Call to Order: The Vice Chair called the meeting to order at 8:41 a.m. at which time quorum was established.

Chair's Report: **Announcements/Introductions**

The Vice Chair excused Ms. Boyer and Dr. Napoleon and asked the audience to introduce themselves.

Approval of the Previous Minutes – June 7, 2018

The Chair called for a motion in regard to the minutes of the July 5, 2018 meeting.

There being no discussion or amendments, upon a motion by Ms. Daub, seconded by Mr. Duldulao, it was voted on and unanimously carried to approve the minutes of the July 5, 2018 meeting as circulated.

2018 Legislature

The EO reported on the status of the following bills:

HB 1906, HD2, SD2, CD1 Relating to Health Care Workers – Makes intentionally or knowingly causing bodily injury to a health care worker a Class C felony. (CD1) Governor approved 7/6/2018, Act 147, SLH 2018

HB 2375, HD1, SD1, Relating to Temporary Disability Insurance – Permits advanced practice registered nurses to certify an employee's disability. Increases the penalty an employer is assessed for failing to submit timely wage and employment information. Permits filing of an appeal of a decision related to

temporary disability insurance at the various offices of the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations throughout the State. Allows the department to send notices of hearing electronically or by first-class mail. Clarifies that when the notice of hearing cannot be delivered to a party in the appeal, the notice may be given by online posting on the department's webpage. Allows the parties to a hearing to appear in person, via telephone, or by other communication devices. (SD1) Governor approved on 7/10/2018, Act 162 SLH 2018

SB 2407, SD1, HD1, CD1 – Relating to Medical Cannabis - Allows the use of medical cannabis to treat opioid use, substance use, and withdrawal symptoms resulting from the treatment of those conditions. (CD1) 5/3/2018 Enrolled to Governor. 6/25/2018 Notice of Intent to Veto. Governor vetoed on 7/10/2018.

HB 2729, HD2, SD2, CD1 Relating to Cannabis for Medical Use – Establishes standards and criteria for reciprocity for qualifying out-of-state medical cannabis patients and caregivers including limitations, and safeguards. Authorizes extension of written certifications of a debilitating condition for up to three years for chronic conditions. Clarifies a dispensary licensee's right to retest marijuana or manufactured cannabis products for compliance with standards. Authorizes establishment of a bona fide provider-patient relationship via telehealth. Authorizes dispensing of devices that provide safe pulmonary administration of medical cannabis by dispensary licensees. Increases the allowable tetrahydrocannabinol limit for of certain manufactured cannabis products. Limits felony convictions that disqualify an individual from employment with a dispensary licensee. Establishes a working group to make recommendations regarding employment of qualifying patients and manufacture and dispensing of edible cannabis products. (HB2729 CD1) Governor approved on 7/6/2018, Act 116, SLH 2018

SB 2646, SD1, HD3, CD1 Relating to Prescription Drugs - Requires prescribers of certain controlled substances to consult the State's Electronic Prescription Accountability System before issuing a prescription for the controlled substance, under certain circumstances. Provides that a violation by a prescriber shall not be subject to criminal penalty provisions but that a violation may be grounds for professional discipline. Repeals on 6/30/2023. (CD1) Governor approved on 7/9/2018, Act 153, SLH 2018

Amendments to Title 16, Chapter 89 – Public Hearing Tentatively Scheduled for September 6, 2018

The EO reported that the Notice of Public Hearing was published in the newspapers, including neighbor island papers on July 30, 2018. The public notice is scheduled for 8:30 a.m. on Thursday, September 6, 2018 with the BON meeting to immediately follow.

The EO asked the Vice Chair if he would be willing to run the public hearing and BON meeting in September.

He agreed.

Nursys – Status Report

The EO reported that she is waiting for final confirmation from our IT people on data submission before she can sign the agreement.

Continuing Competency

Status Report on Recognition of CE Courses Approved by Other State BONs

The EO reported that she checked the member board profile to see if other BONs had a process for approving CE courses, but could not find any information. She stated that she will have to check with each state and that this process could take some time.

Inquiry Regarding Preceptor Learning Activity Option

The Board addressed the following email inquiry:

“I am a Hawaii state RN license holder and would like to ask whether my practice indicates below would be fit with a requirement of learning activities or not. I thought it comes under a category of “120 Hours as a Preceptor for One (1) Nursing Student or Employee Transitioning into New Clinical Practice Area”

My practice is;

I am the outreach director of a pediatric hospital in Lao P.D.R (Lao Friend Hospital for Children <https://fwab.org/laos/>) My role in the hospital is educating Lao medical staff and a social worker through outreach homecare activities.

If it doesn't apply, could you explain about reasons for it? If you have any question, please let me know.

Thank you very much for your support and looking forward to hearing from you soon.”

Ms. Kim stated that it was unclear that her role at the hospital met the definition of “Continuing competency” defined in HRS §457-2, “Continuing competency” means the long-term educational and professional process by which an individual undertakes and documents with verifiable evidence a personal learning plan that encompasses a periodic self-assessment of personal strengths and weaknesses as present in the individuals practice as a nurse as well as a commitment to

furthering the individual's professional knowledge relating to the nursing field. and §457-9.5(a)5) that states:

§457-9.3 Learning activity options. (a) The successful completion of one of the following shall meet the learning activity options requirements for continuing competency:

- (5) Participation as a preceptor, for at least one nursing student or employee transitioning into new clinical practice areas for at least one hundred twenty hours, in a one-to-one relationship as part of an organized preceptorship program; provided that the licensee may precept more than one student or employee during the one hundred twenty hours and shall be evidenced by documentation of hours completed and objectives of the preceptorship by the institution supervising the student;

Also for further clarification, the following statement was included in the Continuing Competency booklet:

*Precepting for orientation specific to employment (i.e. computer course, documentation, human resource policies or being oriented/precepted to a position) does **NOT** count.*

After careful consideration, it was the consensus of the Board to respond to the inquiry as follows:

The information submitted was insufficient to determine if the activity meets the definition of "Continuing competency" as defined in HRS §457-2 and the description of preceptor activities in §457-9.3(a)5).

Inquiry Regarding Medical Skills Trainer Count Towards Preceptor Learning Activity Option?

The Board addressed the following email inquiry:

"I work at Kokua Kalihi Valley Health Center and we started a new program/school for medical Assistants. It is a seven (7 months) program where students are taught skills to be a medical assistant. Lectures are done online but clinical skills are taught at our clinic. Students clinic skill days are also done at our clinic. Clinical skills include taking vital signs such as blood pressure, temperature, pulse, respiration, do EKG, how to give injections, prepare for minor surgeries, etc.

My part of this program/school is to be their medical skills trainer as well as their preceptor. I meet students each week for their clinical skills and then precept them as they spend their time in the clinic with patients.

I was wondering if my being a medical skills trainer and preceptor be considered as one of the learning Activity Options. **Learning Activity Options-120 Hours as a Preceptor for one (1) Nursing Student or Employable Transitioning into New Clinical Practice Area**

If so, what kind of paper works do you require for proof?"

After careful consideration, it was the consensus of the Board to respond to the inquiry as follows:

The information submitted was insufficient to determine if the activity meets the definition of "Continuing competency" as defined in HRS §457-2 and the description of preceptor activities in §457-9.3(a)(5) since she would not be training nursing students.

Army's Pregnancy and Postpartum and Physical Training Programs Count Towards Continuing Education Learning Activity Option?

The Board addressed the following email inquiry:

"I am writing to request assistance with the process for reviewing and obtaining nursing CEU credit. I am DOD employee working for Fort Jackson. I recently took a 40-hour distance learning program for the Army's Pregnancy and Postpartum and Physical Training Program. After the distance learning was completed, I had to visit Fort Riley, Kansas for the 28 hours on site course. Following graduation, we were given our certificates and advised to reach out to our respective boards for guidance on CEU approval."

After careful consideration, the Board could not determine if this course was an approved provider of continuing education as listed in the Continuing Competency booklet on page(s) 19-21.

Scope of Practice

"Battlefield Acupuncture"

The Board discussed the following inquiry asking if "Battlefield Acupuncture" falls within the scope of practice of nurses:

“Battlefield Acupuncture is part of the Whole Health initiative that the VA is promoting to provide optimal care to our Veterans.

The Purpose statement for RS/Battlefield Acupuncture through the Department of Veterans Affairs, Employee Education System and the Office of Patient Centered care & Cultural Transformation reads:

The purpose of this course is to train physicians and healthcare providers the technique of Battlefield Acupuncture. Battlefield Acupuncture is a single, limited , ear acupuncture technique developed as an effective pain relief with minimal adverse effects. BFA is a rapid, safe, portable, accessible method for pain relief and is deployable in all medical environments. BFA does not replace standard medical care for war related injuries but offers an alternative for pain relief for acute or chronic conditions that may reduce the need for opioid medications. The outcome of this training is to promote optimal care delivery to Veterans by providing safe alternatives in the management of pain.

The target audience is comprised of healthcare providers including but not limited to Physicians, Physicians Assistants, and Nurses (Nurse practitioners and Registered Nurses).

I have attached a Patient information sheet, PowerPoint Presentation, Patient Information and Aftercare Instruction Sheet and my BFA Certificate.

I know that “needling” or injecting patients is within the scope of practice for Registered Nurses.

We are not trained in Traditional Acupuncture, only BFA.”

The EO reported that the inquiry was also emailed to the EO for the Board of Acupuncture who responded as follows:

“Based on the information provided, appears that Battlefield Acupuncture is synonymous to auricular acupuncture. This technique requires an acupuncture license to be performed in Hawaii.”

After careful consideration, it was the consensus of the Board that this specific activity may not fall within the nursing scope of practice and requires a separate acupuncture license.

In accordance with HAR §16-201-90, the above interpretation is for informational and explanatory purposes only and based solely on the information provided. It is not an official opinion or decision and therefore not binding upon the Board.

Microbiology Pre-Requisites for Nursing Programs

The Board deferred the following inquiry to the Education Committee:

“I am a microbiology educator working with the American Society for Microbiology’s committee on Microbiology in Nursing and Allied Health (MINAH). We are looking for evidence of microbiology as a pre-requisite for nursing and allied health programs around the United States. Could you direct me to information on pre-requisite courses for nursing programs required by the Hawaii Board of Nursing?”

July 2, 2018 Letter from the National Transportation Safety Board – “Closed – Unacceptable Action”

A copy of the letter was distributed to the Board members.

Hawaii State Center for Nursing:

Ms. Reichhardt reported on her article “Op-ed” Why an inaccurate “overworked nurses” report poorly reflects Hawaii’s nursing efforts”, in response to a report from the Medicare Health Plans that stated Hawaii has the fewest nurses per capita in the nation that includes what was equivalent to the LPN workforce and not including the RN nurses. *(Ms. Reichhardt gave a report on this issue at the July BON meeting.)*

She also reported on the Hawaii Nurse Education Capacity Report published on July 25, 2018 that summarizes the State’s nurse education, including current capacity and barriers to sustainability and growth.
