g. Asplundh Tree Expert LLCJohn Hutchinson, RMEC-27b Tree trimming & removal

At 10:02 a.m., it was moved by Mr. Isemoto, seconded by Mr. Lee, and unanimously carried to enter into executive session pursuant to HRS section 92-5(a)(1) to consider and evaluate personal information relating to individuals applying for professional or vocational licenses cited in HRS section 26-9, and to consult with Krishna F. Jayaram, deputy attorney general, on questions and issues pertaining to the Board's powers, duties, privileges, immunities, and liabilities pursuant to HRS section 92-5(a)(4).

At 10:17 a.m., it was moved by Mr. Matsuzaki, seconded by Mr. Lee, and unanimously carried to move out of executive session and to reconvene to the Board's regular order of business.

It was moved by Mr. Matsuzaki, seconded by Mr. Lee, and unanimously carried to approve Asplundh Tree Expert LLC's and Mr. Hutchinson's application for licensure in the C-27b Tree trimming and removal classification pending the submittal of: (1) a current (not more than a year old) compiled, reviewed, or audited financial statement (for the applicant) accompanied by an independent accountant's report; and (2) a current comprehensive Dun and Bradstreet report covering at least the previous five years for the applicant that does not reflect negative history such as judgements, liens, past due or charged off accounts.

Chairperson Polischeck called for a short recess at 10:19 a.m.

The Board reconvened at 10:25 a.m.

Chapter 91, HRS, Adjudicatory Matters:

Chairperson Polischeck called for a recess from the Board's meeting at 10:26 a.m. to discuss and deliberate on the following adjudicatory matters pursuant to HRS chapter 91.

- 1. Settlement Agreements
- a. <u>In the Matter of the Contractors' Licenses of Hermo Enterprises, LLC, and Kevin Hermo; CLB 2012-393-L</u>

Respondents Hermo Enterprises, LLC and Kevin Hermo allegedly entered into contracts with two homeowners to repave a driveway and parking area, build a parking area, and build a rock wall at residences located at Kuana Place in Kihei, Hawaii, in exchange for compensation.

If proven at an administrative hearing, the allegations would constitute violations of HRS §§ 444-15(c) (a licensee on inactive status shall not engage in contracting) and 444-17(12) (willful failure in any material respect to comply with HRS chapter 444).

Respondents agree to pay an administrative fine in the amount of \$1,500.00.

After discussion, it was moved by Mr. Lee, seconded by Mr. Isemoto, and unanimously carried to approve the Settlement Agreement Prior to Filing of Petition for Disciplinary Action and Board's Final Order in the above case.

b. <u>In the Matter of the Contractors' Licenses of Jerry W. Caffey, and Caffey, Inc.; CLB 2015-198-L</u>

Respondent Jerry W. Caffey allegedly was not in residence in the State of Hawaii for periods of time back in 2015 while his company, Caffey, Inc., was hired to install a new angiogram at the Hilo Medical Center during the renovation of the angiogram, nuclear medicine, and ultra sound suites at the facility.

If proven at an administrative hearing, the allegations would constitute violations of HRS § 444-17(12) (willful failure in any material respect to comply with HRS chapter 444) and HAR § 16-77-71(a)(4) (RME shall be in residence in the State of Hawaii during the time when a project is under construction).

Respondents agree to pay an administrative fine in the amount of \$10,000.00.

After discussion, it was moved by Mr. Isemoto, seconded by Mr. Lee, and unanimously carried to approve the Settlement Agreement Prior to Filing of Petition for Disciplinary Action and Board's Final Order in the above case.

c. <u>In the Matter of the Contractors' Licenses of K & S Construction, LLC, and</u> Andrew L. Keenan, RME; CLB 2014-145-L

Respondent K & S Construction, LLC ("K & S") allegedly failed to pay delinquent taxes and failed to comply with the terms of a tax payment plan with the Department of Taxation.

If proven at an administrative hearing, the allegations would constitute violation of HRS § 444-17(21) (Failure to pay delinquent taxes, interest,

and penalties assessed under chapter 237 that relate to the business of contracting, or to comply with the terms of a conditional payment plan with the department of taxation for the payment of such delinquent taxes, interest, and penalties).

K & S agrees to the voluntary surrender of K & S's license.

Respondent Andrew L Keenan ("Keenan") agrees to pay a fine of in the amount of \$500.00 and that he will continue to make payments on the tax payment plan until the balance is paid in full, discharged or otherwise legally satisfied. Keenan agrees to report any unexcused failure to comply with the terms of his tax payment to the Board and to RICO within ten (10) days of such unexcused failure.

After discussion, it was moved by Mr. Isemoto, seconded by Mr. Leong, and unanimously carried to approve the Settlement Agreement Prior to Filing of Petition for Disciplinary Action and Board's Final Order in the above case.

2. Board's Final Order

a. <u>In the Matter of the Contractors' Licenses of Stewart Builders, LLC;</u>
 Troy C. Stewart also known as Troy Clifford Stewart; CLB 2008-46-L

Respondents Stewart Builders, LLC and Troy C. Stewart also known as Troy Clifford Stewart entered into a written contract with homeowners for a renovation project at their home.

Petitioner charged Respondents with violating HRS §§ 444-25.5(a), 444-25.5(b); and HAR §§ 16-77-33(d), 16-77-71, 16-77-75, 16-77-79, and 16-77-80.

The Hearings Officer recommends that the Board find and conclude the Respondents violated HRS §§ 444-25.5(a), 444-25.5(b), HAR §§ 16-77-79, 16-77-80 (failed to provide homeowner with proper written contacts for the work contemplated); and HAR §§ 16-77-33(d) (unlicensed, out of scope activity), HAR §§ 16-77-71, 16-77-75, (Respondent Stewart, RME, was responsible for the acts and omissions of Respondent Stewart Builders).

Hearings Officer recommends that Respondents' licenses be revoked and that Respondents be required to immediately submit all indicia of licensure as a contractor in the State of Hawaii to the Executive Officer of the Board.

After discussion, it was moved by Mr. Matsuoka, seconded by Mr. Isemoto, and unanimously carried to approve the Board's Final Order in the above case.

Following the Board's review, deliberation and decisions in these matters.

pursuant to HRS chapter 91, Chairperson Polischeck announced that the Board was reconvening to its open meeting at 10:32 a.m.

Executive Session:

At 10:33 a.m., it was moved by Mr. Lee, seconded by Mr. Konishi, and unanimously carried to enter into executive session pursuant to HRS section 92-5(a)(1) to consider and evaluate personal information relating to individuals applying for professional or vocational licenses cited in HRS section 26-9, and to consult with Krishna F. Jayaram, deputy attorney general, on questions and issues pertaining to the Board's powers, duties, privileges, immunities, and liabilities pursuant to HRS section 92-5(a)(4).

At 11:27 a.m., it was moved by Mr. Lee, seconded by Mr. Konishi, and unanimously carried to move out of executive session and to reconvene to the Board's regular order of business.

Committee Reports:

2. <u>Examination Committee</u>: Danny Matsuoka, Chairperson

The Contractors Examination Summary for October 2017 was distributed to the Board for their information.

3. Recovery/Education Fund Committee:

The Recovery Fund Litigation Report for October 21, 2017 to November 17, 2017 prepared by Ronald Michioka, Esq., the Board's Recovery Fund attorney, was distributed to the Board.

4. Rules Committee: Leonard Leong, Chairperson

Rules Committee Chairperson Leong thanked the testifiers for their time and the effort taken to attend the public hearing and submit written testimony. The issues of safety and quality of work is very important to the Board. Mr. Leong opened the floor for discussion on the proposed rule amendments.

Chairperson Polischeck expressed concern regarding the information presented by Mr. O'Donnell on the Resolute Performance Contracting LLC complaint (Case No. CLB 2015-181-L). In particular he was troubled that the Regulated Industries Complaints Office ("RICO") had determined that the structural steel work on the projects were "incidental and supplemental" work and informed Mr. O'Donnell (complainant) in a letter dated April 29, 2016 that there appeared to be no licensing violations and that the case was closed with no further action.

Chairperson Polischeck stated that Kaiser Permanente appeared at the Board's July 24, 2015 meeting to discuss these projects and the Board determined that the C-48 Structural steel contractor's license is required to install the steel structural supports for the photovoltaic panels. He further stated that RICO subsequently entered into a Settlement Agreement with Resolute Performance

Contracting LLC which the Board approved on April 13, 2017. Chairperson Polischeck stated that there appears to be a misunderstanding with RICO and the Board will discuss with RICO to prevent future misunderstandings.

Mr. Lee thanked representatives of the Ironworkers Stabilization Fund, PAMCA, GCA, District Council 50, International Association of Heat and Frost Insulators and Allied Workers Local 132 for their testimony at the public hearing. He stated that the Board's proposed rule amendments track the language of the Board's Final Order Upon Remand (dated October 18, 2013) in the DC 50 case ("BFO"); and the Board is codifying the Hawaii Supreme Court's decision.

Mr. Isemoto thanked everyone for submitting testimony to the Board. He commented that the Board has been challenged with addressing how to implement court decisions. In his first term, the Board addressed the Okada Trucking decision on the types of work that general contractors can perform. He stated that the language in the proposed rule amendment tracks the Supreme Court's decision in the DC 50 case. Mr. Isemoto also explained that the Board must follow its BFO whether or not the proposed rule amendments are adopted and therefore the Board's process of determining "incidental and supplemental" work will remain the same. The proposed amendment clarifies "incidental and supplemental" work.

Mr. Leong added that as a general contractor, his responsibility is to service the public and provide a good product. He stated that subcontractors offer quality and timely work. General contractors would not try to self-perform specialty contracting work as "incidental and supplemental" work; and it would be foolish and not cost effective.

Mr. Matsuzaki also thanked the audience for submitting testimony to the Board. He noted that there was much testimony on the percentage that defines the term "majority". He emphasized that the percentage is not the only criteria used in determining "incidental and supplemental" work. The Board considers the other criteria (i.e. the work must be subordinate to, directly related to, and necessary for the completion of the work of greater importance that is within the scope of the licensee's license) seriously because these criteria are very important in determining whether work is "incidental and supplemental". Mr. Matsuzaki also acknowledged the testimony submitted by the International Association of Heat and Frost Insulators and Allied Workers Local 132 regarding the C-5 Cabinet, millwork, and carpentry remodeling and repairs contractor classification. He stated that the Board is currently reviewing all the specialty classification descriptions and will also be reviewing the C-5 classification description.

Chairperson Polischeck thanked everyone for participating in the public hearing and reiterated that the Board is not just looking at the percentage of work to determine whether work is "incidental and supplemental" work. The Board must also consider all criteria in its BFO.

There being no further discussion, it was moved by Mr. Leong, seconded by Mr. Kagawa, and unanimously carried to approve the proposed amendments to section 16-77-34.

At 11:37 a.m., it was moved by Mr. Lee, seconded by Mr. Kagawa, and unanimously carried to enter into executive session pursuant to HRS section 92-5(a)(1) to consider and evaluate personal information relating to individuals applying for professional or vocational licenses cited in HRS section 26-9, and to consult with Krishna F. Jayaram, deputy attorney general, on questions and issues pertaining to the Board's powers, duties, privileges, immunities, and liabilities pursuant to HRS section 92-5(a)(4).
