Agenda: The agenda for this meeting was filed with the Office of the Lieutenant Governor as required by Hawaii Revised Statutes ("HRS") section 92-7.

Call to Order: There being a quorum present, the meeting was called to order at 10:30 a.m. by Chairperson Galas.

Additions to the Agenda: The Executive Officer asked the Board to add "Proposed Legislation" to the agenda which she called on DAG Jayaram to share with the Board their options.

DAG stated that there were three bills introduced after the agenda was filed that the EO is asking to add to the agenda. He stated that in order for an item to be added to the agenda, there needs to be a vote by 2/3 of the members accept that the item is of reasonable major importance.

DAG felt that the bills do meet the criteria. In addition, the public forum for legislative proposals is before the Legislature at which the public may provide testimony.

The Chair asked if there were any question or concerns for DAG.

There were none.

With a motion by Vice Chair Denis, seconded by Mr. Inouye and carried unanimously by the Board, Proposed Legislation inclusive of H.B. 2571, H.B. 2061, S.B. 2129 items were added to the agenda.

a. 8-hour Curriculum Review

(i) Security Training Center LLC

It was moved by Chairman Galas, seconded by Vice Chair Denis, and unanimously carried to approve Security Training Center LLC's 8-hour Curriculum Training.

b. Certificate of Training (8 hour Curriculum)

The EO stated that based upon complaints the Board received that the 8-hour training curriculum was not being conducted for the full duration of 8 hours, we worked on language to be added to remind Instructors of their accountability when providing training.

It was moved by Chairman Galas, seconded by Vice Chair Denis, and unanimously carried to approve the attestation of the instructors to be added to the 8-hour Training Certificate.

I certify that I am a Hawaii Board of Private Detectives and Guards approved instructor teaching a board approved curriculum and that on (DATE) , 20 , as required by the Hawaii Revised Statutes Chapter 463, the above referenced individual was provided the mandatory eight hours of training on the topics and corresponding minimum durations set forth by the Board. I further certify that the above-referenced individual successfully passed an examination required by the Board, unaided and with a minimum passing score of 70%.

The above statements are true and correct to the best of my knowledge. I understand that this training and information is required by the Hawaii Board of Private detectives and Guards and that submitting false or untrue information may constitute a violation of Hawaii Revised Statutes § 710-1063 and could also result in the suspension or revocation of my guard instructor approval.

c. Outreach to Liquor Licensees

The EO stated that we reached out the Liquor Commission who responded with mailing lists for all liquor licensees. The same post card notice sent to GD, GDA, and GDEs was send to all liquor licensees.

d. Cruise Ship Employees

The Chair stated that the reason he wanted to bring this topic up was that when the ships are at port they are using security services.

Vice Chair noted that in past years they would contract out.

The Chair then asked if the employees who remain on the ship and act in the guard capacity are required to obtain guard employee registration.

The EO asked DAG if he could find out more information on maritime laws and would fall under the Board's jurisdiction.

The Chair also asked if we can start reaching out to the Film Office at the State Commissions and the State Counties.

Proposed
Legislation:

a. H.B. 2571 Relating to Guards

Creates a narrowly defined subcategory of guards, called watchpersons, who are allowed to be unregistered for sixty days but must meet all the requirements of a guard to continue working in a guard capacity after sixty-day period.

Last year when a similar bill was introduced it raised a few concerns because the bill would allow someone to work without being vetted. Although they may be calling it a separate category, the bill would allow them to act in a guard capacity for sixty days if not more based on the way it is currently written.

After discussion, it was moved by Vice Chair Denis, seconded by Chief Perry and unanimously carried by the Board to affirm its opposition to H.B. 2571 based on the same reasoning as determined at their February 16, 2017 Board Meeting.

b. H.B. 2061 Relating to Private Detectives and Guards
(companion S.B 2058)

Prohibits private detectives and guards from self-identifying as law enforcement officers, police, or police officers and from wearing or using any badge, uniform, equipment, vehicle, or other accoutrement capable of being associated with of a law enforcement organization.

Requires review and approval of any badge, uniform, equipment, vehicle, or other accoutrement to be used by private detectives and guards.

After discussion, it was moved by the Chair, seconded by Chief Faaumu and unanimously carried by the Board to support the intent of this measure; however, feels amendments being added to require the Board to review and approve all badges, uniforms, forms of identification, emblems, and other accoutrements to be worn or used by a licensee or an employee of a licensee and there after review and approve any subsequent changes are already being done pursuant to section 16-97-14 of the Board's administrative rules and are redundant. 16-97-14 already prohibits the use of any uniform, badge, identification, or emblem unless they have been approved by the Board and the Chief of Police in the county or counties in which the licensee intends to transact business. The board noted that although they are in support of the bill, the bill may cause an unintended consequence with other departments.

c. S.B. 2058 Relating to Private Detectives and Guards

Prohibits private detectives and guards from self-identifying as law enforcement officers, police, or police officers and from wearing or using any badge, uniform, equipment, vehicle, or other accoutrement capable of being associated with of a law enforcement organization. Requires review and approval of any badge, uniform, equipment, vehicle, or other accoutrement to be used by private detectives and guards.

After discussion, it was moved by Mr. Chang, seconded by Vice Chair Denis and unanimously carried by the Board to support the intent of this measure; however, feels amendments being added to require the Board to review and approve all badges, uniforms, forms of identification, emblems, and other accoutrements to be worn or used by a licensee or an employee of a licensee and there after review and approve any subsequent changes are already being done pursuant to section 16-97-14 of the Board's administrative rules and are redundant. 16-97-14 already prohibits the use of any uniform, badge, identification, or emblem unless they have been approved by the Board and the Chief of Police in the county or counties in which the licensee intends to transact business.

d. S.B.2429 Relating to Guards

Prohibits a security guard from possessing a firearm in the course of employment if the guard was discharged from employment as a law enforcement officer due to poor employment standing. Requires state and county law enforcement agencies to make appropriate disclosures.

After discussion, it was moved by Vice Chair Denis, seconded by Chief Perry and unanimously carried that the Board appreciates the intent of this measure but has concerns regarding the ability of the Board to implement the proposed requirements and the ability of guard employer licensees to obtain prior employment and discharge information from state, federal or county law enforcement agencies. The Board is concerned other laws may prevent law enforcement agencies from providing discharge information thereby precluding the Board and guard agencies from compliance.

In addition, the Board prohibits the carrying of weapons unless specifically authorized by the state agency or Chief of Police in the County or Counties in which the private detective or guard is doing business. The Board is not the approving body of the right to carry firearms in the State and placing the restriction in the licensees file may not prevent the county or State law enforcement agency from granting a permit to carry a firearm.

The Board is also concerned that the prior employment background check, in addition to the criminal background check will add subsequently to the renew and processing time of applicants for which the Board is consistently criticized.
