| Call to Order: | There being a quorum present, the meeting was called to order at 12:03 p.m. by Chairperson McKay. | | | |

After discussion, it was moved by Chairperson McKay, seconded by Ms. Severson, and unanimously carried to approve the Settlement Agreements relating to the <u>Matter of the</u> <u>Beauty Operator License of SARAH A. WHITE, formerly known</u> <u>as Sarah A. Schweibish</u>; BAR 2015-132-L, the <u>Matter of the</u> <u>Beauty Operator's License of ASHLY K. COPP</u>; BAR 2018-67-L, the <u>Matter of the Beauty Operator's License of RENEE E.</u> <u>RUSSO</u>; BAR 2018-62-L, and the <u>Matter of the Beauty</u> Operator's License of LISA A. NOLDER; BAR 2018-79-L.

At 12:16 p.m., the Board reconvened its scheduled meeting. Chairperson McKay announced that the Board will review applications in Executive Session. After review, the Board will return to its regular order of business.

At 12:20 p.m., it was moved by Chairperson McKay, seconded by Mr. Choi, and unanimously carried for the Board to enter into Executive Session to consider and evaluate personal information relating to individuals applying for licensure in accordance with HRS section 92-5(a)(1), and to consult with the Board's attorney on questions and issues pertaining to the Board's powers, duties, privileges, immunities, and liabilities in accordance with HRS section 92-5(a)(4).

EXECUTIVE SESSION

At 12:27 p.m., it was moved by Chairperson McKay, seconded by Mr. Choi, and unanimously carried for the Board to move out of Executive Session.

Licensing Examination of The National-Interstate Council of State Boards of Cosmetology ("NIC"): Executive Officer Cabral summarized previous discussions by the Board whereby the Board had expressed their interest in the administration of the NIC exam. She stated that the Board has three options to implement the NIC exam: (1) Begin the procurement process with Acting Examination Branch Chief, Dave Grupen, and place a bid for the examination, (2) begin the procurement process and justify that the NIC exam is a sole source and it would not be viable to place a bid for the exam; or (3) submit an administration bill to require the NIC exam by statute. Executive Officer Cabral added that the third option may be the fastest and easiest option.

Discussion ensued on the procurement process. Supervising Executive Officer Quiogue stated that there is a possibility that the Board will not contract with NIC if the Board elected to begin with the procurement process.

Chairperson McKay asked if Prometric would be able to comply with the NIC. She noted that in some jurisdictions, the NIC is administered daily.

Executive Officer Cabral stated that factors on walk-in examinations depend on resources from both administration and the testing contractor.

Ms. Williams commented that she would prefer weekly examinations in lieu of daily walk-in examinations.

Mr. Choi reported that the NIC exam is web-based and is proctored through PSI. He added that NIC may have to contract with Hawaii PSI prior to implementation.

Executive Officer Kleinhans noted that several Boards and Programs handled by the Professional and Vocational Licensing Division currently have contracts with testing agencies that administer their examinations through PSI locations in Hawaii.

Eyelash Extension Training: Can a licensed esthetician train Inquiry: Α. other people to be eyelash artists? Chairperson McKay stated that there are concerns that licensed estheticians are teaching individuals that are registered as apprentices. Guest, Mary Ronnow, requested to speak on the matter. Chairperson McKay recognized Ms. Ronnow. Ms. Ronnow reported that there are businesses that rent an unlicensed hotel room to teach classes. The location of a class is only revealed until the individual pays to sit for the class. Chairperson McKay stated that historically, vendors were required to get a permit, but was unsure which Department granted the permits. Mr. Ronnow clarified that the permit was a certificate. Executive Officer Cabral referenced Hawaii Administrative Rules ("HAR") section 16-78-37(5) which states that the practice of cosmetology shall be carried by a licensed beauty operator in a licensed beauty shop, except at educational activities conducted in connection with any monthly, annual, or other special program from which the general public is excluded. Mr. Choi commented that the phrase "general public" is ambiguous and could be interpreted in many ways. DAG Jayaram reminded the Board of its previous determination from the October meeting, adding the general public means anybody without a license. He noted that for a licensed esthetician to train an unlicensed individual, the options are to either open a shop or to have the individual register as an apprentice. After discussion, by consensus, the Board agreed that for a licensed esthetician to train an unlicensed individual, the options are to either open a shop or to have the individual register as an apprentice. In accordance with HAR section 16-201-90, the above

B. Eyelash Extension Training: What requirements need to be met in order to train/teach/give workshops in Hawaii?

After discussion, by consensus, the Board agreed training/teaching/giving workshops in Hawaii require a license and the individuals being trained need to be properly registered.

In accordance with HAR section 16-201-90, the above interpretation is for informational and explanatory purposes only. It is not an official opinion or decision, and thus, is not to be viewed as binding on the Board.

C. Makeup Lessons: Can a licensed esthetician offer makeup lessons to the public or teach methods to clients using clients' personal products?

Executive Officer Cabral stated HAR section 16-78-36(4) exempts manufacturer's representatives or sales persons in retail outlets who sell beauty products or techniques for promotional purposes without compensation for the cosmetology services.

Mr. Choi asked if there has been a public crisis regarding makeup. Ms. Williams mentioned an incident where beauty school students shared makeup and caught pink eye, although she was unsure of the jurisdiction. Chairperson McKay noted that sanitation is a priority.

After discussion, by consensus, the Board determined that if the lessons are done in a school, the school must be properly licensed and the instructor needs the appropriate license to teach the full esthetic program. Further, the lessons may not be performed in a workshop unless it falls in the exemption of HAR section 16-78-36(4).

In accordance with HAR section 16-201-90, the above interpretation is for informational and explanatory purposes only. It is not an official opinion or decision, and thus, is not to be viewed as binding on the Board.

Supervising Executive Officer Quiogue left the meeting at 1:19pm.

Guests Ronnow and Montenero left the meeting at 1:19pm.

Executive Officer Cabral noted that the Board did not yet make a motion on the applications previously reviewed in Executive Session.

The barber/beauty shop applications above were preliminarily reviewed by licensing branch staff, Executive Officer Cabral, and Chairperson McKay (Board member designated to review the barber/beauty shop applications for consideration at this Board meeting).

Chairperson McKay confirmed that she had reviewed the eighteen (18) applications, and determined that they met all the requirements for barber/beauty shop licenses, and recommends approval.

After discussion, it was moved by Chairperson McKay, seconded by Mr. Choi, and unanimously carried to approve the eighteen (18) barber/beauty shop applications listed above.

<u>Application</u> <u>Process</u>: Executive Officer Cabral commented that the licensing branch receives applications were several recurring deficiencies and that the application may need updating. She added that the application may be simplified to include an attestation to Department of Health sanitation requirements. If the application is amended and no longer requires review on subject-matter, it may be justified for the Board to delegate the responsibility of approving shop applications to the Executive Officer. Further, the delegation of the approval of shop applications to the Executive Officer will expedite the application process.

Discussion ensued on the Barber/Beauty shop application procedures and process. Mr. Choi emphasized the concern on sanitation.

DAG Jayaram left the meeting at 2:00pm.

Ms. Severson noted the lease agreement requirement relates to "booth renters" and stated that most leases do not involve agreements between a sublessee and a landlord, however there are provisions within the lease that allow a lessee to sublease.

Further discussion ensued on the operator-in-charge requirement. Chairperson McKay stated that application amendments should still allow the Board and the Executive Officer to determine if a shop has an operator-in-charge licensed in the appropriate category to perform the service.
