- Call to Order: The meeting was called to order at 1:06 p.m., at which time quorum was established.
- Approval of the September 13, 2018, Minutes: It was moved by Dr. Holt, seconded by Vice-Chair Halford, and unanimously carried to approve the minutes of the executive session and the minutes of the open session of the September 13, 2018, meeting as circulated.
- Dr. Mailman entered the meeting room at 1:08 p.m.**
- Introduction of Guests: Board members and staff introduced themselves to Dr. Mailman.

Dr. Mailman was excused from the meeting room at 1:10 p.m.

Adjudicatory
Matter:

Chair Geimer-Flanders called for a recess from the meeting at 1:10 p.m. to discuss and deliberate on the following adjudicatory matters pursuant to Chapter 91, HRS:

- a. In the Matter of the License to Practice Medicine of M. Kathryn Schaefer, M.D., also known as Mary K. Schaefer; MED 2017-203-L

Dr. Akaka and Dr. Halford recused themselves from the discussion and voting on this matter and left the meeting room at 1:10 p.m.

After discussion, it was moved by Dr. Bintliff, seconded by Dr. Young, and unanimously carried to approve the Settlement Agreement Prior to Filing of Petition for Disciplinary Action and Board's Final Order.

The Board instructed Ms. Quiogue to advise Dr. Schaefer that she shall complete a minimum of twenty (20) hours of in-person (live) continuing education courses in ethics, which shall include topics in honesty, falsification of records, and professionalism. The ethics course(s) must also be AMA PRA Category 1 approved.

Dr. Akaka and Dr. Halford returned to the meeting room at 1:13 p.m.

After due consideration of the information received, it was moved by Dr. Akaka, seconded by Mr. Puleasi, and carried by a majority, with the exception of Dr. Egami, Dr. Sept, and Dr. Chun, who opposed the motion, to approve Dr. Mailman's application for licensure subject to certain conditions and limitations:

The Board based its decision on the following grounds of the Hawaii Revised Statutes ("HRS") and Hawaii Administrative Rules ("HAR"), which find support in the records and files of Dr. Mailman's application:

- HRS §436B-19(9): Conduct or practice contrary to the recognized standards of ethics for the licensed profession or vocation; certificate, or medical privilege for reasons as provided in this section;
- HRS §436B-19(10): Violating any condition or limitation upon which a conditional or temporary license was issued;
- HRS §436B-19(13): Revocation, suspension, or other disciplinary action by another state or federal agency against a licensee or applicant for any reason provided by the licensing laws or this section;
- HRS §453-8(a): In addition to any other actions authorized by law, any license to practice medicine and surgery may be revoked, limited, or suspended by the board at any time in a proceeding before the board, or may be denied, for any cause authorized by law, including but not limited to the following:
- HRS §453-8(a)(4): Being habituated to the excessive use of drugs or alcohol; or being addicted to, dependent on, or a habitual user of a narcotic, barbiturate, amphetamine, hallucinogen, or other drug having similar effects;
- HRS §453-8(a)(5): Practicing medicine while the ability to practice is impaired by alcohol, drugs, physical disability, or mental instability;
- HRS §453-8(a)(7): Professional misconduct, hazardous negligence causing bodily injury to another, or manifest incapacity in the practice of medicine or surgery;

- HRS §453-8(a)(9): Conduct or practice contrary to recognized standards of ethics of the medical profession as adopted by the Hawaii Medical Association, the American Medical Association, the Hawaii Association of Osteopathic Physicians and Surgeons, or the American Osteopathic Association; and
- HRS §453-8(a)(11): Revocation, suspension, or other disciplinary action by another state or federal agency of a license, certificate, or medical privilege.
- HRS §453-8(b): If disciplinary action related to the practice of medicine has been taken against the applicant by another state or federal agency, or if the applicant reveals a physical or mental condition that would constitute a violation under this section, then the board may impose one or more of the following requirements as a condition for licensure:
- HRS §453-8(b)(3): Limitation of the license by restricting the fields of practice in which the licensee may engage; and
- HRS §453-8(b)(5): Limitation of the medical practice of the licensee in any reasonable manner to assure the safety and welfare of the consuming public.

In addition, the Board members stated that Dr. Mailman failed to uphold the following AMA Principles of Medical Ethics:

- II. A physician shall uphold the standards of professionalism, be honest in all professional interactions, and strive to report physicians deficient in competence, or engaging in fraud or deception, to appropriate entities; and
- III. A physician shall respect the law and also recognize a responsibility to seek changes in those requirements which are contrary to the best interests of the patient.

For reasons contained in the records and files of Dr. Mailman's application, the Board placed the following conditions and limitations on his conditional and limited license:

1. Dr. Mailman's license is limited for a minimum of five (5) years to the practice of out-patient general pediatric medicine only.
2. Prior to beginning the limited practice of out-patient general pediatric medicine, Dr. Mailman shall provide a copy of the letter regarding the conditions and limitations of his license to his prospective employer in the State of Hawaii. The prospective employer shall, within thirty (30) days of the date of this letter, submit to the Board written confirmation of receipt of this letter and information regarding Dr. Mailman's practice setting. Dr. Mailman's practice setting shall be approved by the Board prior to working. Dr. Mailman's prospective employer shall include the following information for the Board's consideration: 1) the name(s) of Dr. Mailman's employer(s); 2) physical and mailing address of practice; 3) patient population served by the practice (age range); and 4) any other information relevant for the Board to make an informed decision. This information shall be mailed or emailed to the Board's Executive Officer.
3. Dr. Mailman shall, within thirty (30) days of his conditional and limited license number being issued by the Board, notify all jurisdictions in which he holds/held or is applying for a healthcare related license of the conditions and limitations placed on his conditional and limited license. A copy of each letter notifying those jurisdictions shall also be provided to the Board. Copies of these letters shall be mailed or emailed to the Board's Executive Officer.
4. Dr. Mailman shall enter into a monitoring contract with Pu`ulu Lapa`au ("Pu`ulu Lapa`au"), The Hawai`i Program for Healthcare Professionals within sixty (60) days of the date of his conditional and limited license number being issued. The length of the contract shall be for a minimum of five (5) years. However, said monitoring contract may be extended by the Board if the Board believes that reasonable grounds exist.

5. Dr. Mailman shall provide a copy of his fully executed contract with Pu`ulu Lapa`au to the Board within seventy-five (75) days of his conditional and limited license number being issued. All correspondence shall be addressed to the Board's Executive Officer.
6. Dr. Mailman may only begin to practice medicine in the State of Hawaii after he receives written confirmation from the Board that he has secured proper monitoring in the State of Hawaii with Pu`ulu Lapa`au and his practice setting has been approved.
7. If, at any time, Pu`ulu Lapa`au determines that Dr. Mailman is not in compliance with the monitoring contract, Dr. Mailman shall immediately notify the Board and immediately cease practicing medicine until Pu`ulu Lapa`au specifies to the Board what conditions, if any, it recommends for him to safely resume the practice of medicine. Depending upon Pu`ulu Lapa`au's written report and recommendations, the Board may evaluate what, if any, further conditions and/or limitations are warranted for Dr. Mailman to practice medicine and impose such conditions and/or limitations on his license. If Dr. Mailman fails to refrain from using drugs or alcohol and inappropriate behavior, the Board also will consider whether to suspend, revoke, or otherwise discipline his license.
8. During the period of his conditional and limited license, Dr. Mailman shall ensure that Pu`ulu Lapa`au submits quarterly written reports to the Board. These written reports shall include, but not be limited to, assessments regarding: (1) his compliance with the monitoring contract; and (2) his ability to safely practice as a physician. The first quarterly report is due within ninety (90) days from the date Dr. Mailman's conditional and limited license number is issued. All correspondence shall be addressed to the Board's Executive Officer.
9. Dr. Mailman shall comply with all probationary terms, conditions, and restrictions placed on his Texas medical license.
10. The Board, at its discretion, may pursue additional disciplinary action as provided by law to include further

finer and other sanctions as the Board may deem appropriate if Dr. Mailman violates any further provision of the statutes or rules governing the conduct of physicians in the State of Hawaii, or if he fails to abide by the terms of your conditional license.

11. Should Dr. Mailman wish to have any condition and/or limitation removed from his license, he shall make a request in writing to the Board, at which time the Board would consider his request. When doing so, Dr. Mailman shall provide evidence of full compliance with his monitoring contract with Pu`ulu Lapa`au and all other conditions placed on his conditional and limited license.

Dr. Bintliff left the meeting at 3:44 p.m.

- d. Wendie R. Williams, M.D.

After due consideration of the information received, it was moved by Vice-Chair Halford, seconded by Dr. Sept, and unanimously carried to reject the CME course submitted for the Board's consideration by Dr. Williams.

The Board determined that the proposal was not targeted to the required course topics of Patient Safety/Continuity of Care and Ethics.

As such, the Board requires that Dr. Williams provide at least five (5) proposed CME courses and descriptions for its consideration. These courses shall: be pre-approved by the Board; total 15 hours; be in-person AMA PRA Category 1; and in the course topics of Patient Safety/Continuity of Care and Ethics.

- e. Curtis S.F. Wong, M.D.

After due consideration of the information received, it was moved by Chair Geimer-Flanders, seconded by Vice-Chair Halford, and unanimously carried to approve Dr. Wong's application for licensure and to issue a non-disciplinary letter of education reminding Dr. Wong of his responsibility as a physician to disclose and provide accurate and complete information at all times.

- f. Vijay P. Agarwal, M.D.

After due consideration of the information received, it was moved by Dr. Young, seconded by Chair Geimer-Flanders, and unanimously carried to defer Dr. Agarwal's application pending submission of additional information.

g. Matthew Blacke, M.D.

After due consideration of the information received, it was moved by Chair Geimer-Flanders, seconded by Vice-Chair Halford, and unanimously carried to defer Dr. Blacke's application for licensure pending submission of additional information.

i. June S. Chen, M.D.

After due consideration of the information received, it was moved by Vice-Chair Halford, seconded by Chair Geimer-Flanders, and unanimously carried to defer Dr. Chen's application for licensure pending submission of additional information.

j. Carlos M. Dibble, M.D.

After due consideration of the information received, it was moved by Chair Geimer-Flanders, seconded by Dr. Sept, and unanimously carried to defer Dr. Dibble's application for licensure pending submission of additional information.

k. Tushar M. Goradia, M.D.

After due consideration of the information received, it was moved by Dr. Sept, seconded by Dr. Chun, and unanimously carried to approve Dr. Goradia's application for licensure.

n. Brianne MacKenzie, M.D.

After due consideration of the information received, it was moved by Chair Geimer-Flanders, seconded by Dr. Egami, and unanimously carried to approve Dr. MacKenzie's application for licensure subject to certain conditions.

The Board based its decision on the following grounds of the Hawaii Revised Statutes ("HRS"), which find support in the records and files of Dr. MacKenzie's application:

HRS §436B-19(3): Being addicted to, dependent on, or a habitual use of a narcotic, barbiturate, amphetamine, hallucinogen, opium, cocaine, or other drugs or derivatives of a similar nature;

HRS §436B-19(4): Practicing the licensed profession or vocation while impaired by alcohol,

drugs, physical disability, or mental instability; and

HRS §436B-19(9): Conduct or practice contrary to recognized standards of ethics for the licensed profession or vocation.

In addition, the Board members stated that Dr. MacKenzie failed to uphold the following AMA Principle of Medical Ethics:

- II. A physician shall uphold the standards of professionalism, be honest in all professional interactions, and strive to report physicians deficient in competence, or engaging in fraud or deception, to appropriate entities.

For reasons contained in the records and files of Dr. MacKenzie's application, the Board placed the following conditions on her conditional license:

1. Within **thirty (30) days** of Dr. MacKenzie's conditional license number being issued by the Board, she shall notify all jurisdictions in which she holds/held a healthcare related license of the conditions placed on her conditional license. A copy of each letter notifying those jurisdictions shall also be provided to the Board. Copies of these letters shall be mailed or emailed to the Board.
2. Dr. MacKenzie shall enter into a monitoring contract with Pu`ulu Lapa`au ("Pu`ulu Lapa`au"), The Hawai`i Program for Healthcare Professionals within **sixty (60) days** of the date of her conditional license number being issued. The length be for a period of five (5) years. However, said monitoring contract may be extended by the Board if the Board believes that reasonable grounds exist.
3. Dr. MacKenzie shall provide a copy of the fully executed contract with Pu`ulu Lapa`au to the Board within **seventy-five (75) days** of her license number being issued.
4. Dr. MacKenzie shall only begin to practice medicine in the State of Hawaii, after receiving written confirmation from the Board that she has secured proper monitoring in the State of Hawaii with Pu`ulu Lapa`au.
5. If, at any time, Pu`ulu Lapa`au determines that Dr. MacKenzie is not in compliance with the monitoring contract, she shall immediately notify the Board and immediately cease practicing medicine until Pu`ulu

Lapa`au specifies to the Board what conditions, if any, it recommends for her to safely resume the practice of medicine. Depending upon Pu`ulu Lapa`au's written report and recommendations, the Board may evaluate what, if any, further conditions are warranted for her to practice medicine and impose such conditions on her license. If she fails to refrain from using drugs or alcohol, the Board also will consider whether to suspend, revoke, or otherwise discipline her license.

6. During the period of Dr. MacKenzie's conditional license, she shall ensure that Pu`ulu Lapa`au submits quarterly written reports to the Board. These written reports shall include, but not be limited to, assessments regarding: (1) her compliance with the monitoring contract; and (2) her ability to safely practice as a physician. **The first quarterly report is due within ninety (90) days from the date of her conditional license number is issued.**
7. The Board, at its discretion, may pursue additional disciplinary action as provided by law to include further fines and other sanctions as the Board may deem appropriate if Dr. MacKenzie violates any further provision of the statutes or rules governing the conduct of physicians in the State of Hawaii, or if she fails to abide by the terms of her conditional license.
8. Should Dr. MacKenzie wish to have any condition removed from her license, she shall make a request in writing to the Board, at which time the Board would consider her request. When doing so, she shall provide evidence of full compliance with her monitoring contract with Pu`ulu Lapa`au and all other conditions placed on her conditional license.
- s. Robert I. Picker, M.D.

After due consideration of the information received, it was moved by Dr. Egami, seconded by Vice-Chair Halford, and carried by a majority, with the exception of Dr. Sept, who opposed the motion, and Dr. Chun, who abstained from voting, to approve Dr. Picker's application for licensure.

- y. Fredric C. Wollett, M.D.

After due consideration of the information received, it was moved by Dr. Egami, seconded by Vice-Chair Halford, and unanimously

carried to defer Dr. Wollett's application for licensure pending submission of additional information.
