<u>Act 35, SLH</u> <u>2010 Update</u> The Executive Officer informed the Board that in June and July, 2018, University of Hawaii Honolulu Community College approved the following electrical academic coursework:

<u>New Business:</u> a) Experience Verification Form – Electrician Only

The Board reviewed the proposed changes to the Experience Verification Form – Electrician Only.

Mr. Takahashi and Mr. Imamoto inquired if it might be possible to see a copy of the proposed changes that is included in the Board's meeting packet.

Ms. Tamanaha provided a copy for them to refer to.

Chair Akamu informed the Board that the electrician members of the Applications Committee have started working on making some amendments to the experience verification form for electricians.

Chair Akamu stated that one of the duties of the industry members of this Board is to review the respective applications and try to determine if the applicant has the necessary skills to perform the work. With evolving and expanding technology in the electrical industry, the current and past Board members have been striving to provide the public a level of confidence that the newly licensed person has the skills to work unsupervised.

Chair Akamu explained further that the proposed revisions of the "Specific Work Process/Task" section are based on the current, 2017, edition of the NEC and include the following areas of expertise for an electrician:

Branch circuit wiring: installation of cable assemblies/wires; termination of wires and panelboards; installation of receptacles, switches, light fixtures, signal, and other electrical devices including, but not limited to transformers and magnetic starters/contactors; single and three-phase systems of various voltages.

If applying for EJ, minimum of 5,000 hours If applying for EJI, minimum of 1,000 hours

Conduit installation: installation of rigid conduit, electrical metallic tubing, polyvinyl chloride conduit, flexible metal conduit, metal molding, and any other apparatus designed to carry electrical wires.

If applying for EJ, minimum of 2,000 hours If applying for EJI, minimum of 1,000 hours

Industrial wiring: installation and maintenance of substation equipment, switchboards, bus ducts, automatic controls, cable splicing, and other industrial work.

If applying for EJI, minimum of 5,000 hours

Specialized wiring: electric power generating systems (installation of PV systems, wind and/or water power generation systems, including conduit installation, grounding and conductor installation, appurtenances related to the operation of electric power generating systems); other systems (installation and maintenance of temperature and refrigeration controls, motor generators, etc.).

No minimums for any electrician license classes

Low voltage systems: installation of communication and signal wires and related equipment associated with communications systems, perimeter/video and fire alarms, signal/call systems, master or community radio/television receiving antenna systems, sound public address and other systems operating at 50 volts or less. **If applying for EJS, minimum of 5,000 hours**

Ms. Tamanaha asked Chair Akamu and Mr. Lucero to confirm that the committee was not looking for EJ applicants to have at least some minimum experience – for instance, 500 hours - in specialized wiring.

Chair Akamu responded that the committee felt that it was very important for an EJ applicant to have their 7,000 hours in branch circuit wiring and conduit installation, but they did not want to limit the type of experience for the remaining 3,000 hours.

When it comes to EJS licensees, they would have an option to either have all of their 6,000 hours of experience in low voltage work or the minimum of 5,000 hours in low voltage and 1,000 hours in other types of electrical work.

Ms. Tamanaha suggested that, since the changed form covers most of the license classes, it would be logical to also add an "electrical maintenance" section:

> Electrical Maintenance: keeping in repair and operation of any and all existing electrical installations, apparatus, and equipment, and any extensions to these installations, apparatus, and equipment that do not exceed one branch circuit capacity for each specific extension; provided that electrical maintenance work shall not include new installations; new branch circuit wiring; additions or modifications to any existing electrical installations, apparatus, and equipment; repairs to electrical service

> equipment; or any other work that requires a building or electrical permit from the counties; and provided further that any replacements of existing electrical installations, apparatus, and equipment shall be done with the same electrical fixtures, devices, and equipment.

If applying for EM, minimum of 2,000 hours

Ms. Tamanaha stated that she would draft the form with the proposed changes and bring the updated version to the next meeting for the Board to review.

Ms. Tamanaha also suggested that the Board's plumber industry members take a look at the current experience verification form for plumbers and see if it should be updated as well.

Mr. Brady and Mr. Hiraki expressed their agreement.

Chair Akamu noted that a lot more details could've been included in the description of required experience, but the committee members had to consider the space limitations of a form.

Ms. Tamanaha remarked that the committee members do not need to feel limited by the current length of the form. It is always possible to add an extra page, if the Board feels that there should be more information.
