Call to Order: The Chair Pro Tem called the meeting to order at 8:33 a.m. at which time quorum was established.

Chair Pro Tem's Report: **Announcements/Introductions**

The Chair Pro Tem excused the Chair and Vice Chair from today's meeting and asked the audience to introduce themselves.

**Approval of the Previous Minutes – September 5, 2019**

The Chair Pro Tem called for a motion in regard to the minutes of the September 5, 2019 meeting.

Ms. Stone Murai stated that although she was not present during the September meeting, she questioned the Board's informal interpretation on page 6 of the minutes that states "...it was the consensus of the Board that based on the information provided, the use of silver nitrate stick to treat a stage IV pressure ulcer does NOT fall within an APRN's or nurse's scope of practice."

The EO replied that the Board was responding to a specific inquiry from an APRN asking if "treatment with silver nitrate stick in a patient with a stage 4 pressure ulcer falls within the scope of nursing practice in Hawaii."

Ms. Stone Murai stated that it sounds as if the Board is saying that APRNs cannot use silver nitrate stick.

The EO clarified that the inquiry was specific to a stage 4 pressure ulcer by an APRN and that the Chair provided reference materials that silver nitrate should NOT be used to treat a stage IV pressure ulcer and asked Ms. Stone Murai for her recommendation.

The Chair Pro Tem stated that the minutes reflect an accurate account of the Board's discussion and determination.

Ms. Stone Murai stated that she would recommend that it be re-worded to indicate that perhaps the use of silver nitrate sticks to treat a stage IV pressure ulcer is not appropriate.

The DAG recommended that the Board approve the minutes as is and clarify that APRNs may use silver nitrate sticks in their practice but not to treat a stage 4 pressure ulcer.

Upon a motion by Dr. Napoleon, seconded by Ms. Stone Murai, it was voted on and unanimously carried to approve the minutes of the September 5, 2019 meeting as circulated.

Ms. Boyer added that in order to clarify the Board's informal interpretation of APRNs scope of practice to use silver nitrate sticks to treat stage 4 pressure ulcers, that the use of silver nitrate sticks fall within an APRN's scope of practice when used appropriately, however, should NOT be used to treat a stage 4 pressure ulcer.

### **2019 Renewal – Status Report**

#### Continuing Competency

The EO reported that she hopes to get the audit letters out this month.

#### Criminal History Background Check

The EO stated that she is still waiting for the number of nurses that actually went to get fingerprinted for the 2019 renewal.

### **2020 Legislation**

#### APRNs Performing Aspiration Abortions

The EO reported that Planned Parenthood was planning on resurrecting this bill for the 2020 Legislative Session. During the 2019 Legislative Session, the Board recommended the following be inserted in the HRS Chapter 457:

"§457- Advanced practice registered nurses; abortions by medication or aspiration. Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, an advanced practice registered nurse may perform an abortion by medication or aspiration in the first trimester of pregnancy, so long as the nurse: (a) Has prescriptive authority; (b) Practices within the nurse's practice specialty; (c) Completes a Board-approved specified training program that includes a clinical component; and (d) Has a valid, unrevoked, and unsuspended license obtained in accordance with this chapter."

The Board determined and was verified by the Hawaii Medical Board that APRNs, practicing within their practice specialty, were allowed to perform abortions by medication.

#### Nurse Licensure Compact

The EO reported that there is a possibility that the NLC bill may be resurrected for the 2020 Legislative session.

She reported that for the 2019 Legislative session, the Board's testimony on the NLC bill expressed the following concerns:

- Inconsistent renewal requirements. For example, the Board requires mandatory continued competency to renew a license. Many NLC participating states do not have this same requirement.
- It is unclear whether the Board may take disciplinary action against a multistate licensed nurse, as that nurse would not hold a license issued by the Board.

- A multistate licensed nurse does not have to apply for or notify the Board that the nurse is practicing in this state. Thus, the Board is unclear how this will impact Hawaii's nursing workforce needs. The Board and the Hawaii State Center for Nursing work collaboratively to address the nursing workforce to meet the needs of Hawaii residents.
- It is unclear what the fiscal impact will be on the Board and the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs. Some states that have enacted the NLC have had to increase their license fees to compensate for their loss of revenue. The Board would like to ensure that its current licensees are not negatively impacted by a possible increase in fees to join the NLC.

*Professional Licensing Report – "With sweeping new law, Arizona aims to reset national standards for license portability"*

The EO reported that effective September 1, 2019, a new law in Arizona will allow for any occupation that requires a license, people will be able to practice in Arizona, it's their primary residence with the license they have obtained in another state and as long as they've been licensed for a year.

Provides that a school may maintain a supply of Glucagon medication in before, during, or after school where a student is most at risk, including the nurse's office.

#### **IL S 1702 SUMMARY:**

Permits an advanced practice psychiatric nurse to order restraints or seclusion for a recipient of treatment.

#### **NJ S 4072 SUMMARY:**

Waives certain professional and occupational licensing fees for individuals and spouses with military status under certain circumstances.

**PA H 1820 SUMMARY:**

A school nurse shall complete a course regarding the management of students with seizures.

**PA S 857 SUMMARY:**

Authorizes the regulation of telemedicine by professional licensing boards; provides for insurance coverage of telemedicine.

**WI S 410 SUMMARY:**

Allows a person to practice for up to 90 days a year as an RN for campers and staff at a recreational and educational camp licensed in the state.

#### APRN and NP History and Scope of Practice- FYI

Copies of the documents from the Hawaii State Center for Nursing were distributed to the Board members as information only. The Board took no action.

#### Hawaii State Center for Nursing:

Mrs. Hussey reported on the following:

The Supply report is scheduled to be completed in November.

The Center is working on how to address faculty shortages which has been the main barrier for nursing programs. Thus, they will be conducting a Deans and Directors meeting which will be held on October 11, 2019.

Ms. Kodama stated that we have always had shortages, however asked Mrs. Hussey what were some of the reasons for the shortages.

Mrs. Hussey stated that pay is a factor because there is huge difference between practicing in a clinical setting compared to the academia setting. Another challenge is having nurses seek higher education.

The Chair Pro Tem stated that the cost of education is not offset by the pay.

#### Hawaii-American Nurses Association:

Ms. Beechinor reported on the following:

The Hawaii-ANA is gearing up for a big membership drive in March 2020 to have registered nurses in the state of Hawaii to join jointly the Hawaii and American Nurses Association so that it would be a state national membership. They have negotiated a fee contract with ANA, to allow members to join for \$174 a year, which is under \$15 a month.

The Hawaii-ANA is still working on an initiative with new graduates who are working unlicensed positions mainly in acute care. They are offering mentoring to get them out of their current positions.

Ms. Kodama asked why nurses get “stuck” in these unlicensed positions.

Ms. Beechinor stated that if a nurse sits in a CNA position for two or three years after graduation, employers don't want to hire them because they don't have the experience. Ms. Beechinor stated that if nurses don't get moved out after six months in these unlicensed positions, they get stuck. She stated that there is a significant number of nurses stuck in these positions because they were either unable to go to the mainland to gain the necessary work experience or find work here in Hawaii.
