Call to Order:	There being a quorum present, the meeting was called to order at 9:00 a.m. by Chair Yumol.		
Agenda: Additions and Revisions:	Since Mr. Garduque was present, a motion was made by Mr. Iwamoto, seconded by Mr. Fujiwara and unanimously carried to move agenda item 5b ahead of other business.		

5b. Mr. Garduque presented his research regarding the update on license certificate re-design. The Hawaii state council just recently received it. It's

subject to negotiation. The information he presented was current as of July 17, 2018. The proposal could be updated after 30 days. He contacted three different vendors. Hagadone, HonBlue Electric Pencil and Edwards. The bid from Edwards was the lowest. For efficiency and cost effectiveness, 5,000 certificates should be ordered in the inaugural year. Based on unit costs and monthly overprints for the profession, it would be \$75.00 per month. They'd also provide welcome postcards which would invite the candidates to join. A quantity of 5,000 for initial order would cost .45 per piece. The cost per certificate would be \$9.92. The assumption would be that EASLA would provide the gold seal. The certificates would reflect the name, date and license number. The goal would be 1,000 per year. There would be an upcharge yearly should the Board Chair change and digital signature need to be created.

His pitch to the Hawaii State Council is for 7,709 initially amongst the professions. The monthly count would be 670. This must be negotiated between the state and Edwards. Mr. Kobashigawa asked if the plan is to share costs amongst the EASLA professions. Mr. Garduque affirmed this, also stating that the Engineers make up the bulk and the architects have the least amount of members. All of the organizations must agree.

DAG Jayaram mentioned that DCCA must handle the processing/mailing of state documents. A third party is not authorized to handle state documents. That would have to be done by DCCA staff. So, the third party would print out (blank) certificates, then send to DCCA for storage, licensees list. The certificates would be sent back to the third party to print (with data), then back to DCCA for mailing, as the certificates are official state documents.

Chair Yumol asked if the last entity to handle the certificates would be the state. Mr. Kurokawa questioned the cost to the state. DAG Jayaram reiterated that the vendor would print and send back to us (DCCA) to mail. Ms. Matsushima questioned whether the courier would be authorized to handle the certificates. DAG Jayaram's concern was that there could be internal staffing issues. He also asked who would own the design. Mr. Garduque was unsure and said he would need to check. DAG Jayaram's thought is that if it's a state document, the design should be owned by the Board. Chair Yumol recommended that be addressed later. DAG Jayaram recommended that Mr. Garduque go back and discuss ownership.

Mr. Katayama asked to see the design. Mr. Garduque passed the sample around for all to view. Mr. Kobashigawa mentioned that the current certificates indicate the discipline and asked if the proposed certificates would also reflect that. Chair Yumol mentioned that the millennials seem to like the new design. Ms. Matsushima shared that currently the fee is \$10.00 (to the licensee.) Chair Yumol asked Mr. Garduque who was involved in the meetings and thought it a good idea for Ms. Matsushima and possibly DAG Jayaram to be included as well. Chair Yumol thanked Mr. Garduque and

excused him.

The Examination Branch is working with Ms. Matsushima. NCARB will send a secure/encrypted version. Ms. Matsushima will check to ensure that it works properly. Does your state allow unlicensed individuals to have "Engineer" titles, do engineering work, and present to the public as "Engineer," with the only requirement that they are supervised by a PE? _____Yes, our state has an interpretation similar to the PE Supervisor Exception _____No

Does the Board of Engineers for your state allow unlicensed engineers as listed above, with the only restriction on professional title "Engineer" to be limited to "Professional Engineer," Structural Engineer," or some similar limited restrictions for engineer title? _____ Yes, unlicensed individuals may do engineering work with PE supervision (but not have Engineer title) _____ No

Does your state allow unlicensed individuals to do engineering work under the supervision of a PE, but without professional title "Engineer" and they cannot introduce themselves to the public as an "Engineer?" (this is an alternate interpretation of Washington State Law). _____Yes, unlicensed individuals may do engineering work with PE supervision (but not have Engineer title) _____ No
