Executive Officer Shahan informed the public that the Board would be holding oral arguments regarding agenda item 2.A., in the Matter of the License to Practice Veterinary Medicine of John P. Moscony, D.V.M., VET-2021-4-L; Boards Proposed Final Order

Seth J. Corpuz-Lahne with the Regulated Complaints Office, Ray Epstein, Attorney for John Moscony, and Dr. John Moscony were present.

Mr. Epstein spoke on behalf of Dr. Moscony. Mr. Epstein states Dr. Moscony completed the continuing education (CE) and made two attempt to send his CE to DCCA. Dr. Moscony was not made aware that his CE was not received. Dr. Moscony could only know that his CE was not received if he was notified, which he was not. Mr. Epstein stated the mailbox rule could be applied to this situation. The mailbox rule is that once the item has been put in the mail, it is assumed that it was received. Mr. Epstein is asking on behalf of Dr. Moscony to apply such rule to this case.

Dr. Moscony introduced himself and provided a brief summary of his background. Dr. Moscony began to reiterate his testimony regarding his attempts to submit his continuing education.

> Petitioner, Mr. Corpuz objected to taking additional testimony. Mr. Corpuz stated the findings of fact have been established. Mr. Corpuz stated RICO is going to stand on their filing. Mr. Corpuz stated the request for exception by Dr. Moscony was not timely, however if the Board were to accept the exception request, RICO would not object. Mr. Corpuz stated if the mailbox rule was to be applied, there is no record of when Dr. Moscony replied to the audit letter. The presumption, since it was not received, would be that Dr. Moscony's response to the audit letter was untimely. The petitioner supports the Boards ruling.

> Mr. Epstein provided a rebuttal stating the mailbox rules states if the document was put into the mail it suffices. The only way to provide proof that it was put in the mail is if a photo was taken. Mr. Epstein is asking the Board to consider the mailbox rule and remove the letter of reprimand.
