> Chair Geimer-Flanders welcomed everyone to the meeting and proceeded with a roll call of the Board members. All Board members confirmed that they were present, with the exception of Darren K. Egami,

M.D., Franklin V.H. Dao, M.D., Geri Young, M.D., and Michael Jaffe, D.O., who were excused from the meeting.

# Approval of the September 9, 2021, Minutes:

It was moved by Chair Geimer-Flanders, seconded by Dr. Halford, and unanimously carried to approve the open session and executive session meeting minutes of the October 14, 2021 meeting, with the following amendments:

Open Session Minutes:

On page 7, the fourth paragraph, should read as follows:

"Vice Chair Holt went on to say that it may be best to advise Mr. Dudzic that this does not fall within the Board's [prevue] purview."

Executive Session Minutes:

On page 4, the last paragraph, should read as follows:

Chair Geimer-Flanders called for a recess from the meeting at 1:11 p.m., to discuss and deliberate on the following adjudicatory matter pursuant to Chapter 91, HRS (Note: Board members and staff entered the Microsoft Teams meeting).

A. <u>In the Matter of the License to Practice Medicine of Danilo E.</u> Ponce, M.D.; MED-2019-14-L

After discussion, it was moved by Dr. Takanishi, seconded by Dr. Halford, and unanimously carried to approve the Hearing Officer's Finding of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Recommended Order as its Final Order.

Following the Board's review, deliberation, and decision on these matters pursuant to Chapter 91, HRS, Chair Geimer-Flanders announced that the Board reconvene to its regular Chapter 92, HRS, meeting at 1:17 p.m. Board members and staff returned to the Zoom meeting.

# (i) <u>Physician (Permanent/Non-Endorsement):</u>

#### a. Craig A. Beach, M.D.

After due consideration of the information received, it was moved by Dr. Fong, seconded by Dr. Halford, and unanimously carried, to approve Dr. Beach's application for licensure subject to conditions.

The Board based its decision on the following grounds of the Hawaii Revised Statues ("HRS"), Hawaii Administrative Rules ("HAR") and American Medical Association's Principles of Medical Ethics, which find factual support in the records and files of Dr. Beach's application:

HRS section 436B-19 provides that:

(a) In addition to any other acts or conditions provided by law, the licensing authority may refuse to renew, reinstate or restore, or may deny, revoke, suspend, or condition in any manner, any license for any one or more of the following acts or conditions on the part of the licensee or the applicant thereof:

\* \* \*

- (9) Conduct or practice contrary to recognized standards of ethics for the licensed profession or vocation;
- (12) Failure to comply, observe, or adhere to any law in a manner such that the licensing authority deems the applicant or holder an unfit or improper person to hold a license; and
- (13) Revocation, suspension, or other disciplinary action by another state or federal agency against a licensee or applicant for any reason provided by the licensing laws or this section.

HAR section 16-85-112 provides that:

(a) In addition to any other acts or conditions provided in sections 436B-19 and 453-8, HRS, the board may refuse to renew, reinstate, or restore, or may deny, revoke, suspend, or condition in any manner, any license, certificate for any one or more of the following conditions:

\* \* \*

(1) Failure to comply with, observe, or adhere to any law in a manner such that the board deems the licensee or certificate holder to be an unfit or improper person to hold a license or certificate.

The Board considers Dr. Beach's conduct, as reflected in the records and files of his application, to be extremely concerning

and contrary to the recognized stands of medical ethics as adopted by the American Medical Association ("AMA"). Specifically, the Board believes that Dr. Beach failed to uphold the following AMA Principles of Medical Ethics:

- (II) A physician shall uphold the standards of professionalism, be honest in all professional interactions, and strive to report physicians deficient in character or competence, or engaging in fraud or deception, to appropriate entities; and
- (III) A physician shall respect the law and also recognize a responsibility to seek changes in those requirements which are contrary to the best interests of the patient.

Emphases added.

As such, based on the foregoing, the Board hereby imposes the following conditions on Dr. Beach's conditional license:

- Dr. Beach shall enter into a monitoring contract with Pu`ulu Lapa`au, The Hawai`i Program for Healthcare
   Professionals ("Pu`ulu Lapa`au") within sixty (60) days of
   the date of this letter. The length of the contact shall be
   determined by Pu`ulu Lapa`au. However, said monitoring
   contract may be extended by the Board if the Board
   believes that reasonable grounds exist.
- Dr. Beach may only begin to practice medicine in the State
  of Hawaii after he receives written confirmation from the
  Board that he has been issued a medical license number
  by the Board.
- 3. If, at any time, Pu`ulu Lapa`au determines that Dr. Beach is not in compliance with the monitoring contract, he shall immediately notify the Board and immediately cease practicing medicine until Pu`ulu Lapa`au specifies to the Board what conditions, if any, it recommends for him to safely resume the practice of medicine. Depending upon Pu`ulu Lapa`au's written report and recommendations, the Board may evaluate what, if any, further conditions and/or limitations are warranted for him to practice medicine and impose such conditions and/or limitations on your license. If he fails to refrain from using drugs or alcohol and inappropriate behavior, the Board also will consider whether to suspend, revoke, or otherwise discipline his license.

- 4. During the period of Dr. Beach's conditional license, he shall ensure that Pu`ulu Lapa`au submits quarterly written reports to the Board either by first-class mail or email. These written reports shall include, but not be limited to, assessments regarding: (1) his compliance with the monitoring contract; and (2) his ability to safely practice as a physician. The first quarterly report is due within ninety (90) days from the date of his conditional license number is issued.
- 5. The Board, at its discretion, may pursue additional disciplinary action as provided by law to include further fines and other sanctions as the Board may deem appropriate if Dr. Beach violates any further provision of the statutes or rules governing the conduct of physicians in the State of Hawaii, or if he fails to abide by the terms of his conditional license.
- 6. Should Dr. Beach wish to have any condition removed from his license, he shall make a request in writing to the Board, at which time the Board would consider such request. When doing so, Dr. Beach shall provide evidence of full compliance with his monitoring contract with Pu`ulu Lapa`au and all other conditions placed on his conditional license.

# b. Laura A. Black, M.D.

After due consideration of the information received, it was moved by Dr. Halford, seconded by Dr. Takanishi, and unanimously carried to approve Dr. Black's application.

# c. Nicholas Lin, M.D.

After due consideration of the information received, it was moved by Dr. Halford, seconded by Dr. Takanishi, and unanimously carried to defer Dr. Lin's application pending submission of additional information.

# d. Cornell Wells, Jr., M.D.

After due consideration of the information received, it was moved by Vice Chair Holt, seconded by Dr. Halford, and unanimously carried to defer Dr. Wells' application.

# (ii) Physician (Permanent/Endorsement)

# a. Ronald Baird, D.O.

After due consideration of the information received, it was moved by Dr. Takanishi, seconded by Mr. Belcher, and unanimously carried to deny Dr. Baird's application.

The Board based its decision on the following grounds of the Hawaii Revised Statues ("HRS") and Hawaii Administrative Rules ("HAR"), which find factual support in the records and files of Dr. Baird's application:

HRS section 453-4.6 provides that:

(a) The board may issue a license by endorsement to a physician, surgeon, or osteopathic physician if:

\* \* \*

(2) The board determines that no disciplinary action has been taken by any medical licensing authority and the applicant has not been subject of adverse judgements or settlements resulting from the practice of medicine that the board determines constitute evidence of a pattern of negligence or incompetence.

Dr. Baird does not qualify for a license by endorsement based on this statutory provision.

HRS section 453-8 provides that:

(a) In addition to any other actions authorized by law, any license to practice medicine and surgery may be revoked, limited, or suspended by the board at any time in a proceeding before the board, or may be denied, for any cause authorized by law, including but not limited to the following:

\* \* \*

(6) Procuring a license through fraud, misrepresentation, or deceit, or knowingly permitting an unlicensed person to perform activities requiring a license;

- (7) Professional misconduct, hazardous negligence causing bodily injury to another, or manifest incapacity in the practice of medicine or surgery;
- (9) Conduct or practice contrary to recognized standards of ethics of the medical profession as adopted by the Hawaii Medical Association, the American Medical Association, the Hawaii Association of Osteopathic Physicians and Surgeons, or the American Osteopathic Association;
- (11) Revocation, suspension, or other disciplinary action by another state or federal agency of a license, certificate, or medical privilege; and
- (15) Submitting to or filing with the board any notice, statement, or other document required under this chapter, which is false or untrue or contains any material misstatement or omission of fact.

# HAR section 16-85-112 provides that:

(a) In addition to any other acts or conditions provided in sections 436B-19 and 453-8, HRS, the board may refuse to renew, reinstate, or restore, or may deny, revoke, suspend, or condition in any manner, any license, certificate for any one or more of the following conditions:

\* \* \*

- (1) Failure to comply with, observe, or adhere to any law in a manner such that the board deems the licensee or certificate holder to be an unfit or improper person to hold a license or certificate; and
- (3) Violating this chapter, the applicable licensing laws, or any rule or order of the board.

# HRS section 436B-19 provides that:

(a) In addition to any other acts or conditions provided by law, the licensing authority may refuse to renew, reinstate or restore or may deny, revoke, suspend, or condition in any manner, any license for any one or more of the following acts or conditions on the part of the licensee or the applicant thereof:

\* \* \*

- (1) Failure to meet or maintain the conditions and requirements necessary to qualify for the granting of a license;
- (12) Failure to comply, observe, or adhere to any law in a manner such that the licensing authority deems the applicant or holder to be an unfit or improper person to hold a license.

The Board considers Dr. Baird's conduct to be extremely concerning and contrary to the recognized stands of ethics as adopted by the American Osteopathic Association ("AOA"). Specifically, the Board believes that Dr. Baird failed to uphold the following AOA Code of Ethics:

Section 13. A physician shall respect the law. When necessary a physician shall attempt to help to formulate the law by all proper means in order to improve patient care and public health;

Section 14: In addition to adhering to the foregoing ethical standards, a physician shall recognize a responsibility to participate in community activities and services; and

Section 15: It is considered sexual misconduct for a physician to have sexual contact with any patient with whom a physician-patient relationship currently exists.

#### b. Nuvneet Khandelwal, M.D.

After due consideration of the information received, it was moved by Chair Geimer-Flanders, seconded by Dr. Holt, and unanimously carried to approve license with conditions for Dr. Khandelwal's application.

The Board based its decision on the following grounds of the Hawaii Revised Statues ("HRS") and American Medical Association's Principles of Medical Ethics, which find factual support in the records and files of Dr. Khandelwal's application:

HRS section 436B-19 provides that:

(a) In addition to any other acts or conditions provided by law, the licensing authority may refuse to renew, reinstate or restore or may deny, revoke, suspend, or condition in any manner, any license for any one or more of the following acts or conditions on the part of the licensee or the applicant thereof:

\* \* \*

(9) Conduct or practice contrary to recognized standards of ethics for the licensed profession or vocation.

The Board considers Dr. Khandelwal's conduct, as reflected in the records and files of his application, to be of concern and contrary to the recognized stands of medical ethics as adopted by the American Medical Association ("AMA"). Specifically, the Board believes that Dr. Khandelwal failed to uphold the following AMA Principles of Medical Ethics: AMA Principles of Ethics provides that:

(2) A physician shall uphold the standards of professionalism, be honest in all professional interactions, and strive to report physicians deficient in character or competence, or engaging in fraud or deception, to appropriate entities.

Emphasis added.

As such, based on the foregoing, the Board hereby imposes the following conditions on Dr. Khandelwal's conditional license:

- 1. Dr. Khandelwal shall enter into a monitoring contract with Pu`ulu Lapa`au, The Hawai`i Program for Healthcare Professionals ("Pu`ulu Lapa`au") within sixty (60) days of the date of this letter. The length of the contact shall be determined by Pu`ulu Lapa`au. However, said monitoring contract may be extended by the Board if the Board believes that reasonable grounds exist. The Board notes that on November 12, 2021, Dr. Khandelwal entered into a contract with Pu`ulu Lapa`au and received a copy of the fully executed contract on November 13, 2021.
- 2. Dr. Khandelwal may only begin to practice medicine in the State of Hawaii after he receives written confirmation from the Board that he has been issued a medical license number by the Board.
- 3. If, at any time, Pu`ulu Lapa`au determines that Dr. Khandelwal is not in compliance with the monitoring contract, he shall immediately notify the Board and

immediately cease practicing medicine until Pu`ulu Lapa`au specifies to the Board what conditions, if any, it recommends for him to safely resume the practice of medicine. Depending upon Pu`ulu Lapa`au's written report and recommendations, the Board may evaluate what, if any, further conditions and/or limitations are warranted for him to practice medicine and impose such conditions and/or limitations on your license. If he fails to refrain from using drugs or alcohol and inappropriate behavior, the Board also will consider whether to suspend, revoke, or otherwise discipline his license.

- 4. During the period of Dr. Khandelwal's conditional license, he shall ensure that Pu`ulu Lapa`au submits quarterly written reports to the Board either by first-class mail or email. These written reports shall include, but not be limited to, assessments regarding: (1) his compliance with the monitoring contract; and (2) his ability to safely practice as a physician. The first quarterly report is due within ninety (90) days from the date of his conditional license number is issued.
- 5. The Board, at its discretion, may pursue additional disciplinary action as provided by law to include further fines and other sanctions as the Board may deem appropriate if Dr. Khandelwal violates any further provision of the statutes or rules governing the conduct of physicians in the State of Hawaii, or if he fails to abide by the terms of his conditional license.
- 6. Should Dr. Khandelwal wish to have any condition removed from his license, he shall make a request in writing to the Board, at which time the Board would consider such request. When doing so, Dr. Khandelwal shall provide evidence of full compliance with his monitoring contract with Pu`ulu Lapa`au and all other conditions placed on his conditional license.
