPA, DFASAM, President, American Society of Addiction Medicine, L. Gail Curtis, MPAS, PA-C, DFAAPA, President, American Academy of Physician Assistants, and Joyce M. Knestrick, PhD, C-FNP, FAANP, President, American Association of Nurse Practitioners, regarding the prescribing privileges of nurse practitioners and physician assistants – prescribing Buprenorphine for the treatment of addiction.
		The above-referenced letter was provided for the informational purposes.
		The purpose of this correspondence is to advise the Board of the Comprehensive Addiction and Recovery Act ("CARA") signed into law by President Barak Obama.
		One major provision of CARA is the authorization of prescribing privileges to nurse practitioners ("NPs") and physician assistants ("PAs") for FDA approved opioid treatment medications containing buprenorphine, a Schedule III controlled substance. Under CARA, NPs and PAs must complete 24 hours of training to be eligible for a waiver to prescribe and must be supervised by or work in collaboration with a qualifying physician (defined under Federal law as a physician that is an addiction specialist or has taken the appropriate training), if supervision or collaboration is required by state law.
Scope of Practice:	a.	Email dated October 12, 2017, from Randal B. Covin, M.D., Blood Bank of Hawaii, Medical Director, seeking clarification regarding whether Hawaii Revised Statutes Chapter 453 prohibits the Blood Bank of Hawaii from implementing the initiative of giving donors multivitamins with iron or iron supplements because of iron depletion.
