A short video was played to explain the meeting procedures and how members of the public could participate in the virtual meeting.

Call to Order:

The meeting was called to order at 1:10 p.m., at which time quorum was established.

Chair Takanishi welcomed everyone to the meeting and proceeded with a roll call of the Board members. All Board members confirmed that they were present and alone.

Approval of the October 12, 2023, Minutes:

It was moved by Dr. Dao, seconded by Mr. Belcher, and carried September 14, 2023, unanimously to approve the open session meeting minutes of October 12, 2023 and the executive session meeting minutes of September 14, 2023. meeting.

> Chair Takanishi informed meeting attendees that applicants, whose applications were on the agenda, would be invited to join the executive session to provide their testimony.

Chair Takanishi asked if anyone from the public would like to provide oral testimony on this agenda item. There was none.

After due consideration of the information received, it was moved by Chair Takanishi, seconded by Dr. Ignacio, and unanimously carried to defer the application and have the Executive Officer inform the applicant: that the application does not currently meet the statutory requirements for licensure in Hawaii for they are pending receipt of FLEX scores part I and II from the Federation of State Medical Boards.

(ii) <u>Physician (Permanent/Non-Endorsement):</u>

a. <u>Cortney Schwartz, M.D.</u>

After due consideration of the information received, it was moved by Dr. Dao, seconded by Mr. Belcher, and unanimously carried to deny Dr. Schwartz's application.

The Board based its decision on the following citations of the HRS and Hawaii Administrative Rules ("HAR"), which find factual support in the records and files of Dr. Schwartz's application.

HRS §453-8 provides that:

(a) In addition to any other actions authorized by law, any license to practice medicine and surgery may be revoked, limited, or suspended by the board at any time in a proceeding before the board, or may be denied, for any cause authorized by law, including but not limited to the following:

* * *

- (5) Practicing medicine while the ability to practice is impaired by alcohol, drugs, physical disability, or mental instability;
- (7) Professional misconduct, hazardous negligence causing bodily injury to another, or manifest incapacity in the practice of medicine or surgery;
- (9) Conduct or practice contrary to recognized standards of ethics of the medical profession as adopted by the Hawaii Medical Association, the American Medical Association, the Hawaii Association of Osteopathic Physicians and Surgeons, or the American Osteopathic Association;
- (11) Revocation, suspension, or other disciplinary action by another state or federal agency of a license, certificate, or medical privilege; and
- (c) Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, the board may deny a license to any applicant who has been disciplined by another state or federal agency. Any final order of discipline taken pursuant to this subsection shall be a matter of public record.

HRS §436B-19 provides that:

In addition to any other acts or conditions provided by law, the licensing authority may refuse to renew, reinstate or restore, or may deny, revoke, suspend, or condition in any manner, any license for any one or more of the following acts or conditions on the part of the licensee or the applicant thereof:

* * *

(4) Practicing the licensed profession or vocation while impaired by alcohol, drugs, physical disability, or mental instability;

- (7) Professional misconduct, incompetence, gross negligence, or manifest incapacity in the practice of the licensed profession or vocation;
- (8) Failure to maintain a record or history of competency, trustworthiness, fair dealing, and financial integrity;
- (9) Conduct or practice contrary to recognized standards of ethics of the medical profession as adopted by the Hawaii Medical Association, the American Medical Association, the Hawaii Association of Osteopathic Physicians and Surgeons, or the American Osteopathic Association;
- (12) Failure to comply, observe, or adhere to any law in a manner such that the licensing authority deems the applicant or holder to be an unfit or improper person to hold a license; and
- (13) Revocation, suspension, or other disciplinary action by another state or federal agency against a licensee or applicant for any reason provided by the licensing laws or this section.

HAR §16-85-107 provides that:

(a) An application for issuance of a license or certificate shall be denied when an application is insufficient or incomplete or when an applicant has failed to provide satisfactory proof that the applicant meets the requirements under chapters 453 or 463E, HRS, or this chapter. In addition, the board may deny issuance of a license or certificate:

* * *

- (1) When the applicant has committed any of the acts for which a license or certificate may be suspended or revoked under sections 453-8 or 463E-6, HRS, or section 16-85-112;
- (2) If the applicant fails to demonstrate that the applicant possesses a good reputation for honesty, truthfulness, fairness, and financial integrity; or

(3) If the applicant has had disciplinary action taken by any jurisdiction, including any federal or state regulatory body.

HAR §16-85-112 provides that:

In addition to any other acts or conditions provided in sections 436B-19 and 453-8, HRS, the board may refuse to renew, reinstate, or restore, or may deny, revoke, suspend, or condition in any manner, any license or certificate for any one or more of the following acts or conditions:

(1) Failure to comply with, observe, or adhere to any law in a manner such that the board deems the licensee or certificate holder to be an unfit or improper person to hold a license or certificate.

The Board considers Dr. Schwartz's conduct concerning and contrary to the recognized standards of ethics as adopted by the American Medical Association ("AMA"). Specifically, the Board believes that Dr. Schwartz failed to uphold the following AMA Principles of Medical Ethics:

- I. A physician shall be dedicated to providing competent medical care, with compassion and respect for human dignity and rights.
- II. A physician shall uphold the standards of professionalism, be honest in all professional interactions, and strive to report physicians deficient in character or competence, or engaging in fraud or deception, to appropriate entities.
- III. A physician shall respect the law and also recognize a responsibility to seek changes in those requirements which are contrary to the best interests of the patient. Emphases added.
- IV. A physician shall respect the rights of patients, colleagues, and other health professionals, and shall safeguard patient confidences and privacy within the constraints of the law
- VIII. A physician shall, while caring for a patient, regard responsibility to the patient as paramount.
- b. Sung S. Yang, M.D.

After due consideration of the information received, it was moved by Dr. Fong, seconded by Dr. Pratt, and unanimously carried to deny Dr. Yang's application.

The Board based its decision on the following citations of the HRS and Hawaii Administrative Rules ("HAR"), which find factual support in the records and files of Dr. Yang's application.

HRS §453-8 provides that:

(a) In addition to any other actions authorized by law, any license to practice medicine and surgery may be revoked, limited, or suspended by the board at any time in a proceeding before the board, or may be denied, for any cause authorized by law, including but not limited to the following:

* * *

- (7) Professional misconduct, hazardous negligence causing bodily injury to another, or manifest incapacity in the practice of medicine or surgery;
- (9) Conduct or practice contrary to recognized standards of ethics of the medical profession as adopted by the Hawaii Medical Association, the American Medical Association, the Hawaii Association of Osteopathic Physicians and Surgeons, or the American Osteopathic Association;
- (11) Revocation, suspension, or other disciplinary action by another state or federal agency of a license, certificate, or medical privilege;
- (12) Conviction, whether by nolo contendere or otherwise, of a penal offense substantially related to the qualifications, functions, or duties of a physician or osteopathic physician, notwithstanding any statutory provision to the contrary; and
- (c) Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, the board may deny a license to any applicant who has been disciplined by another state or federal agency. Any final order of discipline taken pursuant to this subsection shall be a matter of public record.

HRS §436B-19 provides that:

In addition to any other acts or conditions provided by law, the licensing authority may refuse to renew, reinstate or restore, or may deny, revoke, suspend, or condition in any manner, any license for any one or more of the following acts or conditions on the part of the licensee or the applicant thereof:

* * *

- (7) Professional misconduct, incompetence, gross negligence, or manifest incapacity in the practice of the licensed profession or vocation;
- (8) Failure to maintain a record or history of competency, trustworthiness, fair dealing, and financial integrity;
- (9) Conduct or practice contrary to recognized standards of ethics of the medical profession as adopted by the Hawaii Medical Association, the American Medical Association, the Hawaii Association of Osteopathic Physicians and Surgeons, or the American Osteopathic Association;
- (11) Engaging in business under a past or present license issued pursuant to the licensing laws, in a manner causing injury to one or more members of the public;
- (12) Failure to comply, observe, or adhere to any law in a manner such that the licensing authority deems the applicant or holder to be an unfit or improper person to hold a license;
- (13) Revocation, suspension, or other disciplinary action by another state or federal agency against a licensee or applicant for any reason provided by the licensing laws or this section;
- (14) Criminal conviction, whether by nolo contendere or otherwise, of a penal crime directly related to the qualifications, functions, or duties of the licensed profession or vocation;
- (17) Violating this chapter, the applicable licensing laws, or any rule or order of the licensing authority.

HAR §16-85-107 provides that:

(a) An application for issuance of a license or certificate shall be denied when an application is insufficient or incomplete or when an applicant has failed to provide satisfactory proof that the applicant meets the requirements under chapters 453 or 463E, HRS, or this chapter. In addition, the board may deny issuance of a license or certificate:

* * *

- (1) When the applicant has committed any of the acts for which a license or certificate may be suspended or revoked under sections 453-8 or 463E-6, HRS, or section 16-85-112;

The Board considers Dr. Yang's conduct concerning and contrary to the recognized standards of ethics as adopted by the American Medical Association ("AMA"). Specifically, the Board believes that Dr. Yang failed to uphold the following AMA Principles of Medical Ethics:

II. A physician shall uphold the standards of professionalism, be honest in all professional interactions, and strive to report physicians deficient in character or competence, or engaging in fraud or deception, to appropriate entities.

- III. A physician shall respect the law and also recognize a responsibility to seek changes in those requirements which are contrary to the best interests of the patient. Emphases added.
- c. Leroy P. Rise, M.D.

After due consideration of the information received, it was moved by Dr. Ignacio, seconded by Mr. Belcher, and unanimously carried to approve Dr. Rise's application.

C. Ratification List (See attached list)

(i) December 14, 2023, Ratification List

It was moved Dr. Pratt, seconded by Dr. Sawai, and unanimously carried to ratify the attached lists of individuals for licensure or certification from December 14, 2023.

Chair Takanishi asked if anyone from the public would like to provide oral testimony on these agenda items. There was none.

Federation of State Medical Boards (FSMB):

A. Nominations for FSMB Offices and Awards

The Board considered nominations for FSMB elected offices and awards. Service in an FSMB leadership position brings many benefits, notably the opportunity to make a real impact in the direction and policy of a national organization with a vital role in healthcare.

It was moved by Chair Takanishi, seconded by Dr. Jaffe, and unanimously carried to nominate Dr. Jone Geimer-Flanders, the previous Chairperson of the Board, who is running for a second term to serve on the Board of the Federation of State Medical Boards.

By acclamation, the Board voted to nominate Ms. Ahlani Quiogue, the Executive Officer of the Hawaii Medical Board, for the Federation of State Medical Boards 2024 Leadership Award.

Interstate Medical Licensure Compact Commission (IMLCC):

A. <u>Appointment of Commissioner</u>

Chair Takanishi explained that the Board has two voting representatives on the Interstate State Medical Licensure Compact Commission. He reminded members that at a previous meeting, the Board appointed Dr. Jaffe to one of those positions.

Chair Takanishi asked whether any other members wanted to volunteer to serve on the Commission.

Dr. Pratt asked about the time commitment and involvement.

Dr. Jaffe stated that he would follow up with Dr. Pratt.

Executive Officer Report:

A. <u>2024 Board Meeting Schedule</u>

Chair Takanishi reminded the Board members to mark their calendars with next year's scheduled meetings.

B. Reminder: Ethics Training

Chair Takanishi reminded Board members that they are required to complete the mandatory ethics training no later than December 31, 2023.

Chair Takanishi asked if there were other matters to discuss.

Ms. Quiogue replied that there were none.

Chair Takanishi thanked the Board members for their hard work and in-depth review of applications. He went on to say that he appreciates the Board members' time and keen interest in protecting the public's safety. He went on to thank the Board's counsel and staff members.

DAG Wong noted that Dr. Sung Yang's hand was raised the Zoom meeting.

Sung Yang, M.D. entered the Zoom meeting as a panelist at 4:22 p.m.

Chair Takanishi welcomed Dr. Yang to the meeting and asked him if he wanted to address the Board.

Dr. Yang thanked the Board members for the opportunity to speak and went on to ask the members if they had reviewed the terms of the Settlement Agreement which he had complied with. Dr. Yang stated that he wanted to be sure that all Board members had reviewed the Settlement Agreement in consideration of his application for a permanent medical license.

He went on to say that he paid \$253,000.00 in restitution and id for a \$250,000.00 fine; additionally, was incarcerated for 18-months in a federal detention center in Texas and lost income for his family and aging parents. He added that he took a Board-recommended online course and reiterated that he fulfilled all of the Boards recommendations per the terms of the Settlement Agreement and wanted to be sure that all of the Board members had reviewed the Settlement Agreement and wanted to know what he could do to practice medicine in the State of Hawaii.

Chair Takanishi reminded Dr. Yang that the meeting would end at 4:30 p.m. per sunshine law. He went on to explain that the Settlement Agreement was provided in the application packet which all Board members reviewed in depth.

Chair Takanishi explained that the Settlement Agreement comes to the Board for acceptance. The Settlement Agreement is entered into by the individual and the Regulated Industries Complaints Office. The terms of the Settlement Agreement does not a guarantee the individual licensure as it stipulates that the individual would need to submit an application for licensure and the Board would make an independent decision after a thorough review of the documents made available to it.

Chair Takanishi explained that it is not within the Board's scope to advise Dr. Yang or provide him options to obtain a license in this State. Chair Takanishi recommended that he seek guidance or legal advice from private counsel.

Chair Takanishi asked the Board's attorney if there was anything to be added to his commentary.

DAG Wong stated that the information provided by the Chairperson is accurate and added that Dr. Yang is welcome to consult with his private counsel as he did when he entered into the negotiated Settlement Agreement in 2022. As Chair Takanishi explained the Settlement Agreement in no way provides an assurance or guarantee that after the surrender of the license that said license would be reissued or reinstated. A surrender of a license is just that, it is a surrender; there is no property interest in the license. An applicant, or this case, Dr. Yang starts from square one. She reiterated that Dr. Yang can seek guidance from private counsel regarding seeking a new license in Hawaii.

Dr. Yang stated that he is shell-shocked by the Board's decision and expressed that he and his family have gone through quite a journey to reach this point. He added that he was told that he did not need to attend the meeting with outside counsel and the Board is now recommending that he seek legal advice. He expressed his confusion.

Chair Takanishi reminded Dr. Yang that per the Sunshine Law the meeting must end at 4:30 p.m. He advised that the Board decided to deny based on the information that was provided to it; he repeated that it is not the Board's role to provide advice and counsel on what to do.

Dr. Yang stated that he could not think of any additional questions and did not have legal counsel by his side.

He related that he understood the Board's position and make decisions independently. He expressed that in no way did he think he was going to be issued a license by meeting the terms of the Settlement Agreement but emphasized again that he met all of the terms.

Chair Takanishi advised Dr. Yang that the meeting was adjourned as it was 4:30 p.m.

Dr. Yang thanked the Board of its time.
