Agenda: The agenda for this meeting was posted on the State electronic calendar as required by Hawaii Revised Statutes ("HRS") section 92-7.

Call to Order: There being a quorum present, the meeting was called to order at 10:32 a.m. by Chair Denis.

Vice-Chair Inouye, Mr. Collins, Mr. Chu, and Chair Denis confirmed they were present.

Approval of the Board Minutes: Chair Denis asked if there were any corrections to the November 29, 2022, open session minutes and executive session minutes.

It was moved by Vice-Chair Inouye, seconded by Mr. Collins, and unanimously carried to approve the open session and executive session minutes of the November 29, 2022, meeting.

Executive Session: At 10:34 a.m., it was moved by Vice-Chair Inouye, seconded by Mr. Collins, and unanimously carried to move into executive session pursuant to HRS §92-5 to consider and evaluate personal information relating to individuals applying for professional or vocational licenses cited in section HRS §26-9 or both, and to consult with the board's attorney on questions and issues pertaining to the board's powers, duties, privileges, immunities, and liabilities, as provided in HRS §92-5(a)(1) and (4).

EXECUTIVE SESSION

At 11:27 a.m., it was moved by the Vice-Chair Inouye seconded by Mr. Collins and unanimously carried to move out of executive session.

It was moved by Mr. Collins, seconded by Vice Chair Inouye, and unanimously carried to approve the following principal guard applicants for licensure:

B. Guard Employees

1. Wesley Handley

After due consideration of the information received, it was moved by Mr. Collins, seconded by Vice-Chair Inouye and unanimously carried to approve Wesley Handley's application for licensure subject to certain conditions:

The Board based its decision on the following citation of the Hawaii Revised Statutes ("HRS"), which finds factual support in the records and files of Mr. Handley's application:

HRS section 436B-19 provides that;

In addition to any other acts or conditions provided by law, the licensing authority may refuse to renew, reinstate or

restore, or may deny revoke, suspend, or condition in any manner, any license for any one or more of the following acts or conditions on the part of the licensee of the applicant thereof:

* * *

- (14) Criminal conviction, whether by nolo contendere or otherwise, of a penal crime directly related to the qualifications, functions, or duties of the licensed profession or vocation.

For reasons contained in the records and files of Mr. Handley's application, the Board placed the following conditions on his conditional license:

- 1) Mr. Handley shall comply with all the terms and conditions of his probation.
 - a. Mr. Handley shall provide the Board with semiannual progress reports from his probation officer. For the semiannual periods of January to June; and July to December; the progress report shall be due on or before July 31st and January 31st respectively. The progress reports shall indicate whether he is complying with the terms and conditions of his probation.
 - b. Upon completion of his terms, Mr. Handley shall submit proof of discharge to the Board; and If his probation is amended in any way or is revoked:
 - c. Mr. Handley shall report any such amendment or revocation to the Board within thirty (30) calendar days of the amendment or revocation; and
 - d. If Mr. Handley fails to timely notify the Board of such amendment or revocation, this conditional registration shall be automatically revoked without a hearing on the 30th day after the date of the amendment or the date his probation/parole was revoked, as applicable;
- 2) Mr. Handley shall submit an annual FBI national criminal history record check and State of Hawaii criminal history record check from the Hawaii Criminal Justice Data Center ("**criminal abstracts**") to the Board.

- a. These criminal abstracts shall be due on January 31 of each year and shall cover the periods of January to December.
 - b. In order to obtain these criminal abstracts, Mr. Handley shall be fingerprinted electronically at Fieldprint Inc. at his own cost and expense, and
- 3) Mr. Handley shall refrain from any actions that may result in his arrest or conviction for any crimes against persons or property (including but not limited to theft, burglary, assault, etc.) or any other act that is directly related to the guard profession.
- a. Mr. Handley shall report any such arrests or convictions to the Board within thirty (30) calendar days of the arrests or convictions, and
 - b. If Mr. Handley fails to timely notify the Board of such arrests or convictions, this conditional registration shall be automatically revoked without a hearing on the 30th day after the date of the arrests or convictions.

2. Jordan Cabo

It was moved by Mr. Collins, seconded by Vice-Chair Inouye and unanimously carried to approve Jordan Cabo's application guard employee.

3. Keawe Stephenson

After due consideration of the information received, it was moved by Mr. Collins, seconded by Vice-Chair Inouye and unanimously carried to approve Keawe Stephenson's application for licensure subject to certain conditions:

The Board based its decision on the following citation of the Hawaii Revised Statutes ("HRS"), which finds factual support in the records and files of Mr. Stephenson's application:

HRS section 436B-19 provides that;

In addition to any other acts or conditions provided by law, the licensing authority may refuse to renew, reinstate or restore, or may deny revoke, suspend, or condition in any manner, any license for any one or more of the following acts or conditions on the part of the licensee of the applicant thereof:

* * *

- (1) Failure to meet or maintain the conditions and requirements necessary to qualify for the granting of a license;

HRS section 463-10.5 provides that:

- (a) All guards, and all agents, operatives, and assistants employed by a guard agency, private business entity, or government agency who act in a guard capacity shall apply to register with the board, and meet the following registration, instruction, and training requirements prior to acting as a guard:

* * *

- (3) Not be presently suffering from any psychiatric or psychological disorder which is directly related and detrimental to a person's performance in the profession;

HRS section 463-10.5 provides that:

- (a) All guards and all agents, operative, and assistants employed by a guard agency, private business entity, or government agency who act in a guard capacity shall apply to register with the board, and meet the following registration, instruction, and training requirements prior to acting as a guard.

* * *

- (3) Not be presently suffering from any psychiatric or psychological disorder which is directly related and detrimental to the person's performance in the profession;

HAR section 16-97-29 provides that:

- (e) The board may deny issuance of a license if, after investigations, the applicant's background, character, competency, and integrity is found to be detrimental to the profession or to the best interest of the public.
- (f) The board may deny issuance of a license if the applicant is found to have undergone psychiatric or

psychological treatment or if any treatment has been recommended for any psychiatric or psychological disorder which may be detrimental to the profession. An applicant may, however, be permitted to present to the board a statement signed by the attending physician, psychologist, or psychiatrist attesting to the applicant's mental and emotional fitness to engage in the profession.

Further, HAR section 16-97-38 provides that:

Applicants for a private detective or guard license shall provide the board with:

- (1) A signed medical release which authorizes the board to check in to the applicant's psychiatric or psychological background;
- (2) The names of at least two personal physicians, psychologists, or psychiatrists that have seen the applicant within the past five years;
- (3) Any information concerning the applicant's treatment for any psychiatric or psychological disorder; and
- (4) Information describing any treatment for a psychiatric or psychological disorder that was recommended, but not completed.

For reasons contained in the records and files of Mr. Stephenson's application, the Board placed the following conditions on his conditional license:

1. Mr. Stephenson shall submit a letter from his treating physician that there are no concerns, problems, or issues that would preclude him from becoming a guard and performing the duties required of a guard.
2. Mr. Stephenson shall notify his treating physician of any changes to his condition and ensure that his physician agrees to and actually reports to the Board any incidents pertaining to his fitness to perform in a guard capacity within ten (10) days of the incident.
3. Failure to comply with the above conditions will result in it being recommended to the Board that Mr. Stephenson's registration be withdrawn for failure to comply with the conditional registration agreement.

4. Ramon Omari Witherspoon

After due consideration of the information received, it was moved by Mr. Collins, seconded by Vice-Chair Inouye and unanimously carried to approve Ramon Omari Witherspoon's application for licensure subject to certain conditions:

HRS 436B-19 provides that:

In addition to any other acts or conditions provided by law, the licensing authority may refuse to renew, reinstate or restore or may deny, revoke, suspend, or condition in any manner, any license for any one or more of the following acts or conditions on the part of the licensee or the applicant thereof:

* * *

- (1) Failure to meet or maintain the conditions and requirements necessary to qualify for the granting of a license.
- (12) Failure to comply, observe, or adhere to any law in a manner such that the licensing authority deems the applicant or holder to be an unfit or improper person to hold a license.
- (14) Criminal conviction, whether by nolo contendere or otherwise, or a penal crime directly related to the qualification, function, or duties of the licensed profession or vocation.

HRS section 463-10.5 provides that:

- (a) All guards and all agents, operative, and assistants employed by a guard agency, private business entity, or government agency who act in a guard capacity shall apply to register with the board, and meet the following registration, instruction, and training requirements prior to acting as a guard.

* * *

- (3) Not be presently suffering from any psychiatric or psychological disorder which is directly related and detrimental to the person's performance in the profession;

HAR section 16-97-29 provides that:

- (d) No license shall be granted to applicants who have engaged in or who are engaging in any illegal or unlawful conduct which reflects unfavorably on the fitness of the applicant to engage in the profession.
- (e) The board may deny issuance of a license if, after investigations, the applicant's background, character, competency, and integrity is found to be detrimental to the profession or to the best interest of the public.
- (f) The board may deny issuance of a license if the applicant is found to have undergone psychiatric or psychological treatment or if any treatment has been recommended for any psychiatric or psychological disorder which may be detrimental to the profession. An applicant may, however, be permitted to present to the board a statement signed by the attending physician, psychologist, or psychiatrist attesting to the applicant's mental and emotional fitness to engage in the profession.
- (g) The board may deny issuance of a license when the applicant is known to have committed any of the acts for which a license may be suspended or revoked under section 16-97-46.

Further, HAR section 16-97-38 provides that:

Applicants for a private detective or guard license shall provide the board with:

- (1) A signed medical release which authorizes the board to check in to the applicant's psychiatric or psychological background;
- (2) The names of at least two personal physicians, psychologists, or psychiatrists that have seen the applicant within the past five years;
- (3) Any information concerning the applicant's treatment for any psychiatric or psychological disorder; and
- (4) Information describing any treatment for a psychiatric or psychological disorder that was recommended, but not completed.

For reasons contained in the records and files of Mr. Witherspoon's application, the Board placed the following conditions on his conditional license:

1. Mr. Witherspoon shall submit a letter from his treating physician that there are no concerns, problems, or issues that would preclude him from becoming a guard and performing the duties required of a guard.
2. Mr. Witherspoon shall notify his treating physician of any changes to his condition and ensure that his physician agrees to and actually reports to the Board any incidents pertaining to his fitness to perform in a guard capacity within ten (10) days of the incident.
3. Failure to comply with the above conditions will result in it being recommended to the Board that Mr. Witherspoon's registration be withdrawn for failure to comply with the conditional registration agreement.

6. Noelani Mackowiak

After due consideration of the information received, it was moved by Mr. Collins, seconded by Vice-Chair Inouye and unanimously carried to approve Noelani Mackowiak's application for licensure subject to certain conditions:

In addition to any other acts or conditions provided by law, the licensing authority may refuse to renew, reinstate or restore or may deny, revoke, suspend, or condition in any manner, any license for any one or more of the following acts or conditions on the part of the licensee or the applicant thereof:

* * *

- (14) Criminal conviction, whether by nolo contendere or otherwise, or a penal crime directly related to the qualifications, functions, or duties of the licensed

profession or vocation.

For reasons contained in the records and files of Ms. Mackowiak's application, the Board placed the following conditions on her conditional license:

1. Ms. Mackowiak shall submit an annual FBI national criminal history record check and State of Hawaii criminal history record check from the Hawaii Criminal Justice Data Center ("**criminal abstracts**") to the Board until the end of 2025. Ms. Mackowiak's last abstract shall be due on January 31, 2025
 - a. These criminal abstracts shall be for the semiannual period of January to June, and July to December; the progress reports shall be due on or before July 31st and January 31st respectively.
 - b. In order to obtain these criminal abstracts, Ms. Mackowiak shall be fingerprinted electronically at Fieldprint and her own cost and expense; and
2. Ms. Mackowiak shall refrain from any actions that may result in her arrest or conviction for any crimes against persons or property (including but not limited to: theft, burglary, assault, etc.) or any other act that is directly related to the guard profession.
 - a. Ms. Mackowiak shall report any such arrests or convictions to the Board within thirty (30) calendar days of the arrests or convictions; and
 - b. If Ms. Mackowiak fails to timely notify the Board of such arrests or convictions, this conditional registration shall be automatically revoked without a hearing on the 30th day after the date of the arrests or convictions.
