## **MINUTES OF MEETING**

<u>Agenda</u>: The agenda for this meeting was filed with the Office of the Lieutenant Governor, as required by section 92-7(b), Hawaii Revised Statutes ("HRS").

> A brief video explained meeting procedures and information on how members of the public can participate during the meeting.

1. <u>Call to Order</u>, <u>Public Notice</u>, <u>Quorum</u>: There being a quorum present, Chair Nagashima called the meeting to order at 9:34 a.m. Chair Nagashima introduced new Board member Jayce Arakaki. She conducted a roll call of Board members. All were present.

Mr. Arakaki introduced himself as a public member, with no professional background in massage therapy. Mr. Arakaki currently works as a business manager with a health organization.

2. <u>Approval of</u> <u>Minutes of the</u> <u>Minut</u>

August 11 and September 22, Mr. Arakaki stated he will abstain from voting on the August 11 and 2021 Meeting: September 22, 2021 meeting minutes. Upon a motion by Ms. Okura, seconded by Ms. Bath, it was voted on by the majority to approve the minutes of the August 11, 2021 as circulated. Chair Nagashima asked if any there were any comments or concerns on the September 22, 2021 meeting minutes. Chair Nagashima requested the following correction be made: On page 2, under Heaven on Earth Wellness Academy, shall read "Upon a motion by Chair Nagashima, seconded by Ms. Bath, it was voted on and unanimously carried that based on the review of Heaven on Earth Wellness Academy's application and supporting documents, the school's curriculum meets the Board's minimum education and training hours required for an applicant to obtain a license in massage therapy. The Board directed the EO to issue an approval letter valid through the DOE licensure period from September 1, 2021 through August 31, 2023." Upon a motion by Ms. Bath, seconded by Ms. Okura, it was voted on by the majority to approve the minutes of the September 22, 2021 as amended. Upon a motion by Chair Nagashima, seconded by Ms. Okura, it was voted on by the majority to approve the executive session minutes of the August 11, 2021 as circulated and the September 22, 2021, as amended. 3. Election of Chair Nagashima opened the floor for nominations for the position Officers: of Board Chair. Ms. Okura nominated Olivia Nagashima for the position.

> Chair Nagashima opened the floor for nominations for the position of Board Vice Chair. Chair Nagashima nominated Amy Okura for the position.

> Upon a motion by Ms. Okura, seconded by Ms. Bath, it was voted on and unanimously carried to re-elect Olivia Nagashima as the Board's Chair and the elect Amy Okura as the Board's Vice Chair.

- 4. <u>Applications:</u> Chair Nagashima asked if any members of the public would like to provide oral testimony on this agenda item. There were none.
  - a. Ratifications (see attached Addendum)

Upon a motion by Chair Nagashima, seconded by Ms. Okura, it was voted on and unanimously carried to approve the attached ratification list.

b. Applications

ExecutiveAt 9:51 a.m., it was moved by Chair Nagashima seconded bySession:Ms. Okura and unanimously carried to move into executive session in<br/>accordance with HRS, § 92-5(a)(1) and (4), "To consider and evaluate<br/>personal information relating to individuals applying for professional or<br/>vocational licenses cited in section 26-9 or both;" and "To consult with<br/>the board's attorney on questions and issues pertaining to the board's<br/>powers, duties, privileges, immunities, and liabilities."

At 10:54 a.m., it was moved by Chair Nagashima, seconded by Ms. Okura, and unanimously carried to move out of executive session.

1) First Massage School and Clinic

Upon a motion by Chair Nagashima, seconded by Ms. Bath, it was voted on and unanimously carried that based on the review of First Massage School and Clinic's application and supporting documents, the school's curriculum meets the Board's minimum education and training hours required for an applicant to obtain a license in massage therapy. The Board directed the EO to issue an approval letter valid through the DOE licensure period from September 1, 2021 through August 31, 2023.

2) Maria Margaritis

Upon a motion by Chair Nagashima, seconded by Ms. Okura, it was voted on and unanimously carried to deny Ms. Margaritis' Application for Exam & License- Massage Therapist pursuant to Hawaii Revised Statutes ("HRS") §436B-19 (2), (5), (8), (9), and (12); and HRS §452-24 (a)(1) and (9).

3) Hannah Saunders

Upon a motion by Chair Nagashima, seconded by Ms. Okura, it was voted on and unanimously carried to defer Ms. Saunders' application to sit for the Hawaii Massage Therapy Examination, pending additional documentation of 133 hours in practical massage training.

 4. <u>Chapter 91,</u> <u>Hawaii Revised</u> <u>Statutes (``HRS'')</u>
 a. <u>In the Matter of the License to Practice Massage Therapy</u> <u>of Timothy Hogan (MAS-2021-56-L) – Settlement Agreement Prior to</u> <u>Filing of Petition for Disciplinary Action and Board's Final Order;</u> <u>Adjudicatory</u> <u>Matters:</u>

Chair Nagashima asked if any members of the public would like to provide oral testimony on this agenda item. There were none.

Upon a motion by Chair Nagashima, seconded by Ms. Bath, it was voted on and unanimously carried to approve the above-referenced settlement agreement.

5. <u>Executive</u> <u>Officer's</u> <u>Report:</u>
a. <u>Looking for one (1) massage therapist and (1) public member</u> to serve on the Board

> Chair Nagashima asked if any members of the public would like to provide oral testimony on this agenda item. There were none.

EO Doi stated currently, there is one public member position open with the Board of Massage Therapy, however, Ms. Bath's term will be ending June 30, 2022. Interested applicants are welcomed to apply on the Governor's website.

5. <u>New</u> a. <u>Email Inquiry from Kaname Mamada: Does providing loquat</u> <u>Business:</u> <u>therapy require a massage therapy license?</u>

Chair Nagashima asked if any members of the public would like to provide oral testimony on this agenda item. There were none.

EO Doi clarified that Kaname Mamada is inquiring if a massage license would be required to provide loquat heat treatment.

Ms. Okura stated the loquat heat therapy uses herbal infusions and does not manipulate soft tissues. Therefore, it does not fall under the practice of massage therapy.

Ms. Bath stated that loquat heat treatment is administered through an

electronic device, however, it does not involve physical touch.

Chair Nagashima quoted HRS §452-1, which states all electronic devices used must be approved by the US Food and Drug Administration.

After further discussion, the Board agreed that the practice of loquat heat therapy does not fall under the scope of massage therapy.

Upon a motion by Ms. Okura, seconded by Ms. Bath, it was voted on and unanimously carried to direct the EO to respond that the practice of loquat heat therapy does not fall under the scope of massage therapy, however, other licensing types may be required.

## b. <u>Email Inquiry from Louise Tanswell: Can licensed massage</u> <u>therapists' practice Trupidio Movement Systems technique?</u>

Chair Nagashima stated Trupidio Movement System technique helps with the lymphatic system and is utilized as a post-op treatment.

Ms. Okura inquired if Trupidio Movement System technique has a hands-on component.

Ms. Tanswell's email indicated that the Trupidio Movement System techniques will be taught via online classes and no hands-on treatment would be used. EO Doi noted Ms. Tanswell is describing the Trupidio Movement System techniques as a light aerobic workout class she will be teaching online.

Upon a motion by Ms. Okura, seconded by Ms. Bath, it was voted on and unanimously carried to direct the EO to respond that Trupidio Movement System techniques is not under the scope of massage therapy and does not require a massage therapy license to provide this service.

c. <u>Discussion of residential massage therapy establishments and</u> <u>sanitation requirements</u>

Ms. Bath stated massage therapy establishments (MAE) are allowed in homes and with the current circumstances of the pandemic, professionals are moving out of the clinic setting into more home settings.

Ms. Bath proposed that all new MAE with home occupancy be exempt from having a sink within the work area with hot and cold running water, and that hand sanitizers and paper towels be used in lieu of a hand washing station.

Chair Nagashima stated there has been previous discussion on having a hand wash station included in the work area. Chair Nagashima stated if the building is already existing, no hand wash station will be required.

EO Doi quoted the rules draft Hawaii Administrative Rules ("HAR") 16-84-16(b) states "any MAE that requires a construction permit must include a hand washing station in the work area, regardless of location." EO Doi stated the Board has already sent the rules draft to the Deputy Attorney General's office for review and Ms. Bath's proposal would require a revision.

Upon a motion by Ms. Bath, seconded by Ms. Okura, Mr. Arakaki and Chair Nagashima abstained from voting on the motion of MAE's with home occupancy be exempt to have hot and cold running water and that hand sanitizers and wipes will be used.

The Board agreed to add this agenda item to the next meeting agenda for further discussion.

#### 6. <u>Unfinished</u> a. <u>Continuing education rule drafting</u>

**Business:** 

Chair Nagashima asked if any members of the public would like to provide oral testimony on this agenda item. There were none.

EO Doi asked if Board members had any questions or concerns regarding the continuing education ("CE") rules draft provided. EO Doi noted a draft should be submitted before June 2022 renewal period to alert the licensees of the new requirements that will occur in the June 2024 renewal period.

Chair Nagashima requested a February meeting be added to the 2022 Board meeting schedule to continue work on the CE rules.

Ms. Okura clarified if revisions can also be made on other sections of the rules.

Ms. Okura suggested HAR 16-84-2 under the definition for persons "Any individual partnership, corporation, LLC, or any other business entity."

EO Doi asked Board members to send revisions to the Board's email to compile for the next Board meeting.

b. Rule Revisions - Title 16, Chapter 84, Hawaii Administrative Rules

Chair Nagashima asked if any members of the public would like to provide oral testimony on this agenda item. There were none.

Chair Nagashima noted that this item will need to be deferred until a future meeting.

Chair Nagashima requested a December meeting be added to the 2021 Board meeting schedule.

EO Doi stated that the Board's secretary will contact Board members for availability.
