		These bills seek to substitute the term "Board of Veterinary Medicine" wherever the term "Board of Veterinary Examiners" appears.		

After discussion, it was moved by Vice-Chairperson Dr. Kaufman, seconded by Ms. Maluafiti, and unanimously carried to support House Bill No. 2060 and Senate Bill No. 2201.

B. <u>Senate Bill No. 2260 – Relating to Veterinary Medicine</u>

This bill seeks to amend HRS chapter 471 by adding a new section: "Requirement to make copies of previously written prescriptions available free of charge".

Board members expressed concern with potential misuse or abuse of prescription products as the bill does not differentiate between current and expired prescriptions or between prescriptions of controlled and non-controlled substances. The bill also requires veterinarians to provide this service without compensation, which may interfere with the operations of a veterinary establishment. Discussion ensued about the intent of the bill. Board members commented that if the intent is for purposes of recordkeeping, the animal's medical record includes the animal's prescription history. An owner may request for their animal's medical record from their licensed veterinarian at any time.

It was moved by Vice-Chairperson Kaufman, seconded by Dr. Lee Loy, and unanimously carried to oppose Senate Bill No. 2260.

The Board, by consensus, took the following agenda item order out of order.

### <u>New Business</u>: B. <u>DCCA-PVL Exam Branch – Response to tracking of</u> incorrect answers

Dave Grupen, Acting PVL Examination Chief was welcomed by the Board. Mr. Grupen stated he was here at the request of Executive Officer Lynn Bhanot and the Board to provide exam statistics, specifically tracking of incorrect answers.

Mr. Grupen provided a brief summary of the P-values of exam questions taken for test period: July 1, 2016 – June 30, 2017. The Board thanked Mr. Grupen for providing the statistics and requested to review the "extreme questions" with P-value above .90 or below .10, and as well as the current exam and the exam test bank at their next meeting.

Mr. Grupen informed the Board that he is currently working with the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affair's Business Management Officer to reevaluate testing contracts, which includes the administration of Veterinary exams, to procure a testing proctor to administer and come up with exam development.

# A. <u>Implementation of ACT 147, SLH 2016 – Registration of</u> <u>Veterinary Technicians effective 7/1/2018</u>

Executive Officer Kleinhans provided a brief update to the implementation of Act 147, SLH 2016 – Registration of

> Veterinary Technicians, effect July 1, 2018. The registration application may be available in February. Applicants will need to submit an application that is evaluated by the Program before they are eligible to take the exam.

<u>Correspondence</u>: A. <u>Inquiry from Erika: "Can a local veterinary office be</u> <u>bought by a national corporation and does the owner or</u> <u>one of the principals/partners need to have a Hawaii VET</u> <u>license?</u>

> Discussion ensued on the inquiry received by the Board. The Board concluded that this issue is not in their jurisdiction as the Board's laws and rules regarding the licensing of Veterinarians (HRS chapter 471 and Hawaii Administrative Rules ("HAR") chapter 16-101) are silent. The Board suggested the inquirer could review or have an attorney review HRS chapter 414 and HRS chapter 415A, as it illustrates the differences between Corporations and Professional Corporations.
