With a motion by Vice Chair Denis, seconded by Mr. Inouye and carried unanimously by the Board, "Cruise Lines" and "Rules for Conflict of Interest" were added to the agenda.

At 11:26 p.m., it was moved by Mr. Inouye, seconded by the Vice Chair, and unanimously carried to move out of executive session.

(ii) Kapili Services LLC (GDA) Michael Broyles (GD)

Based on Kapili's satisfactory submittal of all required information on their training curriculum and use of force and deadly force policy, by a motion from Chief Faaumu, seconded by Mr. Inouye, it was unanimously carried to approve the Guard Agency License for Kapili Services along with the Guard application for Michael Broyles.

At 11:27 p.m. Mr. Kahue, Mr. Broyles and Mr. Armstrong exited the meeting room.

Executive Session:

At 11:29 a.m., it was moved by the Vice Chair, seconded by Mr. Inouye, and unanimously carried to move into executive session pursuant to HRS §92-5 to consider and evaluate personal information relating to individuals applying for professional or vocational licenses cited in section HRS §26-9 or both, as provided in HRS §92-5(a)(1).

EXECUTIVE SESSION

At 11:43 a.m., it was moved by Mr. Inouye, seconded by the Vice Chair, and unanimously carried to move out of executive session.

The following agenda item was moved out of order.

Scope:

a. <u>Letter from Kapili Services LLC inquiring if a license is required for work performed pursuant to a Federal Contract, and on Federal property.</u>

The Chair asked the representative of Kapili Services if they wanted to pursue their initial request of whether a license is required for their contract knowing now that they have been approved for licensure.

Mr. Kahue asked if it would be okay if they pursue licensure, however, at a later time have the Board review the contract to see whether a license is needed or not. Also, by having a state license would that require Kapili to abide by all state requirements even though they are on a federal contract on federal property.

Mr. Inouye recommended they seek advice from their legal counsel because they would want to make sure that the contract has been reviewed in its entirety.

DAG stated that as a factual matter there is nothing in the statues that exempts federal work on federal property in our HRS provisions, however there is a concept that services provided on federal property is not subject to state licensure but that could be affected by federal laws, federal requirements, or what is specified in your contract, therefore the Board cannot provide any advice.

The EO stated that prior Board determination have been that if it is a federal contract on federal lands, the Board has no jurisdiction to enforce its statutory requirements on federal property. However, if the contract and the government requires you to meet state licensure then you must comply to meet the terms of the contract.

The Chair recommended the following things for Kapili to do:

- 1. Seek legal council.
- 2. Determine what their master contract requires to be in compliance with its terms.
- 3. Determine what their subcontract requires to be in compliance with its terms.

Mr. Kahue stated that based on the advice from the Deputy Attorney General and to allow Kapili to seek legal advice on the matter they would like to withdraw their request.

The following agenda item was moved out of order.

HRS §463-10.5 and Any Matters Relating to its Implementation:

Certificate of Training (8-hour Curriculum)

The Board welcomed Mr. Owens.

Mr. Inouye clarified that although Mr. Owens came to present a new format for the 8-hour training certificate, it is the Board's position that the general format that the Board decided on is the format to be followed. Therefore, it is up to the instructor to conform to it. If the instructor believes their version of the certificate is in compliance, then they may go ahead and use it. Mr. Inouye noted that it would be extremely difficult for the Board to take in every request to review a certificate.

Mr. Owens explained that he understood where the Board was coming from and for him it was more of a tactical issue of the word "training" vs "classroom instruction" because of the verbiage of the law that requires 8 hours of "classroom instruction". Although most people use the word "training" and "instruction" interchangeably, he didn't want any problems down the road because the statue says, "Classroom Instruction" and the sample certificate says "training."

Mr. Owens noted that he will also be adding a tracking number to the certificate so that they can be more accountable of attendees issued certificates.

The Board thanked the Mr. Owens for attending the meeting and his continual involvement with matters of industry.

The agenda resumed to its regular order of business.

Scope:

b. Cruise Ships

The Chair reminded the the Board that back at its January Board Meeting the question was raised if employees who act in a guard capacity docked in state harbors are required to obtain guard employee registration.

DAG stated that when on cruise ships it is governed by federal law and maritime law as stated in the 2010 Cruise Vessel Security and Safety Act covers cruise security personnel and the types of training they have.

The Chair was curious to know if it made a difference if the ship was traveling interstate or it applied to all ships such as Booze Cruise lines that just go around Oahu.

The Vice Chair explained that even dockside ships are regulated by "MARSEC." The Harbors themselves contract out and they need to have both MARSEC training certification and their state registration.

Mr. Chang was excused from the meeting.

c. Proposed Language

The Vice Chair stated that the Rules Committee came up with language to modify HAR 16-97-8 Conflict of Interest to clarify that law enforcement is not allowed to act as a guard employee.

The EO explained that one of the reasons for confusion is that the rules were created prior to Act 208. Prior to Act 208, the term "license" only included guard or private detective licenses. Act 208 now requires registration of guard employees. Our previous AG, Rod Tam, stated that HRS Chapter 436B looks at registration and licenses as the same and therefore HAR §16-89-8 would preclude the Board from issuing a Guard Employee Registration to a current law enforcement officer. She stated that the intent was to only apply to principal private detective and guard licenses and that it didn't include police officers or sheriffs who worked part time as guards if the county's chiefs allowed them to work.

The EO stated that a decision on the rule change will be deferred until the following Board meeting to allow the Board members time to review the proposed language.

2018 Legislation:

a. S.B.2429 S.D.1. the Relating to Guards

Prohibits a security guard from possessing a firearm in the course of employment if the guard was discharged from employment as a law enforcement officer due to poor employment standing. Requires state and county law enforcement agencies to make appropriate disclosers.

The EO stated that the agenda was incorrect and the bill should be S.B. 2429 and not S.B. 2428 S.D.1. as indicated on the agenda.

The EO reported that this bill was heard by the Senate Committee on Commerce, Consumer Protection, and Health and has been deferred indefinitely.

b. <u>H.B. 2061 Relating to Private Detectives and Guards</u> (companion S.B 2058)

Prohibits private detectives and guards from self-identifying as law enforcement officers, police, or police officers and from wearing or using any badge, uniform, equipment, vehicle, or other accoutrement capable of being associated with of a law enforcement organization. Requires review and approval of any badge, uniform, equipment, vehicle, or other accoutrement to be used by private detectives and guards.

The EO reported the bill was heard by the Committee on Consumer Protection and was passed as is and therefore is still moving through the legislative process.

c. S.B. 2058 Relating to Private Detectives and Guards

Prohibits private detectives and guards from self-identifying as law enforcement officers, police, or police officers and from wearing or using any badge, uniform, equipment, vehicle, or other accoutrement capable of being associated with of a law enforcement organization.

Requires review and approval of any badge, uniform, equipment, vehicle, or other accoutrement to be used by private detectives and guards.

The EO reported that the bill was heard by the House Committee on Public Safety and Consumer Protection and passed unamended.

d. H.B. 2571- Relating to Guards

Creates a narrowly defined subcategory of guards, called watchpersons, who are allowed to be unregistered for sixty days but must meet all the requirements of a guard to continue working in a guard capacity after sixty-day period.

The EO reported that the bill was heard by the Committee on Intrastate Commerce and was deferred indefinitely.
