- Agenda: The agenda for this meeting was filed with the Office of the Lieutenant Governor as required by Hawaii Revised Statutes (“HRS”) section 92-7.
- A brief video regarding the virtual board meeting, including meeting procedures and helpful information regarding how members of the public can participate and interact with the board during the meeting, was played.
- Call to Order: There being a quorum present, the meeting was called to order at 10:34 a.m. by Chair Denis.
- Vice-Chair Inouye, Chief Ferreira, Mr. Collins, Mr. Chu and Chair Dennis confirmed they were present.

Approval of the Board Minutes: Chair Denis asked if there were any corrections to the July 7, 2021 open session minutes and executive session minutes.

It was moved by Mr. Collins, seconded by Vice-Chair Inouye, and unanimously carried to approve the open session and executive session minutes of the July 7, 2021 meeting.

Executive Session: At 10:37 a.m., it was moved by Mr. Collins, seconded by Vice-Chair Inouye, and unanimously carried to move into executive session pursuant to HRS §92-5 to consider and evaluate personal information relating to individuals applying for professional or vocational licenses cited in section HRS §26-9 or both, and to consult with the board's attorney on questions and issues pertaining to the board's powers, duties, privileges, immunities, and liabilities, as provided in HRS §92-5(a)(1) and (4).

EXECUTIVE SESSION

At 11:03 a.m., it was moved by the Mr. Collins seconded by Chief Ferreria and unanimously carried to move out of executive session.

 - a. Mr. Maugatotega shall report any such arrests or convictions to the Board within thirty (30) calendar days of the arrests or convictions; and
 - b. If Mr. Maugatotega fails to timely notify the Board of such arrests or convictions, his conditional registration shall be automatically revoked without a hearing on the 30th day after the date of the arrests or convictions.

3. Donald Villanueva

After due consideration of the information received, it was moved by Mr. Collins, seconded by Chair Denis and unanimously carried to approve Donald Villanueva's application for licensure subject to certain conditions.

The Board based its decision on the following grounds of the Hawaii Revised Statutes ("HRS"), which find factual support in the records and files of Mr. Villanueva's application:

HRS §436B-19 provides that:

In addition to any other acts or conditions provided by law, the licensing authority may refuse to renew, reinstate or restore, or may deny, revoke, suspend, or condition in any manner, any license for any one or more of the following acts or conditions on the part of the licensee or the applicant thereof:

* * *

- (14) Criminal conviction, whether by nolo contendere or otherwise, of a penal crime directly related to the qualifications, functions, or duties of the licensed profession or vocation.

For reasons contained in the records and files of Ray Villanueva's application, the Board placed the following conditions on his conditional license:

It was moved by Mr. Collins, seconded by Vice-Chair Inouye, and unanimously carried, to approve the following Board approved instructors requesting to use remote technology:

New Business:

A. Electronic Signatures and Notary for Bonds

Mr. Collins stated that electronic signatures is a widely accepted practice within the court system which allows for the electronic filing of court documents. Mr. Collins commented that the adoption of electronic signatures for the Board will most likely make processing applications more efficient and allow for the Board to adapt with changing technologies.

DAG Leong added that the decision to accept digital signatures is specific to the Board and will not affect any other Board, Program, or State Agency. DAG Leong agreed with Mr. Collins, remarking that the COVID-19 pandemic has accelerated the trend of moving towards electronically based accepted practices.

Vice-Chair Inouye inquired as to how a document is notarized electronically if a document requires a seal and witness.

DAG Leong replied that there are remote notarizations in which the person signing the document and the notary are “meeting” on a remote interface such as Zoom to confirm identities. The document is usually sent electronically between the two parties.

Vice-Chair Inouye commented that this was perhaps an issue for the Attorney General’s Office to standardize for all Boards and State agencies.

EO Fukunaga reminded the Board that the decision to accept digital signatures and notaries would be specific to this Board and would not affect any other Board, Program, or State Agency. EO Fukunaga explained that the “wet signature” requirement was creating difficulties for applicants submitting notarized bond documents. Currently, if the bond was scanned and/or copied at any step during the notarization process, the document would be rejected by the application staff and applicant would need to submit a new bond document.

Mr. Collins mentioned that in court cases being held over Zoom, the judge will ask the defendant to sign a form and attest that the document and signature are accurate. The judge observes the defendant signing the document to ensure that no one else signs the document on the defendant’s behalf.

Vice-Chair Inouye asked whether notarizing the document is the equivalent of the notary attesting that the document is original and that they have checked for identification. If so, is that something that can be relied upon or trusted.

DAG Leong stated that when applicants submit an application, they are attesting that the information contained in the application is accurate and truthful. In this case, we would be depending on both the applicant and the notary to attest to the accuracy of the document being notarized.

It was moved by Mr. Collins, seconded by Chair Dens,

and unanimously carried, to approve electronic signatures and digital notary seals for bond documents.
