a. Record of Candidates Examined: For the Examination for Professional Practice in Psychology ("EPPP")

Executive Officer Ferrer requested to defer this until the next meeting.

b. <u>Association of State and Provincial Psychology Boards ("ASPPB")</u>
Psychology Licensure Universal System (PLUS)®

This system allows users to bank information in the Credentials Bank. The ASPPB primary source verifies the information and forwards the information to the jurisdiction for which application is being made. The system facilitates the application process and helps increase mobility potential for licensees.

c. <u>Discussion on report of general examinee information and pass/fail results for the EPPP; preparation for exam; how institutions maintain standards for curriculum</u>

EO Ferrer stated that, based on preliminary research, it could not be determined if certain doctoral programs are linked to low EPPP scores. She will continue to review the data and report her findings to the Board.

EO Ferrer informed the Board that she contacted the ASPPB and invited them to attend the October 26, 2018 Board meeting to discuss the EPPP2. She is awaiting their response.

<u>Legislative Matters</u>: a. <u>Act 002, SLH 2018 (HB 2739, HD1), Relating to Health – </u>

Establishes a regulated process under which an adult resident of the State with a medically confirmed terminal disease and less than six months to live may choose to obtain a prescription for medication to end the patient's life. Imposes criminal sanctions for tampering with a patient's request for a prescription or coercing a patient to request a prescription.

EO Ferrer requested to delete this from the agenda.
