Agenda: The agenda for this meeting was posted on the State electronic calendar as required by Hawaii Revised Statutes (“HRS”) section 92-7.

Call to Order: There being a quorum present, the meeting was called to order at 11:11 a.m. by Chair Denis.

Vice-Chair Inouye, Mr. Collins, Mr. Chu, and Chair Denis confirmed they were present.

Approval of the Board Minutes: Chair Denis asked if there were any corrections to the October 17, 2022, open session minutes and executive session minutes.

It was moved by Vice-Chair Inouye, seconded by Mr. Collins, and unanimously carried to approve the open session and executive session minutes of the October 17, 2022, meeting.

Executive Session: At 11:12 a.m., it was moved by Vice-Chair Inouye, seconded by Mr. Collins, and unanimously carried to move into executive session pursuant to HRS §92-5 to consider and evaluate personal information relating to individuals applying for professional or vocational licenses cited in section HRS §26-9 or both, and to consult with the board's attorney on questions and issues pertaining to the board's powers, duties, privileges, immunities, and liabilities, as provided in HRS §92-5(a)(1) and (4).

EXECUTIVE SESSION

At 11:37 a.m., it was moved by the Vice-Chair Inouye seconded by Mr. Collins and unanimously carried to move out of executive session.

It was moved by Vice-Chair Inouye, seconded by Mr. Collins, and unanimously carried to approve the following principal guard applicants for licensure:

B. Guard Employees

1. Joann Cabana

After due consideration of the information received, it was moved by Mr. Collins, seconded by Vice-Chair Inouye and unanimously carried to approve Joann Cabana's application for licensure subject to certain conditions:

The Board based its decision on the following citation of the Hawaii Revised Statutes ("HRS"), which finds factual support in the records and files of Ms. Cabana's application:

HRS section 436B-19 provides that;

In addition to any other acts or conditions provided by law, the licensing authority may refuse to renew, reinstate or restore, or may deny revoke, suspend, or condition in any manner, any license for any one or more of the following acts or conditions on the part of the licensee of the applicant thereof:

* * *

- (1) Failure to meet or maintain the conditions and requirements necessary to qualify for the granting of a license;

HRS section 463-10.5 provides that:

- (a) All guards, and all agents, operatives, and assistants employed by a guard agency, private business entity, or government agency who act in a guard capacity shall apply to register with the board, and meet the following registration, instruction, and training requirements prior to acting as a guard:

* * *

- (3) Not be presently suffering from any psychiatric or psychological disorder which is directly related and detrimental to a person's performance in the profession;

For reasons contained in the records and files of Ms. Cabana's application, the Board placed the following conditions on her conditional license:

- 1) Ms. Cabana's guard employee registration is hereby conditioned.
- 2) Ms. Cabana shall provide the Board with semiannual progress reported from her treating physician. For the semiannual periods of January to June; and July to December, the progress report shall be due on or before July 31st and January 31st respectively. The progress reports shall indicate whether there are any concerns, problems, or issues that would preclude Ms. Cabana from performing the duties required of a guard employee.

- 3) Ms. Cabana shall ensure that the Board is notified of any changes or incidents pertaining to her fitness to perform in a guard capacity, within ten (10) days of the incident.
- 4) The Board, at its discretion, may pursue additional disciplinary action as provided by law to include further fines and other sanctions as the Board may deem appropriate if she violate any further provision of the statutes or rules governing the conduct of guard employees in the State of Hawaii, or if Ms. Cabana fails to abide by the terms of her conditional registration.
- 5) Failure to comply with the above conditions will result in it being recommended to the Board that Ms. Cabana's registration be withdrawn for failure to comply with the conditional registration agreement.
- 6) Should Ms. Cabana wish to have any conditions removed from her registration, she shall make a request in writing to the Board, at which time the Board would consider her request. When doing so, she shall provide evidence of full compliance with all conditions placed on her conditional registration.

2. Charles Jenkins

After due consideration of the information received, it was moved by Mr. Collins, seconded by Vice-Chair Inouye and unanimously carried to approve Charles Jenkins' application for licensure subject to certain conditions:

The Board based its decision on the following citation of the Hawaii Revised Statutes ("HRS"), which finds factual support in the records and files of Mr. Jenkins' application:

HRS section 436B-19 provides that;

In addition to any other acts or conditions provided by law, the licensing authority may refuse to renew, reinstate or restore, or may deny revoke, suspend, or condition in any manner, any license for any one or more of the following acts or conditions on the part of the licensee of the applicant thereof:

- (1) Failure to meet or maintain the conditions and requirements necessary to qualify for the granting of a license;

HRS section 463-10.5 provides that:

- (a) All guards, and all agents, operatives, and assistants employed by a guard agency, private business entity, or government agency who act in a guard capacity shall apply to register with the board, and meet the following registration, instruction, and training requirements prior to acting as a guard:

The progress reports shall indicate whether there are any concerns, problems, or issues that would preclude Mr. Jenkins from performing the duties required of a guard employee.
- 3) Mr. Jenkins shall ensure that the Board is notified of any changes or incidents pertaining to his fitness to perform in a guard capacity, within ten (10) days of the incident.
- 4) The Board, at its discretion, may pursue additional disciplinary action as provided by law to include further fines and other sanctions as the Board may deem appropriate if she violate any further provision of the statutes or rules governing the conduct of guard employees in the State of Hawaii, or if Mr. Jenkins

fails to abide by the terms of his conditional registration.

- 5) Failure to comply with the above conditions will result in it being recommended to the Board that Mr. Jenkins' registration be withdrawn for failure to comply with the conditional registration agreement.
- 6) Should Mr. Jenkins wish to have any conditions removed from his registration, he shall make a request in writing to the Board, at which time the Board would consider his request. When doing so, he shall provide evidence of full compliance with all conditions placed on his conditional registration.

3. Tauese Manuele

It was moved by Mr. Collins, seconded by Vice-Chair Inouye and unanimously carried to approve Tauese Manuele's application guard employee.

4. Cesar Miro-Quesada

After due consideration of the information received, it was moved by Mr. Collins, seconded by Vice-Chair Inouye and unanimously carried to deny Cesar Miro-Quesada's application. The Board based its decision on the following citation of the Hawaii Revised Statutes ("HRS"), which finds factual support in the records and files of Mr. Miro-Quesada's application:

HRS 436B-19 provides that:

In addition to any other acts or conditions provided by law, the licensing authority may refuse to renew, reinstate or restore or may deny, revoke, suspend, or condition in any manner, any license for any one or more of the following acts or conditions on the part of the licensee or the applicant thereof:

* * *

- (12) Failure to comply, observe, or adhere to any law in a manner such that the licensing authority deems the applicant or holder to be an unfit or improper person to hold a license.

HAR section 16-97-29 provides that:

- (d) No license shall be granted to applicants who have engaged in or who are engaging in any illegal or unlawful conduct which reflects unfavorably on the fitness of the applicant to engage in the profession.
- (e) The board may deny issuance of a license if, after investigations, the applicant's background, character, competency, and integrity is found to be detrimental to the profession or to the best interest of the public.
- (g) The board may deny issuance of a license when the applicant is known to have committed any of the acts for which a license may be suspended or revoked under section 16-97-46.

5. Ruby Savarese

After due consideration of the information received, it was moved by Mr. Collins, seconded by Vice-Chair Inouye and unanimously carried to deny Ruby Savarese's application. The Board based its decision on the following citation of the Hawaii Revised Statutes ("HRS"), which finds factual support in the records and files of Ms. Savarese's application:

HRS 436B-19 provides that:

In addition to any other acts or conditions provided by law, the licensing authority may refuse to renew, reinstate or restore or may deny, revoke, suspend, or condition in any manner, any license for any one or more of the following acts or conditions on the part of the licensee or the applicant thereof:

* * *

- (12) Failure to comply, observe, or adhere to any law in a manner such that the licensing authority deems the applicant or holder to be an unfit or improper person to hold a license.

HAR section 16-97-29 provides that:

- (d) No license shall be granted to applicants who have engaged in or who are engaging in any illegal or unlawful conduct which reflects unfavorably on the

fitness of the applicant to engage in the profession.

- (e) The board may deny issuance of a license if, after investigations, the applicant's background, character, competency, and integrity is found to be detrimental to the profession or to the best interest of the public.
- (f) The board may deny issuance of a license if the applicant is found to have undergone psychiatric or psychological treatment or if any treatment has been recommended for any psychiatric or psychological disorder which may be detrimental to the profession. An applicant may, however, be permitted to present to the board a statement signed by the attending physician, psychologist, or psychiatrist attesting to the applicant's mental and emotional fitness to engage in the profession.
- (g) The board may deny issuance of a license when the applicant is known to have committed any of the acts for which a license may be suspended or revoked under section 16-97-46.

6. Michael Silva

It was moved by Mr. Collins, seconded by Vice-Chair Inouye and unanimously carried to defer Michael Silva's application for guard employee for additional information.

Scope of Practice: A. Email from inquiry from Ethan Perron Regarding Out-of-State Law Enforcement Obtaining a Guard Employee Registration

The Board considered email correspondence from Ethan Perron, inquiring whether an out-of-state peace officer is eligible to obtain a Guard Employee Registration.

EO Fukunaga referred the Board to HAR §16-97-8(b) which states:

“An employee of a reserve officer of any law enforcement agency shall not maintain or be eligible for any license issued under chapter 463, HRS.”

Mr. Collins commented that the cited section does not differentiate between in-state or out-of-state.

It was moved by Vice-Chair Inouye, and seconded by Chair Denis and unanimously carried based solely on the information contained in Mr. Perron's, September 29, 2022,

September 30, 2022, and October 4, 2022 emails, the Board informally opined that an out-of-state peace officer is not eligible for any license issued under chapter 463, HRS.

In accordance with HAR §16-201-90, the above interpretation is for informational and explanatory purposes only and based solely on the information provided. It is not an official opinion or decision and therefore not binding on the Board.
