Agenda: The agenda for this meeting was filed with the Office of the Lieutenant Governor as required by Hawaii Revised Statutes ("HRS") section 92-7.

A brief video regarding the virtual board meeting, including meeting procedures and helpful information regarding how members of the public can participate and interact with the board during the meeting, was played.

Call to Order: There being a quorum present, the meeting was called to order at 10:34 a.m. by Chair Denis.

Vice-Chair Inouye, Chief Ferreira, Mr. Collins, and Chair Dennis confirmed they were present.

Approval of the
Board Minutes:

Chair Denis asked if there were any corrections to the March 10, 2021 open session minutes and executive session minutes.

It was moved by Mr. Collins, seconded by Chair Denis, and unanimously carried to approve the open session and executive session minutes of the March 10, 2021 meeting.

Executive Session: At 10:40 a.m., it was moved by Vice-Chair Inouye, seconded by Chief Ferreira, and unanimously carried to move into executive session pursuant to HRS §92-5 to consider and evaluate personal information relating to individuals applying for professional or vocational licenses cited in section HRS §26-9 or both, and to consult with the board's attorney on questions and issues pertaining to the board's powers, duties, privileges, immunities, and liabilities, as provided in HRS §92-5(a)(1) and (4).

1. **Eliu Afoa**

After due consideration of the information received, it was moved by Vice-Chair Inouye, seconded by Chair Denis and unanimously carried to approve Eliu Afoa's application for licensure subject to certain conditions.

The Board based its decision on the following grounds of the Hawaii Revised Statutes ("HRS"), which find factual support in the records and files of Mr. Afoa's application:

HRS §436B-19 provides that:

In addition to any other acts or conditions provided by law, the licensing authority may refuse to renew, reinstate or restore, or may deny, revoke, suspend, or condition in any manner, any license for any one or more of the following acts or conditions on the part of the licensee or the applicant thereof:

- (14) Criminal conviction, whether by nolo contendere or otherwise, of a penal crime directly related to the qualifications, functions, or duties of the licensed profession or vocation.

For reasons contained in the records and files of Eliu Afoa's application, the Board placed the following conditions on his conditional license:

- 1) Mr. Afoa shall comply with all of the terms and conditions of his probation. If his probation is amended in any way or is revoked:
 - a. Mr. Afoa shall report any such amendment or revocation to the Board within thirty (30) calendar days of the amendment or revocation; and
 - b. Upon completion of his terms, submit proof of discharge to the Board; and
 - c. If Mr. Afoa fails to timely notify the Board of such amendment or revocation, his conditional registration shall be automatically revoked without a hearing on the 30th day after the date

- of the amendment or the date his probation/parole was revoked, as applicable; and
 - d. Mr. Afoa shall provide the Board with semiannual progress reports from his probation/parole officer.
- 2) Mr. Afoa shall submit an annual FBI national criminal history record check and State of Hawaii criminal history record check from the Hawaii Criminal Justice Data Center ("**criminal abstracts**") to the Board.
- a. These criminal abstracts shall be due on January 31st of each year and shall cover the periods of January to December.
 - b. In order to obtain these criminal abstracts, Mr. Afoa shall be fingerprinted electronically at Fieldprint Inc. at his own cost and expense; and
- 3) Mr. Afoa shall refrain from any actions that may result in his arrest or conviction for any crimes against persons or property (including, but not limited to: theft, burglary, assault, etc.)
- a. Mr. Afoa shall report any such arrests or convictions to the Board within thirty (30) calendar days of the arrests or convictions; and
 - b. If Mr. Afoa fails to timely notify the Board of such arrests or convictions, his conditional registration shall be automatically revoked without a hearing on the 30th day after the date of the arrests or convictions.

2. Emmanuel Leota

After due consideration of the information received, it was moved by Vice-Chair Inouye, seconded by Chair Denis and unanimously carried to approve Emmanuel Leota's application for licensure subject to certain conditions.

For reasons contained in the records and files of Emmanuel Leota's application, the Board placed the following conditions on his conditional license:

- 1) Mr. Leota shall notify the Board of any scheduled trial dates.
- 2) Mr. Leota shall submit an annual FBI national criminal history record check and State of Hawaii criminal history record check from the Hawaii Criminal Justice Data Center ("**criminal abstracts**") to the Board.
 - a. These criminal abstracts shall be due on January 31st of each year and shall cover the periods of January to December.
 - b. In order to obtain these criminal abstracts, Mr. Leota shall be fingerprinted electronically at Fieldprint Inc. at his own cost and expense; and
- 3) Mr. Leota shall refrain from any actions that may result in his arrest or conviction for any crimes against persons or property (including, but not limited to: theft, burglary, assault, etc.)
 - a. Mr. Leota shall report any such arrests or convictions to the Board within thirty (30) calendar days of the arrests or convictions; and
 - b. If Mr. Leota fails to timely notify the Board of such arrests or convictions, his conditional registration shall be automatically revoked without a hearing on the 30th day after the date of the arrests or convictions.

3. Ray Sadino-Ortiz

After due consideration of the information received, it was moved by Vice-Chair Inouye, seconded by Chair Denis and unanimously carried to approve Ray Sadino-Ortiz's application for licensure subject to certain conditions.

The Board based its decision on the following grounds of the Hawaii Revised Statutes ("HRS"), which find factual support in the records and files of Mr. Sadino-Ortiz's application:

HRS §436B-19 provides that:

In addition to any other acts or conditions provided by law,

the licensing authority may refuse to renew, reinstate or restore, or may deny, revoke, suspend, or condition in any manner, any license for any one or more of the following acts or conditions on the part of the licensee or the applicant thereof:

- (14) Criminal conviction, whether by nolo contendere or otherwise, of a penal crime directly related to the qualifications, functions, or duties of the licensed profession or vocation.

For reasons contained in the records and files of Ray Sadino-Ortiz's application, the Board placed the following conditions on his conditional license:

periods of January to December.

- b. In order to obtain these criminal abstracts, Mr. Sadino-Ortiz shall be fingerprinted electronically at Fieldprint Inc. at his own cost and expense; and
- 3) Mr. Sadino-Ortiz shall refrain from any actions that may result in his arrest or conviction for any crimes against persons or property (including, but not limited to: theft, burglary, assault, etc.)
 - a. Mr. Sadino-Ortiz shall report any such arrests or convictions to the Board within thirty (30) calendar days of the arrests or convictions; and
 - b. If Mr. Sadino-Ortiz fails to timely notify the Board of such arrests or convictions, his conditional registration shall be automatically revoked without a hearing on the 30th day after the date of the arrests or convictions.

After due consideration of the information received, it was moved by Vice-Chair Inouye, seconded by Chair Denis and unanimously carried to approve Tara Salima's application for licensure subject to certain conditions.

The Board based its decision on the following grounds of the Hawaii Revised Statutes ("HRS"), which find factual support in the records and files of Ms. Salima's application:

HRS §436B-19 provides that:

In addition to any other acts or conditions provided by law, the licensing authority may refuse to renew, reinstate or restore, or may deny, revoke, suspend, or condition in any manner, any license for any one or more of the following acts or conditions on the part of the licensee or the applicant thereof:

- (1) Failure to meet or maintain the conditions and requirements necessary to qualify for the granting of a license

For reasons contained in the records and files of Tara Salima's application, the Board placed the following conditions on her conditional license:

- 1) Ms. Salima shall ensure that the Board is notified of any changes or incidents pertaining to her fitness to perform in a guard capacity, within ten (10) days of the incident.
- 2) Failure to comply with the above condition will result in it being recommended to the Board that Ms. Salima's registration be withdrawn for failure to the comply with the conditional registration agreement.

5. Peter Vaughan

After due consideration of the information received, it was moved by Vice-Chair Inouye, seconded by Chair Denis and unanimously carried to approve Peter Vaughan's application for licensure subject to certain conditions.

The Board based its decision on the following grounds of the Hawaii Revised Statutes ("HRS"), which find factual support in the records and files of Ms. Vaughan's application:

HRS §436B-19 provides that:

In addition to any other acts or conditions provided by law, the licensing authority may refuse to renew, reinstate or restore, or may deny, revoke, suspend, or condition in any manner, any license for any one or more of the following acts or conditions on the part of the licensee or the applicant thereof:

- (1) Failure to meet or maintain the conditions and requirements necessary to qualify for the granting of a license

For reasons contained in the records and files of Peter Vaughan's application, the Board placed the following conditions on her conditional license:

Christopher Lum Lee was recognized by Chair Denis and advised him that he may provide public testimony on this agenda item.

Mr. Lum Lee introduced himself to the Board, and stated that he was in attendance to answer any questions the Board may have regarding his uniform submission for Trisec, Inc.

It was moved by Mr. Collins, seconded by Vice-Chair Inouye, and unanimously carried, to approve the following uniform submissions:

Correspondence: A. Email from Dr. Monroe Mann, Dated March 20, 2021, Regarding "Virtual Offices"

The Board considered email correspondence from Dr. Monroe Mann, inquiring whether "virtual offices" satisfies the requirements set forth in Hawaii Administrative Rules ("HAR") section 16-97-12.

Mr. Collins commented that HAR section 16-97-12(b) requires that the out-of-state licensee provides the name of an individual who will act as an agent or representative of the licensee who can be served with notice or legal process. Mr. Collins acknowledged that while the virtual office company may be able to offer the services of a receptionist, he questioned whether the receptionist would be able to take on the responsibility of also being an agent for the licensee.

EO Fukunaga clarified that the receptionist would be considered an employee of the virtual office company and not the licensee. EO

Fukunaga questioned whether the receptionist being an employee of the virtual office company and not the licensee was relevant.

Mr. Collins replied that there may be some liability issues if legal documents that are disciplinary in nature are served to an improper agent or representative.

Vice-Chair Inouye agreed, stating that it is difficult to make a determination, without more information on how the licensee and the virtual office company intends to meet the requirements of HAR section 16-97-12(b). Vice-Chair Inouye asked DAG Suzuka whether the Attorney General's Office could further investigate if there are existing policies in place regarding the use of virtual offices as places of business within other offices in the State.

DAG Suzuka indicated that she would research the matter further.

It was the Board's consensus to defer discussion on this topic to the next meeting.

B. Email Inquiry From Spike Denis dated April 15, 2021,
Regarding Digital Copies of Guard Cards

The Board considered whether guard cards (i.e., pocket ID cards) presented in a digital format, are sufficient to prove registration.

Chair Denis explained that he had received several inquiries regarding whether presenting a digital guard card as proof of guard employee registration is acceptable. Chair Denis stated that many guard employees do not have access to printers and are unable to print out physical copies of their guard cards.

Vice-Chair Inouye inquired whether guard employees are required to produce their license upon request from anyone, such as a member of the public.

Chair Denis replied that guard employees are not required to present their guard cards to the general public. However, they are required to present their guard cards upon request from a client of their employer or a Regulated Industries Complaints Office (RICO) investigator.

Mr. Collins commented that although there was a slight risk of fraud, it would be more convenient and efficient for guard employees if they are able to present a digital copy of their guard card as proof of registration.

Vice-Chair Inouye agreed, stating that the allowance of digital guard cards would enable the industry to stay current with technological advancements.

It was moved by Mr. Collins, seconded by Vice-Chair Inouye, and unanimously carried to accept digital guard cards as proof of guard employee registration.

Open Forum: Chair Denis asked if any members of the public would like to provide oral testimony. There were none.
