6.	<u>New</u> Business:	a.	Email inquiry from Adele Lafever: Intraoral massage endorsement
	<u></u>		The Board reviewed and discussed Ms. Lafever's email which states in part "In Washington we are required to receive an endorsement on our Massage

> Therapist licenses in order to practice techniques that target TMJ, bruxism, and related facial pain disorders. A typical intraoral session would involve neck and face work, including gloved work to the interior surface of the masseter mm and other facial mms. Washington State LMTs with intraoral endorsements may work with or receive referrals from dentists, oral surgeons, orthodontic practitioners, etc." Ms. Lafever is asking whether intraoral massage is endorsed or licensed separately in Hawaii, or if a massage therapist with intraoral skills may use them in their general scope of practice.

> After some discussion, upon a motion by Chair Nagashima, seconded by Vice Chair Behnken, it was voted on and unanimously carried to respond to Ms. Lafever's questions as follows:

1) Is intraoral massage endorsed or licensed separately in Hawaii?

Board's Response: No.

2) May a massage therapist with intraoral skills use them in their general scope of practice?

Board's Response: Based on the information provided by Ms. Lafever, it appears the intraoral massage technique does fall under the definition of "massage" pursuant to HRS §452-1, therefore, as long as the massage therapist holds a Hawaii massage therapist license that is current, active status and in good standing and the massage therapist has adequate training of the intraoral massage technique with proof of their certification and/or documentation of their training, they may perform this technique.

This is an informal interpretation for informational and explanatory purposes only and is not an official opinion or decision, and therefore is not to be viewed as binding on the Board.

b. <u>Inquiry from Waimānalo Health Services ("WHC"): Is a massage therapy</u> <u>establishment license required to provide integrated lomilomi services? If so,</u> <u>could WHC confirm that this integrated model of practice does not require the</u> <u>massage therapy establishment premise to be set apart and not used for other</u> <u>purposes since it is not situated in a building used for residential therapy</u> <u>purposes?</u>

The Board reviewed and discussed the inquiry from Mary Frances Oneha, Chief Executive Officer of WHC and Leina'ala Bright of Loea Lapa'au. The letter states in part "Waimānalo Health Center (WHC) is a Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC) delivering integrated, team-based services, from a patient centered medical home (PCMH) approach in order to improve quality outcomes, reduce healthcare costs, and improve patient experience. Serving

53% Native Hawaiians, integrated, team-based services includes a cultural practitioner (and licensed massage therapist), Loea Lapa'au, delivering Pa'ola style lomilomi and lā'au lapa'au services to patients during a primary care visit. The cultural practitioner may see a patient with the primary care provider or as a warm hand-off in the same exam room. This same patient may also see a psychologist, registered dietician, or care coordinator in that same exam room."

After some discussion, upon a motion by Vice Chair Behnken, seconded by Ms. Hagerman, it was voted on and unanimously carried to respond to their questions as follows:

1) Is a massage therapy establishment ("MAE") license required to provide integrated lomilomi services?

Board's Response: Yes. HRS §452-1's definition of "massage" includes "Hawaiian massage commonly known as lomilomi", therefore, as lomilomi is considered massage, an MAE license is required to provide lomilomi services at their facility.

2) Could WHC confirm that this integrated model of practice does not require the MAE premise to be set apart and not used for other purposes since it is not situated in a building used for residential therapy purposes (as stated on the application)?

Board's Response: The Board noted that HRS §452-1 defines "Massage therapy establishment" as "premises occupied and used for the purpose of practicing massage therapy or massage therapy training; provided that when any massage therapy establishment is situated in any building used for residential purposes, the massage therapy establishment premises shall be set apart and shall not be used for any other purpose". Therefore, as the premises must be occupied and used for the purpose of practicing massage therapy or massage therapy training, a separate massage treatment room is needed.

This is an informal interpretation for informational and explanatory purposes only and is not an official opinion or decision, and therefore is not to be viewed as binding on the Board.

c. Email Inquiry from Matthew Smith: Is it permissible to operate a day spa/massage therapy out of a residential property? Can a massage license be issued to a business operating out of a luxury oceanfront home zoned for vacation rentals?

The Board reviewed and discussed Mr. Smith's email which states in part "I am a realtor on Maui. I have a client that wants to purchase a property with the intention of using it as a legally permitted short term vacation rental. They would also like to offer massage therapy to their guests."

After some discussion, upon a motion by Vice Chair Behnken, seconded by Ms. Hagerman, it was voted on and unanimously carried to respond to Mr. Smith's questions as follows:

1) Is it permissible to operate a day spa/massage therapy out of a residential property?

Board's Response: Pursuant to HRS §452-1 which defines "Massage therapy establishment" as "premises occupied and used for the purpose of practicing massage therapy or massage therapy training; provided that when any massage therapy establishment is situated in any building used for residential purposes, the massage therapy establishment premises shall be set apart and shall not be used for any other purpose", it is permissible to operate an MAE in a residential property.

2) Can a massage license be issued to a business operating out of a luxury oceanfront home zoned for vacation rentals?

Board's Response: The Board has no purview over zoning and permitted use of property, however, the application for an MAE license requires the applicant to certify that the premises/location of the MAE is in compliance with the respective county zoning laws and regulations.
