d. Private Detective and Guard Positions included in DCCA's Budget

The EO stated that the approval for an Office Assistant V to help our current clerk with the Private Detective and Guard Board was added to the Budget. The EO stated that she sent a memo to the Director based on that position to establish and fill. Once the paperwork is completed the Department can request a list to recruit for the position. The Office Assistant V is a position that we keep open for continual recruitment, so it will be up to our Licensing Branch Division Chief to be responsible for the interviewing, hiring, and training of a new clerk. There are also Office Assistant IV within our Division that can also apply for the position. Based on these factors, the EO stated it would be very difficult to say when this position will be filled because there are also logistical concerns including office space because Legislation also approved two positions for the Medical Board. She stated her hope that we already have people on the current list ready to be interviewed which will help speed up the process.

The Chair asked if any members of the Board had any comments or concerns.

There being none, the Chair asked members of the audience if anyone had any comments or concerns and if so to first introduce themselves.

The first guest, identified himself as Lee Donohue. He stated he represented Securitas. He stated that he and several other members in the industry were here today to voice their concerns on the length of time everything is taking. He went on to explain that since the implementation of requiring a guard card, the industry has taken a huge loss due to overtime costs and inability to man posts. He stated that they are happy to see that another position is being added because there has been a lot of money already lost.

The Chair thanked everyone who was there for item 6d for coming out to voice their concerns and for their support at the legislature the positions added to DCCA's budget.

The EO stated the Department doesn't have the expertise to develop exams and to keep current with industry trends and applicable references with the requisites so the Department is looking to outsource the examination development. However, she stated that the department would need to entertain a bid through the Procurement process and find a testing contractor that will not only take on PD and GD exam, but all other areas not requiring a national exam.

Another issue with the Board's exam is that references are outdated. Thus, applicants have been provided with website addresses where they are able to obtain the required exam references at a reasonable price.

a. 4-Hour Continuing Education Curriculum Review

(i) Solutions-4-Security

It was moved by the Chair, seconded by the Vice Chair and unanimously carried to approve the above 4-Hour Continuing Education Curriculum for the June 2021 renewal submitted by David Heaukulani.

b. Definitions of "Guard" 463-1

(i) Minutes from the March 17, 2011 Meeting

The EO explained that questions whether current law enforcement officers may work in a guard capacity for part time employment and if so whether they need a guard registration has been resurfacing. Therefore, the EO wanted to provide the Board with the March 17, 2011 meeting minutes to advise them of a prior determination. She cited: "the Board determined that governmental officers or personnel who are employed by a law enforcement agency, are not required to comply with the new guard registration and training requirements imposed by Act 208, nor are they required to obtain a guard agency or individual guard licenses"

Mr. Chang stated that he has also received several calls by Hotels who use off-duty law enforcement officers for security who do not hold a GDE license and want to know if they are in compliance.

Mr. Inouye questioned whether this interpretation meant that police officers didn't need a guard card while working as a police officer or if this meant they didn't need to obtain a guard card for off-duty work as well?

Mr. Chang stated that with our current rules they would be precluded from obtaining a guard card.

The EO explained that in the prior meetings, they felt that the duty to respond and enforce their powers were 24/7 and therefore they were exempt from Act 208 registration for part-time employment. The EO stated that she wanted to seek confirmation that nothing has changed. She asked the Board to look at the definition of law enforcement officer, the statues, and the intent of Act 208 which was about insuring guards are trained. The EO explained that the Board has now had 5 years to review its implementation, and asked whether the Board's position has changed?

Mr. Chang stated the question is whether current law enforcement officers can work?

The Vice Chair stated that that based upon the March 17, 2011 determination, the Board determined that they can work but do they need a card? There are some employers that want all their employees to have a guard card but due to the law, their part time law enforcement officers cannot obtain one.

Mr. Inouye stated that practically speaking because there is such a need for quality security guards, the Board would want to encourage law enforcement officers to apply. Mr. Inouye stated that he can see the negative side of law enforcement officers working in a guard capacity if an incident occurs who assumes the liability the city and county or the private entity?

Executive Session: At 11:56 a.m., it was moved by the Vice Chair, seconded by the Executive Officers, and unanimously carried to move into executive session pursuant to HRS §92-5 to consider and evaluate personal information relating to individuals applying for professional or vocational licenses cited in section HRS §26-9 or both, as provided in HRS §92-5(a)(1).

#### EXECUTIVE SESSION

At 12:26 p.m., it was moved by the Vice Chair, seconded by the Mr. Inouye, and unanimously carried to move out of executive session.

With a motion by the Vice Chair, seconded by Mr. Inouye and unanimously carried the Board reaffirmed its position that a Law enforcement officer need not register pursuant to HRS 463-10 to act as a guard. However, the consensus of the Board is that a law enforcement officer should be eligible for a guard card should they or their employee desire one. To enable the ability of the Board to issue a registration to a current law enforcement officer, the Board must amend the Board's rule section 16-97-8 to remove the conflict of interest.

(ii) Job Positions Exempt from GDE Registrations (7/27/18)

The Board asserted that the list will remain the same.

#### c. Proposed Rule Amendments

- (ii) Creation of a new part of Guard Employees

The Board decided to wait to amend 16-97-8 until changes to create a new part for Guard employees to address procedures established for implementations of Act 208.

Scope: a. Email inquiry whether a Private Detective license is required to conduct online investigations.

The Board deferred the email inquiry pending a better description of the intended investigation services the respondent plans to provide.
