- Agenda: The agenda for this meeting was filed with the Office of the Lieutenant Governor as required by Hawaii Revised Statutes (“HRS”) section 92-7.

- Call to Order: There being a quorum present, the meeting was called to order at 10:39 a.m. by Chair Denis.
- Vice-Chair Inouye, Chief Ferreira, Mr. Collins, Mr. Chu and Chair Denis confirmed they were present.

Approval of the Board Minutes:
